### FLORIDA STATE MEN'S TENNIS SIGNS ROMAIN JURD OF FRANCE

Jurd is currently one of the top 10 junior players in France

TALLAHASSEE, FL. -- Florida State men's head tennis coach Dwayne Hultquist announced the signing of Romain Jurd on Friday, May 19th. Jurd is a top 10 junior player in France and will be competing in the Junior French Open in two weeks.

"Romain is very quick and has an excellent all-court game," said Hultquist. "He possesses a lot of the same skills as Xavier Luscan (FSU's current No. 1 player) who is from France as well. Romain balances school and athletics very well and will be a great addition to our team."

Jurd has had numerous wins against other top-ranked juniors from around the world in his extensive playing career. While spending a majority of his young career playing on clay courts, Jurd spent time at the Palmer Tennis Academy in Tampa, Fla., to improve his hard-court game and familiarize himself with American customs and the English language.

"Romain is only 17 and ranked as high as Xavier in France," said Hultquist. "Romain has a great all-around game that compares to Xavier's at that age. Someday he wants to go pro so I have no doubt that he will come here and work really hard to better himself and the team."

Later this summer before enrolling at FSU, Jurd will be one of the favorites at the Junior French National Championships in Paris, France.

Jurd will join the Seminoles in the fall of 2000 as he selected Florida State over South Carolina and Arizona State.

### FLORIDA STATE UPSETS THE FAMU RATTTLERS BY A SCORE OF 5-2

The 54th-ranked Florida State Seminoles defeat the 53rd-ranked FAMU Rattlers raising their season record to 14-10.

TALLAHASSEE, FL - For the fourth time in the history between the two Tallahassee schools, the 54th-ranked Florida State Seminoles upset the 53rd-ranked Florida A&M Rattlers by a score of 5-2 on Friday, April 28th. This added match for the Seminoles raised their season record to 14-10 while reducing the Rattlers record to 21-5.

Clinching the doubles point to begin the match at 1-0, the Florida State Seminoles took two of three doubles matches. At No. 1 doubles, the tandem of Xavier Luscan/Rodgiro Laub defeated Isaac Yarrell/Robert Beutelus by a close score of 9-8 (3) to increase their overall record at No. 1 to 4-8. The second doubles point was earned at the No. 3 position by the duo of Mike Ingham/Jeff Scarella. This win was the Seminoles fifth at the No. 3 position. Dropping the lone doubles point, the duo of Jay Travis/Noah Schnell were defeated by the Rattler duo of Ivan Lolic/Joseph Clark by a score of 8-6.

Three of the six singles matches resulted in straight set victories for the Seminoles. At No. 1 singles, Luscan defeated Levin Mongerie by a score of 6-3, 6-1 while at No. 2 singles, Ingham won his 18th match of the season with his win over Jerry Joseph by a score of 6-3, 6-2. In the final straight set win of Friday's match, sophomore Scarella increased his winning streak to three by defeating Wadawu by a score of 6-4, 6-1.

The Noles dropped only two singles matches to the Rattlers, at the No. 3 and No. 5 positions. Sophomore Schnell dropped his overall season record to 10-14 as a result of his loss to Lolic by a score of 6-3, 6-4. The second singles loss of the evening came from freshman Laub who was defeated by Beutelus by a score of 6-4, 7-6 (4).

The lone three set match of the night was won by FSU sophomore Chad Mooney by a score of 3-6, 7-5, 6-2. Mooney came from behind to pull off the match and earn his third win at the No. 4 position by defeating Isaac Yarrell from FAMU.

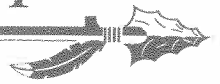

### FLORIDA STATE MEN'S TENNIS TEAM PLACES TWO ON THE ALL-ACC TEAM Ingham and Luscan named to the 2000 Atlantic Coast Conference Team

TALLAHASSEE, FL. -- The Florida State men's tennis team learned hours before their match against FAMU on Friday that two teammates had been awarded all-conference honors. Senior Mike Ingham and sophomore Xavier Luscan were selected to the All-ACC team which is voted on by the nine head coaches in the league.

Ingham and Luscan are the first Seminoles since 1996 to be named All-ACC. Ingham has won 10 of 19 matches at the No. 2 singles position this season for the 'Noles. Ingham went 3-1 against fellow All-ACC members this dual match season.

Luscan, who is currently ranked No. 49 in the country by the ITA, went 15-8 at No. 1 singles this spring including wins over the 10th, the 18th and the 44th-ranked players in the nation. Luscan transferred to Florida State after playing a year at UCLA.

Luscan and Ingham have led the Seminoles to a 13-10 record and a national ranking of No. 54. The Seminoles finished in fifth place in the ACC in 2000 and will host Florida A&M in their final regular season match this evening, April 28th, before hearing from the NCAA if they have been selected into the tournament. The field of 64 will be announced on May 4th.

### FSU MEN'S TENNIS SCHEDULES A MATCH AGAINST FAMU FOR FRIDAY

Two schools will meet for the first time in 18 years

Tallahassee, FL - The 54th-ranked Florida State Seminoles added another match this week to make up for two earlier rainouts. FSU will host the nation's 53rd-ranked Florida A & M Rattlers of Tallahassee, in the first meeting between the two schools since 1982. The match scheduled for Friday, April 28th at 4 p.m., will be the fourth ever meeting between FSU (13-10) and FAMU (21-4).

Florida State is coming off a weekend loss to Virginia in the first round of the ACC Tournament. FSU, the fifth seed in the tournament, lost its 10th match of the season 4-1 to the Cavaliers, the No. 4 seed. Florida State senior Mike Ingham came from behind to defeat Virginia's Huntley Montgomery in three sets, 0-6, 6-4, 6-2, at No. 2 singles. Ingham, who was ranked 97th in the country, defeated Montgomery the nation's 51st-ranked player, for the second time in a month. On March 26th, Ingham earned one of FSU's two points in the match, defeating the Cavaliers No. 2 player in straight sets.

The 1999-2000 season has been one of new beginnings for the Seminoles. Head coach Dwayne Hultquist and assistant coach John Roddick have added four new faces to the program and have seen two players, Ingham and Luscan, reach national ranking. In their first season together, the new coaching tandem led FSU to a 4-4 conference record with wins over Maryland, Wake Forest, N.C. State and Georgia Tech. The Noles shut out the Terrapins and won two tight, one-point matches against the Wolfpack and Yellow Jackets.

The Seminoles have won five matches this season against ranked opponents and eight of their 10 losses have come against teams that were ranked in the top 40 in the country. FSU played in nine "4-3" matches and won seven of them.

