White broke an FSU school record in the 100 - yard dasis as the Seminoles defeated South Caroline \$5 - 60 here yesterday.

White, a junior from Pensacola, zipped home in 9.5, onetenth of a second better than the old FSU mark of 9.6, held jointly by two people since 1962.

Florida State, undefeated now in 12 straight dual meets, won 11 out of 17 events. The Seminoles wind up their dual season with rival Florida here Saturday night at 7.

In addition to White's record breaking sprint, the usual excellent performance by FSU co-captain Jerry McDaniel paced the Seminoles. McDaniel won his two specialties, the 220 and 440, anchored the winning 440 relay, and almost brought home the baton in the mile relay.

Taking the stick seven yards back, McDaniel ran a 46.8 anchor leg, but was beaten out by inches.

Ross Winter also set a school record in the 880, though finishing second to South Carolina's Bob Crombie. Winter's time was 1:54.0.

In an unexpected show of strength the Seminoles finished 1-2 in both the mile and two mile runs. Irv Watson and Bill Nelson did the trick in the mile with a time of 4:27.7. Tom Graham won the two mile with

Watson second. Graham's time was 9:57.0.

Floyd Lorenz was the only double winner besides McDaniel. The versatile senior won the high hurdles in a time of 14.8, then cleared the bar at 6'4" to take the high jump.

Steve Landis won the 330 intermediate hurdles in 38.6.

The 440 relay team of McDaniel, Bob Sable, Al Cato, and White, took first with a 41,6 time.

In the field events, Sid Gainay won the broad jump in 28'7", and Don Casteel won the triple jump with a 45'6" leap:
