GREENSBORO, N.C. - Four Wake Forest players head up the 12 member 2002 Atlantic Coast Conference Men's Tennis All-Conference Team, as selected by a vote of the league's nine head coaches. Also among the honorees are three players from North Carolina, two from Duke and one from Florida State, Georgia Tech and Maryland.

For the first time since 1991, the Duke Blue Devils have garnered ACC Men's Tennis Player of the Year honors. Phillip King, last year's ACC Rookle of the Year, finished the ACC regular-season with a 7-0 mark at the No. 1 singles slot for the Blue Devils. The Long Beach, Calif., native is currently No. 12 in the latest ITA rankings and has a 18-5 dual match record this season.

This year's ACC Rookie of the Year is Wake Forest's Derrick Spice who in his first season as a Demon Deacon finished the ACC regular-season with a 6-1 record at No. 3 singles and was 6-1 at No. 2 doubles with partner Mike Murray. The North Olmsted, Ohio, native has a Wake Forest single-season school record 36 wins in his first year as a Deacon. Spice is also the first Demon Deacon to garner ACC Men's Tennis Rookie of the Year honors.

North Carolina's Sam Paul was named ACC Coach of the Year, his third such honor. Paul led the Tar Heels to their first ACC Title since 1992 This season his team has recorded a 19-5 overall record, including a 7-1 mark in conference play.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – The Florida State men's tennis team lost a hard fought battle to the 19th ranked Demon Deacons of Wake Forest Saturday afternoon. FLORIDA STATE'S LUSCAN AND JURD TO PLAY IN ITA MEN'S ALL-AMERICAN TENNIS CHAMPIONSHIPS

STONE MOUNTAIN, Ga. – Florida State's Xavier Luscan and Romain Jurd will compete Tuesday, Oct. 9 in the first round of the Intercollegiate Tennis Association Men's All-American Championships at the Lincoln Tennis Center. The event is the first national singles and doubles championships of the 2001-02 season and is one of three national collegiate tennis championships of the season. With 360 players having competed in the singles draw, this is the largest collegiate tennis tournament in the nation.

Luscan, who is seeded 14th in the event, faces Zoltan Papp of Baylor in Tuesday first round. Luscan received an automatic bid into the tournament based on his ITA national ranking.

Luscan, a senior, was named to the All-ACC men's tennis team and named the Seminoles MVP in 2001. He enjoyed an outstanding record of 7-1 against ACC opponents at the No. 1 single position and was 12-9 in doubles action.

Jurd, a sophomore, advanced to the qualifying tournament that takes place Tuesday and Wednesday. He must win two matches to reach the main draw of the tournament that is scheduled for Oct. 11-14. Jurd faces third-seeded Mariano Pettigrosso of Arkansas Little-Rock in Tuesday's first round.

Jurd, a native of Paris, France, qualified for the tournament after competing in the 256-player pre-qualifying tournament this ast weekend at the Lincoln Tennis Center. Due to two late withdrawals in the qualifying tournament, he was added to Tuesday's main draw. He won three of his four matches during pre-qualifying play.

Jurd, who was named to the ACC Academic honor roll as a freshman, was 4-4 while playing at the No. 2 singles position and 1-0 in the No. 2 doubles position.

The Seminole men's tennis team finished the 2000-01 season ranked No. 59 in the nation and plays host to the Seminole Fall Classic, Sept. 19-21 at the Scott Speicher Tennis Center. Admission is free.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—The Florida State Seminoles will open their fall season this weekend as they travel to Athens, Ga. to compete in the Southern Collegiate Championship being held at the Dan Magill Tennis Complex Sept. 21-24. Georgia will welcome over 200 student-athletes representing 43 schools throughout the southeast. The field will consist of four singles flights and three doubles flights.

As Dwayne Hultquist enters his third season as the head coach of the Florida State men's tennis team, his optimism for the program continues to grow.
