## *Netters finish 16th in NCAA tournament, pick up a six point total*

Completing what its coach called an extremely successful season, the Florida State tennis team finished 16th recently at the NCAA University division tennis championships held in South Bend, Ind.

Surmounting a total of six points during the four-day tournament, the Seminoles tied with three other teams for the 16th spot. They were Brigham Young, Southern Illinois and Arizona.

"I was extremely pleased with the way our boys handled themselves at their first national competition," commented Head Coach Pete Barizon. Especially for our freshmen it was quite a good showing."

Of the four tribesmen that made the trip, frosh Steve Diamond made possibly the best showing as he won his first two matches including an upset triumph over University of Miami star Joe Globisch, 7-5, 6-1.

Diamond also won his first match of the tournament when he knocked off Wes Morton of Hampton Institute. In his third effort, however, he had the misfortune of drawing one of the top players on the national champion UCLA club, Tito Alvarez. Diamond lost that one, 6-3, 6-4.

The only senior on the club, John DeZeeuw, also picked up two points for the Tribe. He drew a first round bye and then came back to win his second contest of the tournament by ripping Bill Almonte of the University of Michigan.

In his final effort as a Seminole, however, DeZeeuw lost the Zan Guerry of the powerful Rice club that finished third in the action.

Another freshman, Regean Genios, also did well for the Tribe by winning his first two matches before dropping one. He defeated Bill Michalson of Missouri, 6-3, 6-0 and Gene Morton of Toledo by default before losing in this third contest to Emilio Montano of Rice 7-5, 6-1.

Ricardo Bernd, FSU's top man for most of the season, also made the trip but lost by default in the first round of singles action to Bob Allo of the University of California.

Florida State accumulated all six of its points in the singles competition but did have two teams in doubles play that lost in their first match. Bernd and DeZeeuw after drawing a first round bye lost to the team of John Gardner and Tim Vann of SMU 6-2, 6-4. Genios and Diamond, on the other hand lost in their first encounter to Jim Rombeal and Ron Ley of Houston.

"We lived up to our preseason ranking," said Barizon of the performance. At the beginning of the campaign, Tennis West magazine had predicted the Seminoles to finish 17th in the nation.

The Tribe did the experts one better, however, by taking 16th and compiling a fine 19-3 regular season mark.

UCLA, the perennial champion in every sport, finished the tournament with 35 points which was eight more than second place Trinity of Texas. Rice had 23 points for third, Southern California took fourth with 22, Corpus Christi University had 20 for fifth and Miami was sixth scoring 16 points.

Despite the fine finish, Barizon did feel that if things had gone a little more the Seminoles' way, they could have placed even higher in the standings. "If Ortiz (FSU's number three player) hadn't had that bad knee and if Bernd had been healthy for his matches, we possibly could have done better.

"I also don't think that we had too much luck on the draws picking up two Rice players and a UCLA player in the third round."

But in the end, Barizon can relax with the thought that five of the six top players on the Seminole squad will be returning to the club next season as sophomores. "I really won't have much recruiting to do," he concluded.