The match with FAMU came about after unfavorable weather conditions resulted in the cancellation of two Seminole matches. The first rainout occurred on Sunday, February 27th against Miami and the second rainout took place on Sunday, March 19th against Georgia State. FAMU has already qualified for the NCAA Tournament by winning their conference tournament. A Seminole win would improve the Seminole's chances of obtaining an at-large bid into the field of 64. FSU and FAMU have met three times in the past with the Seminoles taking all three meetings.

The NCAA will announce the tournament field on May 4th. If Florida State is chosen to participate in the NCAA Tournament, the regionals will begin on May 12th and the finals will be in Athens, Ga. beginning on May 19th.

### FLORIDA STATE MEN'S TENNIS TEAM FALLS TO VIRGINIA 4-1 IN FIRST ROUND OF THE ACC TOURNAMENT

Ingham picks up lone point for Seminoles

ATLANTA, GA. -- The 52nd-ranked Florida State Seminoles were knocked out of the ACC Tournament Friday by the 36th-ranked Virginia Cavaliers. FSU, the fifth seed in the tournament, lost its 10th match of the season 5-2 to the Cavaliers, the No. 4 seed. UVA improves to 16-8 on the season and advances to the semifinals of the tournament to face the No. 1 seeded Duke Blue Devils. Florida State falls to 13-10 with its second loss of the season to Virginia.

Florida State senior Mike Ingham came from behind to defeat Virginia's Huntley Montgomery in three sets, 0-6, 6-4, 6-2, at No. 2 singles. Ingham, who is ranked 97th in the country, defeated Montgomery, who is ranked 51st, for the second time in a month. On March 26th, Ingham grabbed one of FSU's two points that day, by defeating the Cavaliers No. 2 player in straight sets. Ingham's record improves to 17-14 on the year and to 10-9 at the No. 2 position.

Florida State came close to opening the match by taking the doubles point, but could only win one of three doubles matches against the Cavaliers. FSU won at No. 3 doubles, 9-7 and almost pulled out the win at No. 1 before falling by the same score 9-7. Winning at No. 3 for the Seminoles was the tandem of Jeff Scarella and Ingham. Scarella and Ingham won for the fourth time at the No. 3 position this season and improved their overall record to 10-11. The win also avenged an 8-6 loss to the UVA pair of Michael Duquette and Brian Hunter on March 26th.

FSU's Xavier Luscan lost for only the eighth time in 23 matches at No. 1 singles this season. Luscan was defeated by the country's fifth-ranked player, UVA's Brian Vahaly. Luscan, who is currently ranked 50th in the nation, saw his two-match win streak come to a halt with the 6-1, 7-5 loss.

Florida State will now have to wait until May 4th to find out if they have been selected to play in the 2000 NCAA Tournament.

### THE 46TH-RANKED FLORIDA STATE SEMINOLES CAPTURE THEIR FOURTH ACC VICTORY SUNDAY AGAINST THE GEORGIA TECH YELLOW JACKETS

The Seminoles clinch four of the six singles matches to pull out the win

TALLAHASSEE, FL - The 46th-ranked Florida State Seminoles sealed their fourth ACC match of the 2000 season against the 70th-ranked Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets on Sunday, April 16th. The Florida State win increased their overall season record to 13-9 while improving their ACC record to 4-4. Meanwhile, the Georgia Tech loss dropped their season record to 10-12 and to 4-4 in the ACC.

Florida State won one of the the three doubles matches to open the match, with that win coming from the duo of Travis/Schnell at the No. 2 position by a score of 8-6. The Noles headed into the singles portion of the match down by one point.

Rebounding from the lost doubles point, the Seminoles evened up the match with a win at No. 1 singles. Florida State's 50th-ranked player in the country, Xavier Luscan, defeated the Yellow Jacket's Sergio Aguirre in three sets, 6-2, 4-6, 6-1, to increase his ACC record to 5-3 on the season.

The Seminoles ripped off three other singles matches to accumulate their four points. At No. 4, junior Chad Mooney defeated Romain Coirault in a hard fought match, 1-6, 6-3, 6-3 to increase his dual record to 10-10 while junior Jay Travis completed his second win at the No. 5 position by defeating Jason Jeong by a score of 6-3, 6-4.

Notching the final Nole victory of the singles portion of the match and completing his 20th win of the year, freshman Rodrigo Laub increased his ACC record to 5-2 by defeating Fabio Campos at the No. 6 singles position by a score of 3-6, 6-3, 7-6(5). Laub is the first FSU freshman to win 20 matches since Mike Ingham in the 1996-97 season. In that season, Ingham went 26-7. The No. 2 and No. 3 FSU singles players went the distance during their matches but in the end were defeated by the Yellow Jackets. Senior Mike Ingham completed his career at FSU with a 2000 dual record of 11-10 with his loss to Roger Anderson, 6-1, 6-1, at No. 2 singles. At No. 3 singles, sophomore Noah Schnell dropped his match to David Wright by a close score of 7-6(4), 6-3.

Florida State will return home to prepare for the ACC tournament next weekend in Atlanta, Georgia.

### THE 46TH-RANKED FLORIDA STATE SEMINOLES EARN 12TH WIN OF THE SEASON ON THE ROAD AGAINST FURMAN SATURDAY

Noles take five of six singles matches in the 6-1 victory.

TALLAHASSEE, FL - The 46th-ranked Florida State Seminoles improved their record to 12-9 on the season with a 6-1 victory over the Furman Paladins on Saturday. Furman drops to 18-12 on the season.

Florida State won two of three doubles matches to claim the first point of the match and take a 1-0 lead heading into the singles matches. FSU's wins were at the No. 1 and No. 2 positions where the Seminole tandem of Luscan and Laub defeated Chesworth and Cameron by a score of 8-4 at No. 1 and the FSU duo of Travis and Schnell defeated the Furman tandem of Parker and Nickell at No. 2 by a score of 8-5. Travis and Schnell improved their record at No. 2 to 6-6 this season.

The top three singles positions were all won by Florida State. At No. 1 singles, Florida State's Xavier Luscan, the 50th-ranked player in the country, defeated Lee Nickell from Furman by a score of 6-4, 6-2. Luscan's record at No. 1 singles improved to 14-7 heading into the final match of his first year at Florida State. At No. 2 singles, FSU senior Mike Ingham, the nation's 97th-ranked player, defeated James Cameron in three sets, 6-7, 6-1, 6-4. Ingham heads into the final regular season match of his career on Sunday with a record of 11-9 this spring.

Also earning a three-set victory was FSU sophomore Noah Schnell at No. 3 singles. Schnell's 7-6, 2-6, 6-4 victory over Drew Parker was his second at the No. 3 position. FSU freshman Rodrigo Laub's 6-3, 6-4 triumph over the Paladin's Patrick Gaughan was his second at the No. 5 position and Seminole sophomore Jeff Scarella defeated James Mocckel at the No. 6 position by a score of 7-6, 6-4 to increase his season record to 5-5.

