FSU Tennis Makes Strong Statement On Day One Of All-American Qualifying Tournament

Seminole Jonathas Sucupira upsets third-seeded opponent

TULSA, Okla. - The Florida State men's tennis team gave a spectacular showing on day one of the Polo Ralph Lauren All-American Tennis Championships qualifying tournament, going 4-1 in singles action including an upset bid by one Seminole.

"I cannot express how well our guys did today," said head coach <u>Dwayne Hultquist</u>. "We had one of the best showings of any school in the country and we hope to continue this kind of effort throughout the week."

The Polo Ralph Lauren All-American Tennis Championships offer the first national singles and doubles titles of the 2005-06 collegiate tennis season, and are followed by the ITA National Intercollegiate Indoor Championships in November and the season-ending NCAA Championships in May.

The Polo Ralph Lauren All-American Tennis Championships include 128-player and 64-doubles team qualifying tournaments this week (Oct. 3-5), which feed into the 64-player, 32-doubles team main draw which takes place Oct. 6-9.

Florida State junior <u>Jonathas Sucupira</u> (Sao Paulo, Brazil) provided the first upset of the day and eliminated third-seeded and 48th-ranked Chris Biro of Arizona State, 6-4, 6-0. He will face Missouri State's Jiri Spousta tomorrow in the Round of 64.

"Jonathas played excellent," said Hultquist, "and his upset bid against Biro was a testament that he can compete with anyone in the country."

Freshman <u>Maciek Sykut</u>, a native of Marathon, Fla., also proved why he is one of the top rookies in the country after he defeated Eric Claesson (Ole Miss), 6-4, 6-2. He will battle Louisville's Jeremy Clark in the next round.

"Maciek is such a great kid and person to be around," said Hultquist. "I said all along that he will be one of the best players to ever go through Florida State. It will be a joy to watch him grow and develop over the years."

Florida State sophomore <u>Sam Chang</u> (Young-Ming, Taiwan) and junior <u>Ytai Abougzir</u> (Boca Raton, Fla.) also earned wins in singles action today. Chang beat Miron Mann of Utah, 6-3, 6-4, and he will match-up with ACC foe Brad Pomeroy of North Carolina in the next round. Abougzir will compete against Virginia's Treat Henry after he toppled St. Mary's Julien Tizot (6-2, 6-2) today.

The lone FSU loss of the day fell at the hands of senior <u>Chris Westerhof</u> (Durbin, South Africa) who came up short to Wisconsin's Jeremy Sondin, 6-4, 6-2.

FSU Men's Tennis Goes 6-0 On Day Two Of All-American Championships

TULSA, Okla. - The Florida State men's tennis squad contributed another solid performance Tuesday at the Polo Ralph Lauren All-American Tennis Championships qualifying tournament by gathering a perfect 4-0 record in singles action and a 2-0 mark in doubles play.

"Our team had several significant victories today," said head coach <u>Dwayne Hultquist</u>. "All of the players competing here are at least in the Top 100 in the country, so every win counts. I am really pleased with our effort."

"Chang's victory against Pomeroy was probably the biggest victory of his college career," added Hultquist. "All four wins today were very good for our program and hopefully we can carry the momentum into tomorrow."

In the doubles draw, the Chang/Sucupira duo opened men's doubles with an 8-4 victory over Arnar Sigurdsson and Jorden Vestli of Pacific. Sykut and Seminole partner <u>Andrew Bailey</u> also won in doubles by unending Willy Lock and Christian Tempke of Northwestern, 8-3.

Tulsa, Okla. - Florida State freshman doubles tandem, <u>Andrew Bailey</u> and <u>Maciek Sykut</u>, advanced to the quarterfinals and main draw of the Polo Ralph Lauren All-American Tennis Championships on Wednesday at the Michael D. Case Tennis Center on the Tulsa University campus after overpowering Erick Molner and Chad Tsuda (Colo.), 8-6.

The Seminoles also found three victories in the final qualifying singles round of 16 as junior <u>Jonathas Sucupira</u> upset 32nd-seeded Alex Schwizer of Auburn, 7-6(3), 6-4, and Sykut defeated Kai Schledorn (MTSU), 6-3, 4-6, 6-1. Florida State sophomore <u>Sam Chang</u> was back to his winning ways as he beat TCU's Rafael Abreu, 7-6(2), 4-6, 6-3. Each of them will compete in the main draw beginning Thursday.

In doubles action, junior <u>Ytai Abougzir</u> and doubles partner <u>Chris Westerhof</u> were eliminated, 8-6, by Monte Tucker and Marc Spiciiaric of Illinois. Abougzir also fell in singles play to Treat Huey of Virginia, 1-6, 2-6.

Junior <u>Ytai Abougzir</u> and sophomore <u>Sam Chang</u> will compete Friday, facing Duke's Jonathan Stokke and Michigan's Ryan Heller.

Chang, who reached the main draw by winning three matches in the qualifying draw earlier in the week, defeated LSU's Mark Grocott, 6-4, 7-6(8) in the first round of the consolation draw.

Two other Seminoles were in the main draw, but lost in the first round and then in the consolation draw. Junior <u>Jonathas Sucupira</u> fell to Marek Valicka of Oklahoma, 6-1, 2-6, 6-1, and freshman <u>Maciek Sykut</u> came up short to Duke's Joey Atas, 6-3, 3-6, 6-2.

Despite rushing through the qualifying round with two victories, the doubles tandem of Sykut and freshman <u>Andrew Bailey</u> saw their main draw run come to an end with an 8-5 loss to Georgia's Colin Purcell and Strahinja Bobusic.
