

Netters Win Twentieth Victory

Florida State's tennis team raced over Jacksonville University for the 20th win against five losses and a tie and bettered their chances for a bid to the NCAA Collegiate Tennis Championships yesterday afternoon.

The Seminoles blanked the Dolphins 9-0 with superb efforts from all the Seminole players and two JU defaults.

Herb Rapp, the Tribe's number one singles player, downed Danny Cox 6-3, 6-3. The other five FSU

victories were: John DeZeeuw (FSU) d. Richard King 6-2, 6-2, Al Procopio (FSU) d. Tim Paterachi 6-0, 6-1, Scott Bristol (FSU) d. Jim Rychly 6-2, 6-0 and Dave Danielson (FSU) won by default.

In doubles competition DeZeeuw-Rapp (FSU) d. Cox-Paterachi 6-1, 6-3, Bristol-Jobson (FSU) d. King-Rychly 6-1, 6-1 and Danielson-Procopio (FSU) won by default.

Tennis Coach Lex Wood praised this year's squad as the "best team ever."

"All the players are putting out a

great effort at each match," remarked Wood, "So far, they've enjoyed their best season ever."

Wood continued, "Herb Rapp and John DeZeeuw are about our best players now, though it's hard to pick out just one or two when all of them are doing so well."

Coach Wood noted that the Seminoles' record was good enough now to warrant an invitation to the NCAA National Collegiate Tennis Championships June 16 in Princeton, N.J.

Saturday morning, May 3, at 9:30, the netters will face Georgia Tech.