The Seminoles last match of the regular season will take place on Sunday, April 16th, against Georgia Tech in Atlanta, Georgia.

### FSU MEN'S TENNIS LOSES TO SOUTH FLORIDA 6-1 Florida State falls to 11-9 overall

TAMPA, FL. -- The Florida State men's tennis team traveled to Tampa, Fla. to face the South Florida Bulls in their eighth road match of the season. The 69th-ranked Bulls defeated the 47th-ranked Seminoles 6-1 to hand the Noles their sixth road loss of the year. FSU's record falls to 11-9 overall while USF improves to 10-13 on the year.

The lone point for FSU came from junior Chad Mooney at No. 6 singles. Mooney won his first match of the season at No. 6 by a score of 6-3, 7-5. Florida State did manage to win one of the three doubles matches, winning at the No. 3 position by a score of 8-1. The FSU duo of Mike Ingham and Jeff Scarella defeated Abhijit Shah and Ernest Diaz at No. 3 to win their seventh dual match of the season.

At No. 1 singles, FSU's Xavier Luscan, the country's 44th-ranked player, lost to the nation's 62nd-ranked player, Fabio Tintori, by a score of 6-4, 7-6. Two of the six singles matches went three sets including No. 5 singles where FSU's Rodrigo Laub lost for only the fifth time this dual match season. Laub lost to USF's Abhijit Shah 6-4, 1-6, 6-3.

Florida State has two matches remaining in their regular season. Both matches will be next weekend on the road against Furman on Saturday, April 15th and Georgia Tech on Sunday, April 16th.

### FSU MEN'S TENNIS AIMS TO DEFEAT #69 SOUTH FLORIDA SUNDAY

The 47th-ranked Florida State Seminoles look to win 12th match of the season

TALLAHASSEE, FL - The 47th-ranked Florida State Seminoles will travel to Tampa on Sunday to face the 69th-ranked South Florida Bulls. The match with the Bulls is the first in a three-match road trip that will conclude the season for the Noles. FSU's overall record is 11-8 and 3-4 in the ACC, while USF's overall record is 9-13 and 2-2 in Conference USA.

Senior Mike Ingham is concluding his four-year tennis career at Florida State as one of the winningest Seminoles in school history. Overall, Ingham is 15-12 as a senior and has won 82 of 122 single's matches during his career. In the past three weeks, Ingham has upset two top 50 ranked players and is riding a three-match ACC winning streak.

In Wednesday's 4-3 loss to South Alabama, Florida State's No. 1 singles player, sophomore Xavier Luscan, clinched one of the three Seminole points with a 6-4, 6-3 victory over South Alabama's No. 1 player Julien Raynal. Luscan's victory improved his record at the No. 1 position to 13-6 and his home record to 10-2. Securing the second point of the match for FSU was sophomore Noah Schnell at the No. 4 position by a score of 4-6, 6-4, 6-3 to improve his record to 9-10 this spring. The third Nole win was captured by freshman Rodrigo Laub by a score of 6-3, 3-6, 7-5 over South Alabama. The victory raised Laub's season record at No. 6 singles to 8-4.

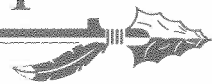

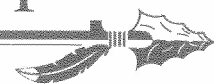

### FSU MEN'S TENNIS LOOKS TO WIN 12TH MATCH OF THE SEASON WEDNESDAY AGAINST SOUTH ALABAMA

53rd-ranked Seminoles host 29th-ranked Jaguars in final home match of the season

TALLAHASSEE, FL. -- The Florida State men's tennis team will host the South Alabama Jaguars on Wednesday, April 5th, in the Seminoles' sixth match of the season against an opponent ranked in the Top 30. The match between the 53rd-ranked Seminoles and the 29th-ranked Jaguars is scheduled to begin at 3:30 p.m., at the Scott Speicher Tennis Center.

The Jaguars will be the sixth team to visit Tallahassee this season with a national ranking and FSU has sent three of the previous five teams home with a loss. The Seminoles overall record is 11-7 including a 9-2 record at home. Leading the way for the Seminoles is sophomore Xavier Luscan, who is currently ranked No. 28 in the country by the ITA, and is 12-6 in dual match play this season. Luscan is coming off an upset over the nation's 18th-ranked player from Duke, Ramsey Smith.

Seminole senior Mike Ingham is riding a three-match winning streak that has included two top-ranked players. Ingham defeated Virginia's Huntley Montgomery, the nation's 39th-ranked player, in straight sets on March 26th and then Duke's Doug Root on April 1st in a back-and-forth battle, 6-4, 3-6, 6-4.

First year head coach Dwayne Hultquist needs just one win in the team's final four matches to ensure the program's 14th consecutive winning season. Hultquist has added four new faces to this year's squad and will be losing just one senior on a team that at one point this season, was the hottest team in the country jumping 24 spots in the rankings in just three weeks.

The Jaguars will be the Seminoles last home match in the 2000 dual match season. The Noles will wrap up their regular season on the road against South Florida on April 9th, Furman on April 15th and Georgia Tech April 16th.

**55TH-RANKED FLORIDA STATE MEN'S TENNIS TEAM FALLS TO THE 5TH-RANKED DUKE BLUE DEVILS BY A SCORE OF 5-2**  
FSU Luscan and Ingham defeat ranked players

TALLAHASSEE, FL - The 55th-ranked Florida State Seminoles were defeated Saturday, April 1, by a score of 5-2. The two points for FSU came from the No. 1 and No. 2 singles positions where two major upsets occurred. FSU sophomore Xavier Luscan defeated the 18th-ranked player in the nation while senior Mike Ingham defeated the 50th-ranked player in the nation.

At No. 1 singles, sophomore Xavier Luscan, who is ranked 28th in the country, increased his ACC record to 4-3 by defeating Duke's Ramsey Smith in three sets, 7-6 (7), 4-6, 6-4. Sealing another victory for the Seminoles was senior Mike Ingham at No. 2 singles. Ingham's defeat over the 50th-ranked player in the nation, Doug Root, raises his ACC record to 4-2.

At No. 3 singles, junior Jay Travis fell short of a victory to Joel Spicher by a score of 6-3, 6-3 while at No. 4 singles, sophomore Noah Schnell dropped his match to Andres Pedroso, the nation's 51st-ranked player, by a score of 6-2, 6-4. Sophomore Chad Mooney came out firing before falling in a match that was tighter than the score indicates. Mooney lost to the country's 79th-ranked player, Marko Cerenko at No. 5 singles by a score of 7-6, 6-1.

