FSU could only tack on two of six singles' matches and one of three doubles in falling to Tech's Southeastern Conference powerhouse.

Bruner and Guse won their singles' tries with Speiker and John Taylor, while Bennett and Randy Cameron defeated Jerry Kirk and Taylor in the doubles.
