

GAINESVILLE, April 17 (AP)—Tennis records fell as the University of Florida successfully defended its Florida AAU track championship here today.

The Florida Gators rolled up 84½ points to 53 for the Florida State University Seminoles from Tallahassee, knocking down seven records. FSU set two, while an unattached athlete set the other.

Florida's Earl Poucher bettered his own record in the pole vault at 13 feet, 10 inches. He defeated his brother and tutor, LeRoy Poucher, a former University of Florida star.

The younger Poucher's vault was 1½ inches better than his record of last year, and 10 inches better than his brother today.

Two Gators led individual scoring with 10 points each.

Archie Vickers set a new record in the broad jump at 22 feet, 11 inches; placed second in the 100-yard dash, and third in the 220-yard low hurdles.

Bumper Watson won the 100 and 220-yard dashes, setting a new record of :22.0 in the 220, and tying the record of :09.9 in the 100.

Other Gators who set records were Bill Adams in the mile run 4:23.6; Don Gagnon in the two mile run 9:57.8; James Smith in the 220-yard low hurdles :24.8.

FSU's record setters were Lawrence Hountha in the 80-yard run 1:58 and James Casteel in the 440-yard run :49.5.

Robert Allison, competing unattached, won the javelin with a record throw of 210 feet 10 inches.
