Florida State's track team was an easy winner over a young Florida A&M squad Saturday, as the Seminoles captured the first dual meeting between the two schools, 106½-38½, on the FSU track.

The Seminoles were paced in their big win by senior co-captain Mike Kelly, who won the high hurdles and the high jump, placed second in the 440 intermediate hurdles and ran a leg on the Seminoles' winning mile relay team.

In the field events, the big winner was Phil Parker, who captured the long and triple jumps, and set a new school—record in the latter with a leap of 49 1/4".

The Rattlers were paced by sprinter Maurice Davis who captured the 100 and 220-yard dashes. He also ran a leg of the victorious 440-yard relay.

FAMU's other winners were
Otis Hill_in_the 440-yd._dash_
and James Schoolfield in the
440 hurdles.

In addition to Kelly and Parker, the Seminoles had a double winner in Ken Misner who copped the mile and two mile events.

Misner a strong distance runner for the Tribe, won both events easily. His time in the mile was 4:18.6. He showed a 9:25.8 effort in the two-mile, and had lapped the last three men in that event.

Kelly and Schoolfield were battling head to head in the 440-hurdle event most of the way, but the Seminole runner lost his stride as he approached the final barrier and Schoolfield pulled away an easy winner.

A strong wind was blowing up the home straight and as a result Davis' times for the two dash events were noticeably affected. He was clocked in 10.0 in the 100 and 22.0 for the 220.

FAMU's Richard Corbett placed second in both of the sprints, with FSU's Andy Chrythird.

The half-mile victory went to Bob Thomas of the Seminoles in 1:56.2, with FSU's Joe Law second. FAMU's Ken Robinson and FSU's Sandy Garland tied for third.

Florida State piled up points in the field events where the Rattlers are weakest.

The Seminoles swept the first three places in the shot, discus, javelin and long jump.

They captured first and second in the triple jump and a first in the pole yault.

Next week the Seminoles will travel to Montgomery, Ala., for the annual Coliseum Relays, always one of the top indoor meets in the South.
