South Carolina cruises to Metro championships

South Carolina's Stephane Simian and Florida State's Stephan Note-boom started showing signs of pressure as their No. 1 singles final progressed during yesterday's Metro Conference Tennis Championships in Louisville.

Blasting themselves with outbursts in their native tongues — Simian in

French, Noteboom in Dutch — the two engaged in a self-motivational duel. Simian proved to be slightly more effective as he outlasted Noteboom 7-6 (7-3), 4-6, 7-6 (9-7).

"He was returning my serve really well, and he gave me trouble," said Simian, ranked eighth in the United States. "We've played so much lately it was hard to keep focused."

South Carolina, which came into the tournament as the heavy favorite, lived up to its billing, defeating its closest competitor, Virginia Tech, 46-30.

"The Metro is a lot tougher than it used to be, and we had a lot of tough matches," Gamecocks men's coach Kent DeMars said. "I expected us to do well, but we had to be ready each time we went out."

South Carolina had three singles winners and two doubles champions, including the No. 1 team of Simian and Dave Hopper, which beat Virginia Tech's Alex Ortiz and Mark Bernstine 6-3, 6-4.

The South Carolina women's team swept all six singles finals and won two doubles matches. Only the No. 1 doubles team of Nathalie Rodriguez and Michelle Duda fell, losing their final 6-2, 7-6 (7-5) to Florida State's

Buffy Baker and Keri Preng.

South Carolina finished with 52 points. Florida State had 36.

Rodriguez, ranked 42nd nationally, whipped Baker 6-3, 6-3 to capture the No. 1 singles match.

"I knew I couldn't relax against her because she's a very good player," Rodriguez said. "But it was hard to get up for the doubles. It's been a long weekend."

It was a long day for the University of Louisville, which had just one finalist, No. 4 men's player Warren Watson, who lost 6-3, 7-6 (10-8) to Virginia Tech's Alex Ortiz.

The U of L men finished in seventh place, the women's team in sixth.
