George Tops U-M Scoring With 2 Wins

The University of Miami track and field team Saturday made a runaway of its dual meet with Florida State university on the new Hurricane cinder track. Miami won, 92 to 34.

Pacing the Hurrlcanes in their first home meet of the year were Charley George, a former Miami High star, Dave Stevens, Walter Mensching, Sam Tillman, Al Goch and Bob Clayton.

Between them, the six men rolled up 50 points. George was the leading scorer of the day with a pair of firsts. Charley captured the discus throw and the shot put for a total of 10 points, while Stevens, Mensching, Tillman, Goch and Clayton all deadlocked for second high individual honors, each racking up eight points.

TWO DEAD HEATS.

Tillman and Clayton dominated the sprint events, each capturing a first and a second. Tillman won the 100-year dash in 10 flat and was followed across the finishing line by Clayton. However, in the 220, the order was reversed. There were two deadheats for first in the distance runs. Stevens and Mensching crossed the finish line at the same time in both the mile and two-mile runs.

Florida State annexed only three firsts with 13 points. George Grosshopf captured the half mile run, while Jim Lohmeyer won the high jump and John Tombelson the broad jump.

The meet was staged in a heavy
