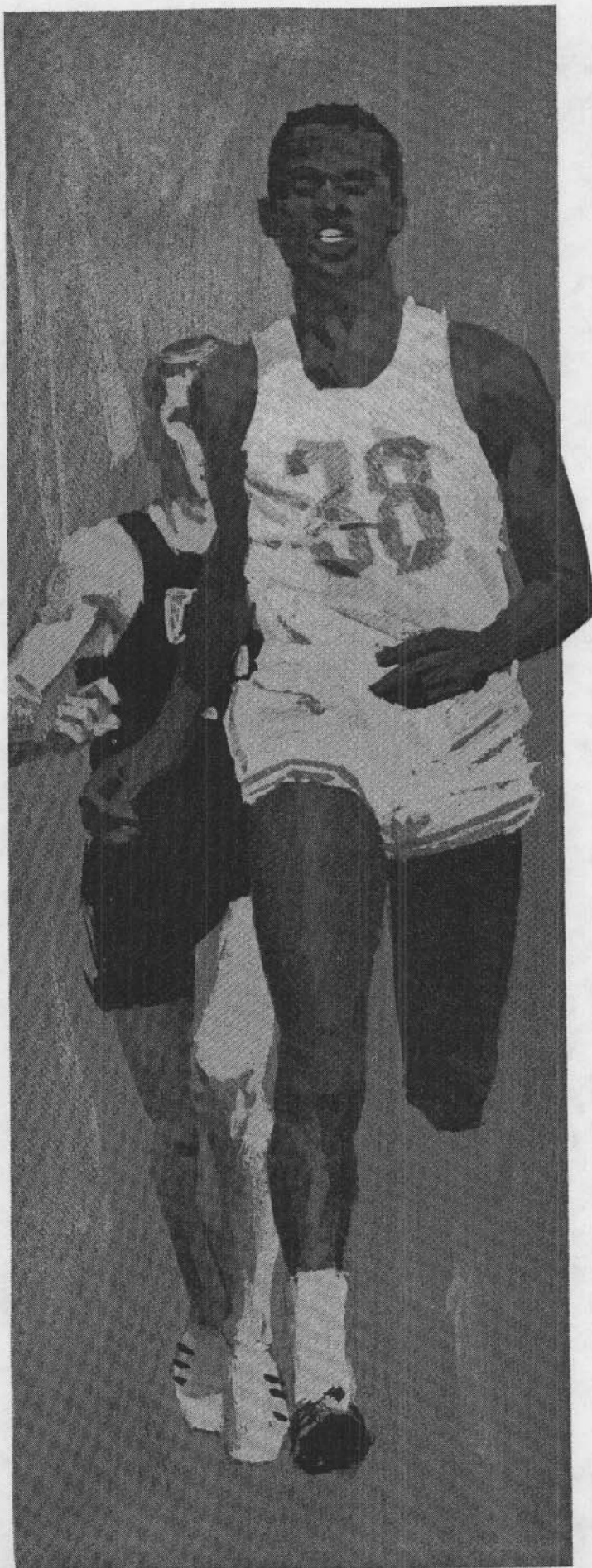

BERKELEY, Calif. — Florida State's Mike Kelly finished fifth in the final of the 120-yard high hurdles at the NCAA Track Championships Friday night.

Kelly, a junior trackster, ran the distance in 13.8 seconds, four tenths of a second behind the winner, Earl McCullouch of Southern Cal.

"I was delighted with his performance," said Seminole track coach Mike Long. "He competed very well . . . one of the better finishes we've had in national competition."

This was the second trip to the nationals for Kelly who reports to Air Force ROTC summer camp on Sunday. His run Friday night broke the school record of 14 flat which he set.

McCullouch's time of 13.4 tied the NCAA mark for the 120-yard distance which was run into a two mph wind. Irving Hall of Villanova was second and Mike Butler of Wisconsin third.
