

FSU tennis team loses to UNC 6-3

The University of North Carolina's tennis team ran its record to 4-0 with a 6-3 win over Florida State Tuesday.

UNC's Bill Brock defeated Gordon Jones 4-6, 6-2, 6-3, and Tom Dixon downed Jose Schmidt 7-6, 7-6. Clive Rothwell edged Joe Garcia 6-3, 2-6, 7-5 for the first Florida State win.

Earl Hassler beat Enrique Andrade 6-3, 6-3, while Cliff Skakle blasted Andre Cantin 6-2, 6-2. Dave Calvert was the other Seminole winner in singles, defeating Dave Oberstein 6-2, 6-4.

In doubles, Schmidt and Calvert downed Brock and Dixon 6-4, 4-6, 7-6 for FSU's final win. Garcia and Bassler then clipped Jones and Rothwell 6-3, 6-7, 6-4, and Chatman and Skakle beat Andrada and Thomas 6-3.

Florida State is now 2-2 with a match at home against Eastern Kentucky today at 3 o'clock.

Tribe drops net match 7-2

The University of North Carolina brought an undefeated tennis team to Tallahassee and managed to leave town the same way, though not without a scare

from the Seminole netters. The Tar Heels won 7-2, but it was a lot closer than that. Clive Rothwell and Dave Calvert each persevered his four-match win streak, and those were the only victories

for the Seminoles. Rothwell out-steadied Joe Garcia 6-3, 2-6, 7-5 and Calvert slammed Dave Oberstein 6-2, 6-4.

Gordon Jones, No. 1 for Florida State, lost to North Carolina's Bill Brock 4-6, 6-2, 6-3 after looking invincible in the first set. Jones jumped out to a 5-0 lead in the first set on the strength of fine backcourt play, but the FSU sophomore couldn't sustain his concentration and struggled throughout the match after his opening flurry.

The Tar Heels took the remaining singles with Tom Dixon defeating Zeca Schmidt 7-6, 7-6, Earl Hassler knocking off Enrique Andrade 6-3, 6-3, and Cliff Skakle beating Andre Cantin 6-2, 6-2.

The Seminoles still had an outside chance to take the match going into doubles play, but North Carolina won all three matches after being

extended to three sets in each case.

Brock-Dixon defeated Schmidt-Calvert 6-4, 4-6, 7-6. Jones-Rothwell lost to Garcia-Hassler 6-3, 6-7, 6-4 and Chatman-Skakle beat Andrade-Thomas 6-3, 3-6, 6-4.

Women drop two

Two slow offensive starts hurt Florida State's Lady Seminole basketball team as they went 0-2 in the Women's Regional Tournament last weekend, completing the season with a 15-17 mark.

"We just didn't play the caliber of ball necessary to compete successfully in that kind of tournament," explained Lady Seminole Coach Millie Usher.

Auburn topped FSU 64-51 in the first tournament contest. The Lady Seminoles were able to score only 18 points in the first half, giving the Lady tigers a comfortable cushion for the second half.

Yvette McKinney lead Florida State with 15 points, followed by Bobbi Parr with 12 and Barbara Koontz with 10. Parr and McKinney each pulled down seven rebounds.

The Lady Seminoles next fell victim to Fort Valley 58-43. The Georgia school built an early 20 point lead before FSU caught fire and pulled within seven before finally succumbing.

Parr was high for FSU with 12 points and McKinney had
