

## Netters Up Season Mark with Battering of DePaul

Clint Murphy, Dave Danielson and Herb Rapp scored double victories in route to an 8-1 Seminole win at the Tully Gym clay courts.

Murphy and Danielson, regular singles contestants for the Tribe, chalked up their seventh and sixth wins, respectively. Rapp, a freshman of considerable pro-

ed player in Chicago, 4-6, 6-3, 6-2.

Rapp utilized his long, sweeping service and ground strokes to score a decisive 6-1, 6-3 victory.

Paul DeZeeuw cashed a routine 6-1, 6-0 win at the top singles spot. Teammates Roberto Marcher and Al Procopio had tougher afternoons before they emerged victorious.

Marcher maneuvered neatly for a close 9-7, 6-4 win, while Procopio scored a three-set triumph in one of his typically tense encounters, 6-3, 4-6, 6-2.

Murphy-Rapp captured the top doubles match 6-3, 6-3 and Danielson-Russ Langstroth swept a 6-2, 6-4 victory at the next position. Scott Bristol-Randy Jobson dropped the afternoon's only match by a 6-4, 6-3 count.

Following the pressurless initial victory, Coach Wood substituted liberally for the evening match. After four singles matches were split 2-2, DePaul forfeited the remaining points in order to prepare for meeting Michigan State the following morning.

Rapp and Marton Dundics achieved victories in the abbreviated evening slate. Rapp won a convincing 6-3, 6-3 match with DePaul's top man, while Dundics registered a tight 7-5, 6-3 triumph.

Bristol dropped an extended 2-6, 6-4, 6-1 encounter, and Bill Weeks lost to the skillful Cohnmann 6-2, 6-3.
