was a 13'6" pole vault by  
freshman vaulter Fletcher  
Sims, who was vaulting for  
his hometown family in Chat-  
tanooga.

1 The Seminole trackmen will  
compete next in the big Jesuit  
Invitational Track Meet in  
Tampa, next Saturday. The  
opponents there will be Flori-  
da, Miami and Florida A&M  
in both varsity and freshman  
divisions.
