

GREENVILLE, S. C.—Florida State's track team, spurred by two record-shattering performances, emerged as victor once more in the Piedmont Relays here Saturday.

It was the fourth straight victory for the Seminoles in the 5-year-old meet. FSU piled up 81 points to 76 for second place Furman, 51½ for The Citadel, 39½ for Clemson. The other seven entries were further down the line.

Ed Hayes, FSU pole vaulter, set a new meet and school record, clearing 14-2¼. Bill Trotty tied for second and Frank Ford was fourth in the same event.

The mile relay team also set a new meet record of 3:19.3. Members of this unit were Craig Johnson, Terry Long, Bill Davis and Quentin Till.

The distance medley relay unit of Jack Bracksmith, Leon Smith, Bill Davis and Dick Roberts was another winner, in 10:42.4.

The 440, sprint medley and 2-mile relay foursomes finished

second.

The Seminoles' strong weightman Jeff Clark won both discus and shot events, the former with a 146-6 heave, the latter with a 51-6½ effort. FSU's Al Williams finished second in both. Barry Topper was fourth in the shot.

George Smith finished in a 2-way tie for second in the high jump. Mike O'Brien was in a 6-way tie for fourth in the same event.

Johnson was fourth in the 100.