In the doubles portion of the match, the Seminoles were able to claim one of the doubles matches, but ultimately lost the doubles point to Duke. At No. 1 doubles, the duo of Luscan/Laub lost to Smith/Root by a score of 8-5 while the tandem of Travis/Schnell dropped their match to Pedroso/Spicher by a score of 8-2 at No. 2. The Seminoles only doubles win came at No. 3, where the senior/sophomore duo of Ingham/Scarella who defeated Jones/Yani by a score of 8-3. Ingham/Scarella are now 2-0 in ACC matches and 5-6 in dual matches.

THE 55TH-RANKED FLORIDA STATE SEMINOLES DEFEATED THE 75TH-RANKED NORTH CAROLINA STATE WOLFPACK BY A SCORE OF 4-3. Ingham, Mooney and Laub all contribute victories to the Seminoles ninth straight victory against the Wolfpack.

TALLAHASSEE, FL -- On Thursday, March 30th at the Scott Speicher Tennis Center, the 55th-ranked Florida State Seminoles improved their record to 11-6 on the season and 3-3 in the ACC with a 4-3 win over 75th-ranked North Carolina State.

"We played good matches and fought hard," said FSU head coach Dwayne Hultquist. "North Carolina State was good competition and with the win our record is now even in the ACC. Chad Mooney played well, coming from behind and winning his match to secure the victory for us."

At No. 1 singles, FSU's Xavier Luscan took the Wolfpack's Eric Jackson to the limit before falling 6-2, 3-6, 7-6(4). FSU senior Mike Ingham provided a boost to the Seminoles by defeating Devang Desai at No. 2 singles by a score of 6-4, 6-2. ### FLORIDA STATE MEN'S TENNIS SET TO FACE NORTH CAROLINA STATE ON THURSDAY AND DUKE ON SATURDAY

Noles look to win for the ninth consecutive year against N.C. State

TALLAHASSEE, FL - The No. 55 Florida State Seminoles will host the North Carolina State Wolfpack at 3:30 p.m. Thursday, March 30th. The Seminoles enter the contest with a record of 10-6 overall and 2-3 in the conference. The Wolfpack head into action Thursday with a 9-10 record overall and no wins in their three ACC matches this season.

On Saturday, March 25, the Noles traveled to College Park, Maryland where they swept the unranked Maryland Terrapins. At No. 5 singles, sophomore Jeff Scarella defeated Dan Kenshalo by a score of 6-1, 6-1. This was Scarella's first match since his loss to Darren Knight of Clemson on March 12, 2000 by a score of 6-3, 6-1. Scarella's record this spring now stands at 4-5.

Another Nole to make an appearance Saturday was freshman Joe Bassett. Bassett defeated John Rockwell from the University of North Carolina-Asheville by a score of 7-6 (1), 6-0 on February 12th and on Saturday, Bassett swept Maryland's Jonathan Murchison by a score of 6-2, 2-1, ret. The win against the Terrapins increased Bassett's overall record to 4-4, increased his winning streak to two and increased his record at the No. 6 position to 2-1.

On Sunday, March 26, the Noles traveled to face the University of Virginia Cavaliers. Losing for just the sixth time all season, FSU lost a close match 4-3 to the 38th-ranked Cavaliers. The three Nole wins of the match were accomplished by senior Mike Ingham, junior Chad Mooney, and freshman Rodrigo Laub. In Ingham's fifth match of the year against a ranked opponent, the senior from Rochdale, England defeated the 39th-ranked player in the country, Huntley Montgomery by a score of 6-4, 6-2.

This weekend, the 55th-ranked Florida State Seminoles battle North Carolina State on Thursday and Duke University on Saturday, April 1. Since Florida State entered the Atlantic Coast Conference in 1992, the Noles have won eight consecutive matches against the Wolfpack. In both 1994 and 1996, the Seminoles shutout the 'Pack, 7-0.

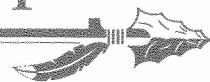

### FLORIDA STATE MEN'S TENNIS FALLS TO FLORIDA IN GAINESVILLE

GAINESVILLE, FL -- The 45th-ranked Florida State Seminoles lost for only the fifth time this season in Gainesville, Fla., to the Florida Gators on Wednesday. Florida State's record falls to 9-5 while the fourth-ranked Gators improve to 13-2.

Noles and Gators continue rivalry on Wednesday

TALLAHASSEE, FL - The 45th-ranked Florida State Seminoles head to Gainesville for a match Wednesday against the 4th-ranked Florida Gators. Florida State enters the match with a record of 9-4 and looking to curb a three-match losing streak. Florida is 12-2 on the season and 4-0 in the SEC.

The Noles come into the match winning 76 of 135 singles matches and 42 of 78 doubles matches this dual season. FSU is 10-3 at both the No. 1 and No. 5 singles positions this spring. North Carolina improved their ACC record to 2-1 while the Seminoles dropped to 1-2 in the conference.

Florida State will play two more matches on the road after Wednesday's Florida match before returning home to Tallahassee, Fla. to face the North Carolina State Wolfpack on Saturday, March 30.

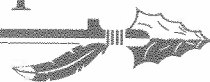

### FLORIDA STATE MEN'S TENNIS TEAM PREPARES TO FACE 12TH-RANKED TEXAS LONGHORNS

Hultquist returns to face former team

TALLAHASSEE, FL. -- The 45th-ranked Florida State men's tennis team takes its eight-match winning streak to Austin, Texas to face the 12th-ranked Texas Longhorns on Wednesday, March 5th at 2 p.m. First-year FSU head coach Dwayne Hultquist returns to the school where he served for eight years as an assistant. Hultquist brings the Seminoles into Wednesday's match with the Longhorns with a record of 9-1.

"I am pleased with where we are right now," said Hultquist. "We have beat some good teams and some teams that we should have beaten heading into the season. Now it is time to face some of the elite teams in the country and see how we stack up. Texas is one of those elite teams, they are ranked 12th so it should be a good test for us. We lost to Texas Christian pretty good, and now we get to see how much we have improved. We have Clemson after them so that will be two of the best three teams we have faced this season. Wake Forest was a good win for us and but this week will be a good gauge on where we stand."

The Seminoles are the hottest team in the country jumping 24 spots since the preseason ITA rankings came out in December. FSU is led by the nation's 29th-ranked player Xavier Luscan. Luscan is riding an eight-match winning streak at No. 1 singles and teams with freshman Rodrigo Laub to play doubles. Laub is looking to extend his own winning streak in singles to 10 and is 14-3 overall in his freshman campaign.

Sophomore Noah Schnell and senior Mike Ingham are also riding winning streaks of three and two, respectively. Schnell is 5-1 at No. 5 singles this season while Ingham has solidified the No. 2 singles spot with a record of 5-2. Junior Chad Mooney has had an up-and-down season, defeating four of five opponents at No. 3 singles while dropping three of four matches at No. 4 singles.

