

Campbell Pulls Upset Against FSU Netters

Florida State University's tennis team handed Columbus College a season-ending 7-2 setback at the Rebels' courts Thursday, but only a victory would have made the Rebels' day more perfect.

Steve Campbell, the No. 1 Columbus player, upset FSU's Dave Danielson, 7-5, 6-1, and also teamed with Bobby Babcock — the Rebels' No. 1 doubles team — to upset Bobby Marcher and John Dezeeuw.

"Danielson has beaten some of the top players in the nation," Columbus College coach Charlie Ragsdale pointed out. "This is the best win for him (Campbell) . . . it's one of the finest wins we have had."

The defeat left the Rebels, who will return with all but one of this year's players, Don Thompson, next year, with a 17-5 record.

"I said at the start of the season that if we would break even we would have an adequate season. Since we had so many new boys I felt could play plus the returning boys, I thought we could jell into an excellent team with a lot of hard work, desire and dedication," Ragsdale said of the season. "This is exactly

what they have done."
