

Florida State's tennis team took the University of Miami to three sets in the final doubles match before the Hurricanes finally eked out a 5-4 win here Saturday.

The Seminoles split the singles matches with the Hurricanes, winning the No. 1, 2 and 5 matches, but were able to win only one of the three doubles.

FSU's Bobby Marcher downed Steven Ginman in three sets and John DeZeeuw put down Steve Siegel in just two in the top singles action. But

in the end it was Luis Garcia and Siegel who edged Al Procopio and Dave Danielson in the final doubles match that decided the outcome.

Miami's record now stands 14-0-1, while FSU is 15-5-1.
