

**CAPE CORAL (AP) —** Unseeded Tito Echiburu of Mississippi State University upset top-seeded Jaime Fillol of the University of Miami 7-5, 3-6, 7-5 in the fourth annual Cape Coral Intercollegiate tennis tournament Friday.

Echiburu, of Santiago, Chile, defeated Tom Harrington of Jacksonville University 6-1, 6-1 in the first round.

Second-seeded Bob Brian of Mississippi State drew a bye in the first round and downed John Thomson, also of Mississippi State, 6-2, 6-3. Mickey Schadt of the University of Miami, ranked third, won over Cliff Murphy of Florida State University 6-3, 6-2.

In team totals, defending champion Miami leads with eight points. Mississippi State has seven and Rollins and FSU four each.

St. Petersburg and Brevard got three points each in the Junior College Division, followed by Miami-Dade and Edison with one point.

Miami-Dade won its division with 19 points. St. Petersburg had 13, Brevard 6, Edison 3 and Palm Beach 2.

Miami and Mississippi State tied for team honors in the senior college ranks with 16 points. Rollins and Florida State had 6 each and Jacksonville 1.

## **Echiburu Upsets Jaime Fillol in Cape Tournament**

Mississippi State University's Tito Echiburu pulled a stunning upset when he surprised top-seeded Jaime Fillol of the University of Miami to highlight the opening day's action in the fourth annual Cape Coral Invitational Tennis Tournament Friday.

Echiburu of Santiago, Chile defeated his fellow townsmen 7-5, 3-6, 7-5 in second round action after whipping Tom Harrington of Jacksonville University in the morning 6-1, 6-1. Echiburu came from behind a 2-4 deficit in the final set to win.

"It was my best effort of my career," the stocky senior explained. "Jaime was not at his best. I had nothing to lose so I played loose. Jaime didn't."

The other three seeded players—Bob Drien of Mississippi State, Mickey Schad of the University of Miami (defending champion), and Paul De-Zeeuw of Florida State — advanced to the quarter finals easily.

Defending champion Miami leads in the college division scoring with eight points, followed by Mississippi State with seven, and Rollins and FSU with four each.

## *Tutvin to Battle Brien in Finals Of Tennis Tourney*

Frank Tutvin of the University of Miami will meet Bob Brien of Mississippi State in the finals today of the fourth annual Florida Intercollegiate Tennis championships at the Cape Coral Yacht and Racquet Club.

Tutvin, last year's runnerup, defeated John Edmond of Mississippi State 6-8, 6-2, 6-4, while Brien defeated Mickey Schad, the defending champion, of Miami 6-3, 6-0 in Saturday night's semifinals.

### **DeZeeuw Upset**

Tutvin pulled a mild upset in the quarterfinals by downing fourth-ranked Paul DeZeeuw of Florida State 8-6, 6-3. Edmond advanced to the semifinals by default over teammate Tito Echiburu who had to return to Mississippi. Echiburu had upset top-seeded Jaime Fillol of Miami in the second round on Friday.