Texas enters Wednesday's match with two ranked players, No. 28 Michael Blue and No. 64 Nick Crowell. Last season, the Longhorns advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament before falling to eventual National Champion Georgia.

"Well, I know them (Texas) really well so it's a matter of executing," said Hultquist. "On paper they are a better team but that doesn't mean anything when you step on the court. I have kept in touch with many of the players and their families so I am looking forward to seeing them again. I root for Texas in every match they play in except for this Wednesday's."

Following the Texas match, the Seminoles will face the Clemson Tigers on Sunday, March 12th at 1:00 p.m in Clemson, S.C. The 30th-ranked Tigers will be the Noles first ACC match of the season and only their fourth match away from Tallahassee. FSU is 1-1 on the road this dual match season heading into Wednesday's match with Texas.

**NO. 45TH-RANKED FLORIDA STATE SEMIOLES DEFEAT THE NO. 40TH-RANKED WAKE FOREST DEMON DEACONS BY A SCORE OF 5-2.**

Luscan, Ingam, Laub, and Schnell help the Noles claim their eighth win in nine years over Wake Forest

TALLAHASSEE, FL - The Florida State men's tennis team improved their record to 9-1 as they defeated Wake Forest University at the Scott Speicher Tennis Center Sunday, March 3, 2000. The 29th-ranked player in the country, Xavier Luscan, Mike Ingam, Rodrigo Laub, and Noah Schnell helped the Noles claim their eighth win over Wake Forest in the past nine years.

The No. 1 doubles match against Wake Forest's Munoz/Murray produced a Florida State loss. The Demon Deacons defeated the Seminoles by a score of 8-3. Clinching the doubles point for the Seminoles were the No. 2 and No. 3 double's teams. Travis/Schnell defeated Hansen/Mauro by a score of 8-4 to grasp the first doubles point at No. 2, and the tandem of Mooney/Ingham defeated Kaufman/Berger by a score of 9-8 to grasp the second doubles point and give FSU a 1-0 lead heading into the single's portion of the match.

At No. 1 singles, FSU junior Xavier Luscan defeated senior Mike Berger by a score of 6-1, 6-2. Luscan increased his winning streak to eight as a result of this win. Increasing his record to 5-2 at the No. 2 position, senior Mike Ingham defeated freshman Mike Murray by a score of 6-3, 6-4.

Two singles matches were dropped by Florida State in the singles portion. First, at the No. 3 position, junior Jay Travis was defeated by Wake Forest's John Hansen by a score of 6-4, 6-4. The second Wake Forest victory of the singles portion was at the No. 4 position where junior Chad Mooney was defeated by freshman Raul Munoz by a score of 7-6, 7-6.

The last two singles matches stretched the limits by going three sets each. First at the No. 5 position, sophomore Noah Schnell defeated Demon Deacon David Bere by a score of 7-5, 3-6, 6-1 and at the No. 6 position, freshman Rodrigo Laub's winning streak went to nine with a win over freshman Trent Brendan by a score of 3-6, 6-4, 6-0.

"This was a big win for us," said FSU assistant coach John Roddick. "The guys kept asking me during the match how everyone was doing. I kept telling them, it could go either way. But in the end, we pulled it off. It would be great for us to keep beating teams who are on the same level as us so that we can gain some confidence."

**THE 45TH-RANKED FLORIDA STATE SEMINOLES FACE THE 41ST-RANKED WAKE FOREST DEMON DEACONS.**

After a week off, the Noles will meet the Demon Deacons Sunday in Tallahassee.

TALLAHASSEE, FL - After being rained out last weekend against Miami, the Florida State Seminoles will play their first match in eight days against the Wake Forest Demon Deacons on Sunday, March 5th. The Demon Deacons are 5-1 on the season and the Seminoles enter Sunday's match on a seven-match winning streak and a record of 8-1.

"This hole in the schedule is too long," said FSU head coach Dwayne Hultquist. "Even though our team is healthy, this two week gap is not good. This is a big match for us because it is our first one in the ACC. If we do well this weekend and end up in the upper tier, we will do well in the NCAA's."

Giving up no more than three points per match, the Noles have swept Wake Forest in seven out of the last eight matches between the two. In 1999, the Noles fell short of a victory to Wake by a score of 4-3 for their first loss to the Demon Deacons in seven years. In 1998, the Noles defeated Wake by a score of 5-2, in 1997 by a score of 4-0, in 1996 by score 6-1, in 1995 by a score of 5-2, in 1994 by a score of 6-1, in 1993 by a score of 6-1, in 1992 by a score of 5-3.

Florida State is one of the hottest teams in the country jumping 24 spots in the ITA poll since opening the preseason rankings at No. 69. The Noles have ripped off seven consecutive wins and are 8-1. The only other team in the country to rise as many spots in the rankings this season is Ball State, who jumped from No. 75 to No. 44, but who have now fallen to the No. 54 position after a loss last week. In the midst of this hottest team is one of the country's hottest player, Xavier Luscan. Luscan has jumped 26 spots in the rankings from No. 55 to No. 29 in the last two weeks.

In dual matches this season, senior Mike Ingham and sophomore Noah Schnell both have records of 6-3. Ingham has competed at the No. 2, No. 3, No. 4, and No. 5 slot. Ingham's record at No. 2 is 4-2, at No. 3 is 1-0, at No. 4 0-1 and at No. 5 is 1-0. Schnell has competed at the No. 3, No. 4, and No. 5 positions with records consisting of 0-1, 2-1, and 4-1 respectively.

The 1999-2000 season for the Wake Forest Demon Deacons brings players from all over the country and world. The freshman class consists of David Bere (Midland, MI), Trent Brendon (Victorville, CA), Mark Grae (Staten Island, N.Y.), Brian Mruphy (Thomasville, N.C.), and Michael Murray (Clearwater, FL.) Justin Kaufmann (Mission Hills, KS) and Richard Phillip (Ft. Wayne, IN) occupy the sophomore class at Wake Forest. The junior roster consists of Brett Mauro (Alpharetta, GA) and Raul Munoz (Mexico City, Mexico.) Lastly, the senior class consists of Michael Berger (Greensboro, N.C.), Andres Guzman (Guayaquil, Ecuador) and Johan Hansen (Ivasteras, Sweden.)

In the ACC, six out of the nine teams are ranked in the country. At No. 3 in the country is Duke University, Virginia ranks No. 20, at No. 29 is Clemson, Wake Forest ranks 41st in the country, at No. 45 is Florida State and finally at No. 63 is Georgia Tech. The match Sunday against Wake Forest is Florida State's first match in the ACC this year. Match time is scheduled for 2 p.m. on Sunday at the Scott Speicher Tennis Center.

