THE COACHES: FSU's Richard McKee completes his third year at the helm of the men's program. During his tenure FSU's record is 62-25. McKee owns a .713 winning percentage.

Anne Rizza has compiled a 130-88 record during her seven years at Florida State. She has led the Lady Seminoles to three Metro Conference Championships and its first top 20 ranking in 1983. She is a three-time Metro Conference Coach-of-the-Year.

LAST YEAR: FSU's men's team total of 42.5 points placed second to South Carolina's total of 44. Only two current players competed in last year's tournament. Jeff Horine took second place in the number four singles competition, and Alex Rucker was the runner-up in both the number five singles and number three doubles matches.

The Lady Seminoles finished third, behind South Carolina and Tulane, in the Metro Championships held in Memphis last year. Florida State defeated Virginia Tech to take the third place trophy.

TOUGH LOSSES: The Lady Seminoles lost only nine matches this season. All nine losses, however, were at the hands of teams that at one time during the season were ranked in the Top 20.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: Although only one player on the men's team holds a winning record, each of the three doubles teams possess records at or above the .500 mark. The number three doubles team of Shannon Krieger and Jeff Cooney lead the way with a 12-8 record. They are followed by Alex Rucker and Fred Weinman and Jeff Horine and Henner Lenhardt with 10-10 records. "If you want to characterize a strength of this team, I would have to say it is our doubles play," McKee said.

STUDENTS OF THE GAME: The lady netters attained one of their preseason goals when they won the team academic achievement award with a 2.9 grade point average. It marked the second consecutive year that the tennis team received the annual award given by the FSU's women's athletic department.

SIDELINED: FSU's men's head coach Richard McKee's hopes of a 20 win season were dashed this fall when two players who were scheduled to play in the top five were sidelined with injuries. The Seminoles had received votes on the top 20 preseason poll. "When you lose two people like that in the middle of your lineup, it changes the entire team," McKee said. "With those two players in there, I feel comfortable in saying that we could have had a 20 win season."

A FAMILIAR PAIR: Although 1986 is their first year of collegiate tournament doubles action together, sophomores Alex Rucker and Fred Weinman feel comfortable playing the number two doubles position. Both played at Delray Beach Atlantic High School, where they teamed to win the state doubles title in 1984.

HENDERSON'S HOT: Senior Patti Henderson, winner of 10 of her last 13 matches, owns a 16-7 singles record. She also has teamed with partner Sue Hatch to record six straight doubles victories to up their record to 17-6. The Ontario, Canada native hopes to receive a bid to the NCAA Championships in Austin, Texas with a good showing in the Metro Tournament. Henderson was selected as the Most Valuable Player of this year's team.

QUOTES FROM COACH McKEE: "Right now, I would pick us to be in the running for a spot behind South Carolina. In my opinion, South Carolina is playing better tennis than anyone in the conference.

"I remember last year when there were a few surprises in the tournament, however. You always have to expect surprises. We might be able to catch some people who have already received bids to the NCAA Championships sleeping.

"This tournament will help build a foundation for next year. We only lose one senior and the two injured players will return."

QUOTES FROM COACH RIZZA: "The tournament should come down to South Carolina and us. Although I'm a little prejudiced I would give us the edge in going in and being seeded number one.

"Everyone is playing extremely well. I think that the come-from-behind win over Wisconsin (March 27) gave us the confidence we needed."

"I think I really have to bear down in the first round. Everyone's always nervous and if you can get through the opening match, you usually are in pretty good shape."

Sue Hatch, Junior, Number Two Singles, Ontario, Canada--  
"To win the Metro Tournament takes playing consistently well the whole week. There can be no let down. I think our team is playing real well. We're peaking at the right time."

Patti Henderson, Senior, Number One Singles, Ontario, Canada--  
"I've been playing well. This has been my best year ever. I've gotten more consistency in my game. I'm looking forward to going into the Metro and finishing on a good note."
