

Already touted as the greatest track team in Florida State history, Coach Mike Long's current Seminole edition left no doubts as the Seminoles buried the University of Miami, 88-41, here last night.

Some 1,000 track fans turned out to watch the Florida Relays champions close out their dual

campaign. They weren't disappointed.

The Seminoles rewrote eight records and dented two others in finishing their first undefeated dual track season in the school's 10-year track background.

Drawing the biggest attention, perhaps, was Pensacola senior Jerry Henderson, the javelin standout who has been bettering his own school record nearly everytime he throws the spear.

Last night he threw the javelin 227 feet, 8 inches, more than 10 feet beyond his previous record set only last week in the Penn Relays.

Heavily favored over Miami and with the Florida AAU track and field championships up at Gainesville tomorrow, many thought the Seminoles might operate under wraps last night. But with five seniors making their final home appearance, the Seminoles caught record fever with the opening event. It turned out to be the grandest one-night assault ever on an FSU record book.

Senior Mike Conley of Gainesville started it by nearly lapping the field for a 4:14.28 mile run that erased both his own school record and the track record. It was the fastest mile among many good ones turned in by Conley.

Jim Casteel of Avondale Estates, Ga., kept it going with a school and track record 440 yard run of 48.5 seconds. The versatile sophomore, who won three of FSU's 12 first places last night, came back later to set a school record with a 13.6 clocking in the low hurdles.

Then there was Jack Terwilliger, the senior sprinter from Dade City, who ran the fastest 100-yard dash of his career. Terwilliger tied the long-standing school record held by John Brown in the 100-yard dash when he posted the 10.2 seconds. He also tied the track record previously held by Brown in the 100-yard dash.

A few moments later, Terwilliger broke the 100 in 9.7 seconds, FSU's new track record.