**THE 46TH-RANKED SEMINOLE MEN'S TENNIS TEAM WINS THIRD MATCH OF THE WEEKEND AGAINST THE STETSON HATTERS BY A SCORE OF 6-1**  
Noles win five of six singles matches from Hatters

TALLAHASSEE, FL -- The 46th-ranked Florida State Seminole men's tennis team defeated the Stetson Hatters 6-1 in the second match of a doubleheader for the Noles on Sunday. The Seminoles defeated Southern Mississippi 4-3 earlier in the day.

The Seminoles again split the first two doubles matches in their second match of the day, both matches the Noles were able to pull out the third doubles match to gain the doubles point entering singles competition. Staked to a 1-0 lead after doubles, Florida State never looked back winning five consecutive singles matches before dropping the final match of the evening in three sets.

Junior Xavier Luscan continued to win at No. 1 singles defeating Stetson's Alexander Nicin in straight sets, 6-2, 6-4. Other straight set winners for FSU were junior Jay Travis at No. 3 and freshman Rodrigo Laub at No. 6. Laub played through a pulled stomach muscle to win his eighth consecutive match.

Sophomore Noah Schnell and senior Mike Ingham each went the distance in their matches before winning. For Schnell, it was the second time Sunday that his singles match went three sets. Last weekend, Schnell battled through cramps to win his singles matches and this weekend coach Hultquist didn't want to take any chances of that reoccurring so Hultquist rested Schnell during the doubles portion of the match against Stetson to keep him fresh for his singles match.

The two wins on Sunday and one on Friday give first-year head coach Dwayne Hultquist an 8-1 record heading into Sunday's match with in-state rival Miami on February 28th at 12:00 noon at the Scott Speicher Tennis Center in Tallahassee, Florida.

### FSU MEN'S TENNIS SEIZE THE MATCH AGAINST THE SOUTHERN MISSISSIPPI EAGLES BY A SCORE OF 4-3.

Xavier Luscan, Noah Schnell, and Jay Travis help the Noles clinch a victory against the Eagles in the first match of Sunday's doubleheader.

TALLAHASSEE, FL - The 46th-ranked Florida State Seminoles, with the help of Xavier Luscan, Noah Schnell and Jay Travis, secured a 4-3 victory over the Southern Mississippi Eagles on Sunday.

Starting the day off in doubles, the Noles captured the doubles point by winning two of the three matches. First, at No. 1 doubles, the team of Travis/Schnell was defeated by a score of 8-6 by the team of Kangas/Homedes. With the doubles portion of the match tied at 1-1, the Noles No. 2 team of Luscan/Laub clinch the match over Jansson/Werren by a score of 8-5. It was Luscan and Laub's fourth consecutive win. Securing the doubles point for FSU, the No. 3 team of Ingham/Mooney defeated Terol/Carteret by a score of 8-4. That win marked Ingham and Mooney's first win in the No. 3 slot this season.

The second half of the match started with No. 2 singles player Mike Ingham dropping his match to Muthias Werren. The loss was Ingham's first in his last four matches. and it also tied the match with FSU and USM each having one point. The next match to be completed was at No. 5 where FSU's Noah Schnell, who was one of only two players to take his match in split sets. With a final score of 0-6, 6-0, 6-2, Schnell defeated Nicolas Carteret of Southern Mississippi. Schnell's dual record at No. 5 has been upped to 3-1. The next match to finish, which brought the score to FSU 3 and USM 1, Xavier Luscan started the second set with a powerful serve-return and ended up defeating Mikka Kangus by a score of 6-3, 6-4. That win increases Luscan's winning streak to six.

Winning his first match at the No. 3 position and raising FSU's score to four, freshman Jay Travis clinched his match against sophomore David Jansson by a score of 6-5, 6-3. Junior Chad Mooney was defeated by the Southern Mississippi Eagle Daniel Homedes by a score of 7-6, 6-4. This was Mooney's first loss in the No. 4 position. That match raised USM's score to two making the score 4-2. The last singles match to be completed was at the No. 6 slot. This was the second of two matches to end in split sets. Sophomore Jeff Scarella dropped the match to freshman Uwe Gneiting by a score of 6-2, 2-6, 7-6.

On Friday, February 25, 2000 at 3:30 p.m. the Noles will take on Georgia State at the Scott Speicher Tennis Center.

THE 46TH RANKED FLORIDA STATE SEMINOLES DROP THE FLORIDA ATLANTIC UNIVERSITY OWLS BY A SCORE OF 4-3.

Mike Ingham and Rodrigo Laub help lead the Noles to a victory over FAU.

TALLAHASSEE, FL - Friday at Scott Speicher Tennis Center, the 46th-ranked Florida State Seminoles kicked off their second weekend of home matches in the month of February. The Noles took on the Florida Atlantic University Owls of Boca Raton, FL and dropped the Owl's record to 4-2.

Starting the afternoon off at No. 1 singles, 56th-ranked Xavier Luscan defeated Senior Juan Ros, of Murcia, Spain by a score of 6-1, 6-1 to raise Luscan's winning streak to five. Next at No. 2 singles, Jay Travis dropped a match that was closer than the score reflected to FAU's Daniel Dauber by a score of 6-1, 6-7, 6-4. Preceding Travis and Dauber at No. 2 singles, was England native Mike Ingham and Canada native Doug Devriendt at No. 3 singles. The 6-1, 2-6, 6-4 win for Ingham marked the 77th win of his career.

Chad Mooney played a tough match against Ludovic Pain at the No. 4 singles position. The win was Mooney's first at the No. 4 position as he defeated FAU's Pain by a score of 6-2, 6-4. Approaching the end of the singles portion of Friday's match against the Owls and the Noles, Noah Schnell and Sandro Spotti, both sophomores, played their match at the No. 5 position. This match ended in an unusual way, with the score 5-7, 4-6, 3-5 Schnell was forced to take a game-misconduct penalty that had carried over from the Travis/Dauber match.

Ending the singles portion of the match, Atlanta, Georgia native Rodrigo Laub carried out a hard-fought match against Fabio Faerman from Brazil. In the end, Laub increased his winning streak to seven as he pulled off the match by a score of 6-3, 2-6, 6-3.

In the doubles portion of the match against the Owls and the Noles, Schnell/Travis dropped the match to Dauber/Hur at the No. 1 position by a score of 8-6. This was the duo's first loss in their last three games together.

The second match of the doubles section occurred between FSU's Scarella/Ingham and FAU's Ros/Faerman. The Noles were defeated by the Owls, 8-4 giving Scarella and Ingham their first loss at the No. 2 position.

