

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — The big pole vault battle in the Mason-Dixon Games indoor track meet failed to materialize here Saturday when Miami's John Uelses, the only man in history to vault 16 feet, didn't clear 14 feet on three tries.

The Marine Lance Corporal was eliminated in the early going. John Rose of Arizona State won the vault with a 15-4 height.

The big performance was Hayes Jones, 8 seconds flat in the 70-yard high hurdles which clipped two-tenths seconds off the American indoor record he held jointly with Lee Calhoun.

FSU's Quentin Till was second in the 600-yard run. Till was among a small contingent of the Seminoles which entered the meet.