With the doubles point already in hand, FSU's tandem of Laub/Luscan dropped FAU's tandem of Devriendt/Pain by a score of 8-5. The win increased Laub and Luscan's winning streak to two, while increasing their No. 3 doubles record to 2-0.

### FLORIDA STATE MEN'S TENNIS TEAM COMPLETES DOUBLE HEADER WITH SECOND SWEEP

TALLAHASSEE, FL -- The 48th-ranked Florida State men's tennis team completed their Saturday doubleheader by posting their second sweep of the afternoon. The Seminoles won their fourth straight home match of the 2000 dual match season and improved their record to 5-1. Florida State started the day with a 7-0 win over the University of North Carolina-Asheville and completed the day with a 7-0 win over Jacksonville University. The men's team only lost one match in doubles and only lost two sets in singles all day Saturday.

Xavier Luscan improved his winning streak to four games by defeating junior Juan Cabrera 2-6, 6-3, 6-2 in No. 1 singles. Luscan is now 5-1 in the No. 1 spot this season. Mike Ingham won his 76th career match for Florida State by defeating Bram Tukker in No. 2 singles 3-6, 6-4, 6-2. Ingham's two wins Saturday improved his season record to 4-2. In No. 3 singles, Chad Mooney won in straight sets against Addams England 6-4, 6-3 to improve his overall record to 7-3.

Sophomore Noah Schnell, now 4-2 on the season, defeated Hart Pollack 6-1, 6-4 in the No. 4 slot. Junior Jay Travis rebounded from a slow start to the season by defeating Tom Freiburger 6-1, 6-1 in the No. 5 spot. Jeff Scarella completed the singles competition with a 6-0, 6-1 win in the No. 6 spot. That win evened Scarella's season record to 3-3.

The Seminoles only dropped one match all afternoon and that was in No. 1 doubles. Cabrera/England narrowly defeated Ingham/Scarella 9-8 but Florida State bounced back in the next two matches. Travis/Schnell defeated Pollack/Freiburger 8-5 in the No. 2 spot and Luscan/Mooney defeated Tukker/Martin 8-4 in the No. 3 doubles slot.

The Seminoles next match will be against Florida Atlantic Friday, February 18, at the Scott Speicher Tennis Center.

### FLORIDA STATE MEN'S TENNIS TEAM SWEEPS BY UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA-ASHEVILLE

TALLAHASSEE, FL -- The 48th-ranked Florida State men's tennis team won their third straight home match and improved their record to 4-1 on the 2000 dual match season. The Seminoles did not drop a set on their way to a 7-0 sweep of UNC-Asheville Saturday afternoon.

Senior Mike Ingham defeated Zach Malina 6-0, 6-0 in No. 2 singles to reach career victory number 75. Ingham's win improved his overall record to a mark of 8-6. Three Seminoles won their third straight match of the season Saturday. Junior Xavier Luscan extended his winning streak by defeating Drew Herman in No. 1 singles by a score of 6-0, 6-0. Luscan is now 4-1 in dual match play. Chad Mooney achieved his third straight win against freshman Mike Leffke 6-2, 6-3 in No. 3 singles and raised his record to 3-1 for the dual match season. In No. 4 singles, Noah Schnell defeated Junior Jakob Jez in two sets 6-1, 6-1. Schnell's streak has improved his record to 3-2 after getting off to a slow start.

Sophomore Jeff Scarella and freshman Joe Bassett completed the singles sweep. Scarella defeated freshman Stephen Poulos 6-4, 6-0 in No. 5 singles and improved his record to 10-6 overall. Bassett broke a three game losing streak by defeating junior John Rockwell in No. 6 singles 7-6 (1), 6-0.

In doubles play, Florida State only dropped three games on their way to three straight wins. Ingham/Scarella defeated Malina/Poulos 8-0 in the No. 1 spot. Schnell/Travis also won 8-0 against Jez/Leffke in the No. 2 slot. Mooney/Luscan rounded out the match with an 8-3 win against Herman/Leffke.

The Seminoles will complete the doubleheader today against the University of Jacksonville. The match will start at 2:00 pm and will take place at the Scott Speicher Tennis Center on the Florida State campus.

Mike Ingham, at the No. 2 slot, contended against William Guerin. In the end of the hard fought three sets, Guerin defeated Ingham by a score of 3-6,7-5,3-6. 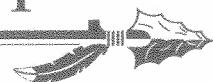

Senior Mike Ingham looks to lead young Seminoles in 2000

TALLAHASSEE, FL -- The Florida State Seminoles began the 2000 dual match season last weekend in Albuquerque, New Mexico against the 31st-ranked Lobos and the 16th-ranked Texas Christian Horned Frogs. The Eagles are led by senior Kendall Swartz and junior Ryan O'Keefe.

Friday's match against Georgia Southern was originally scheduled for 3:30 p.m. but was moved up to 2:00 p.m. to accommodate traveling plans. On Saturday, the Seminoles will hit the courts at 2:00 p.m. to face the Golden Knights of Central Florida.

Freshman Deni Franulovic dismisses Duke's Doug Root in three sets

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. -- The Florida State Seminoles first year head coach Dwayne Hultquist got a taste this weekend of what may be in store for the future of his Seminole men's tennis program. Freshman Deni Franulovic won his first two matches of the tournament to advance to face the country's 23rd-ranked player and the tournament's top seed, Duke's Doug Root in the round of 16. Franulovic won the match, a three-set thriller, to advance to the quarterfinals.

Sanchez and his teammate Frank Moser were the two finalists at this year's Region II Indoor Championships and therefore received automatic berths into February's Nationals.

Other top performances for the Seminoles this weekend included Mike Ingham's two-day run in the qualifying rounds where the senior won three singles matches and three doubles matches. Ingham went on to win his first round match in the main draw before losing in the second round to Sanchez. In doubles, Ingham and sophomore Jeff Scarella dropped their first round match against eventual tournament champions UVA's Croker and Winter.

Florida State will have some time off now to regroup and begin preparing for this spring's dual match season. The Seminoles will try to extend their consecutive winning season's mark to 14. The first chance to come and see the 2000 men's tennis team and new coaches Dwayne Hultquist (head) and John Roddick (assistant) will be on January 18th. The match against Stetson will be played at the Scott Speicher Tennis Center on the campus of Florida State University.

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. -- Five members of the Florida State men's tennis team are competing in the Region II Indoor Championships this weekend. The tournament consists of top players from around the south region. ACC teams Wake Forest, Duke, Georgia Tech, Clemson and Virginia are represented throughout the tournament's field.

FSU placed or qualified five members of its team, sophomore Jeff Scarella, senior Mike Ingham, junior Chad Mooney and freshmen Deni Franulovic and Rodrigo Laub in the prestigious tournament. The singles field is set at 64 and the doubles tournament consists of 32 teams. Qualifying matches were played Wednesday and Thursday of this week. Eight members of the singles competition and four teams in the doubles draw had to win three matches to qualify for the Championships. The other entrants were selected by the ITA's south region committee and seeded based on their ranking.

After winning three matches to qualify for the doubles main draw, the FSU duo of sophomore Jeff Scarella and senior Mike Ingham lost their opening round match of the Championship on Friday, to UVA's Croker and Winter 8-3. Also playing in the main draw for FSU was the freshmen combo of Deni Franulovic and Rodrigo Laub. Franulovic and Laub lost to Elon's Navawengse and Nagle 8-3. The top seed in the doubles draw, Clemson's Knight and Goffi, advanced to the second round where they will face Wake Forest's Hanson and Mauro. Three of the top four seeds advanced to the second round. Only East Tennessee State's Gomez and Fernandez, the three seed, lost in the opening round.

Two Seminoles were selected to play in the singles portion and one Seminole made the main draw through the qualifying rounds. Franulovic won his first round match against North Carolina-Wilmington's James Collieson in three sets. Franulovic will face Joao Leite from Winthrop on Saturday. Mooney automatically qualified to the tournament's main draw as well, but Mooney dropped his opening round match to Old Dominion's Patrick Boza, 6-3, 6-4. Ingham played three singles matches and three doubles matches in two days to qualify for both the singles and doubles main draw. With his doubles tournament over after a first round loss earlier in the day, Ingham rallied to win his singles match, 6-4, 5-7, 6-4. Ingham will play VCU's Jose Sanchez on Saturday in the second round.

After three days of competition the Seminoles have two singles players still alive. Franulovic and Ingham will look to move further into the field when play begins Saturday at the Cone-Kenfield Tennis Center on the campus of North Carolina.

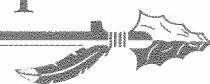

This year's tournament in Chapel Hill marks the eighth consecutive year that UNC has hosted the event.

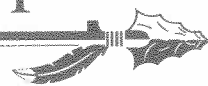

### 1999 SEMINOLE FALL CLASSIC FINISHES UP ON SUNDAY

Middle Tennessee State takes home three titles

TALLAHASSEE, FL. -- The Florida State men's tennis program hosted the annual Seminole Fall Classic this past weekend. Seven schools from around the southeast region participated in the three day event with the finals for all draws played on Sunday. The big winner of the day was Middle Tennessee State, which saw two of its team members win their respective flight's singles back draw championships and a doubles team win the 1999 Seminole Fall Classic doubles title.

First, in the Flight "A" back draw, Middle Tennessee State's Daniel Klementz defeated Auburn's Raitis Tukans, 6-4, 6-3 to claim the title. Klementz was one of the top eight seeds in the tournament, but suffered a first round loss to Florida Atlantic's Ben Cooper. Middle Tennessee State was also represented in the Flight "B" back draw championship. Michael Chamberlain beat Valdosta State's Mike Suggs in the finals in three sets, 6-1, 6-7, 6-1.

In the Flight "A" main draw, the championship match was between unseeded Nicolai Sablowski from Valdosta State and seeded Juan Ros of Florida Atlantic. Ros had not lost a set entering the finals but dropped the first set 7-6, 7-4 in the tiebreaker. Sablowski capitalized on the momentum from the first set and finished out the match 6-4 in the second set.

In the Flight "B" main draw, Florida Atlantic's Sandro Spotti claimed the title when teammate Fabio Faerman retired down 5-1 in the first set.

The doubles portion of the tournament also saw a Middle Tennessee State winner. MTSU's Olle Nystrom and Oliver Foreman won the tournament doubles championship Sunday by defeating two teams from FAU. First, in the semifinals the MTSU duo won 8-6 against Florida Atlantic's Spotti and Ros and then in the finals Nystrom and Foreman downed Florida Atlantic's Ben Cooper and Doug Deurient 9-7.

In the double's back draw, the team of Nicolai Sablowski and Rasmus Larsen from Valdosta State ran through the tournament without a loss after their first round defeat. Larsen and Sablowski defeated Mark Kovacs and Tukans from Auburn in the finals 8-5.

FSU did not have anyone play on finals Sunday, but the Seminoles were well represented throughout the tournament by a young team. Freshmen Deni Franulovic, Rodrigo Laub and Joe Bassett played well in their first matches at the Scott Speicher Tennis Center. Franulovic and Laub advanced to the quarterfinals of the doubles draw before losing a hard-fought match to eventual finalists Auburn's Cooper and Deurient 9-7. In singles, Franulovic and Laub each won their first round matches in the tournament's top flight, Flight "A". Franulovic advanced to the quarterfinals before losing to Auburn's Estevom Strecker 6-4, 6-4. FSU's Bassett advanced all the way to the semifinals of the Flight "B" draw. Each of Bassett's two tournament wins went the full three sets.

Other notables for the Seminoles included sophomores Noah Schnell and Jeff Scarella. The two won their first round doubles match together and each of them won their first round singles match on Friday. Senior Mike Ingham rebounded from a first round upset to win his next match in the consolation bracket against Florida Atlantic's Deurient in straight sets 6-2, 6-2.

The Florida State men's tennis team will be in action again in three weeks at the ITA Rolex in Chapel Hill, N.C., November 11-14.

Tennis team's first outing under new head coach Dwayne Hultquist

TALLAHASSEE, FL. -- The Florida State men's tennis team will play their first matches under new head coach Dwayne Hultquist this weekend at the Southern Collegiates in Athens, Ga. Competition begins Thursday and concludes Sunday, October 10th.

Hultquist came to FSU from the University of Texas, where he served as assistant men's tennis coach for eight years. The 1999-2000 Hultquist edition of the Florida State men's tennis team consists of four freshmen, two sophomores, two juniors, and a senior.

Lone senior, Mike Ingham, will only be competing in the doubles portion of the tournament this weekend. Ingham, who has 36 career doubles wins, will be paired with junior Chad Mooney where they will be competing in the doubles A Division and will face Kentucky's Grunditz and Pousette on Thursday. If Ingham and Mooney win their first round match they will face the tournament's seventh seeds, Charleston Southern's Reddy and Villaroci, in the second round.

Other FSU doubles teams include sophomores Jeff Scarella and Noah Schnell, who were 1-3 together last year, junior Jay Travis and freshman Deni Franulovic, and the debut of a freshmen pair Rodrigo Laub and Oren Belliti. Belliti and Laub received a bye into the second round of the Division C bracket and will play on Friday. In the singles portion of the tournament, FSU's highest seed amongst the varying flights came in the Division II singles draw where Franulovic was seeded fourth in the upper half of the draw.
