JEROME LIEBENBERG, Western Michigan, 3,000 meter steeplechase:

"I was a little disappointed with my time today (8:58.6). I had hoped to run faster today—I wanted to get in a better workout with the finals not coming up until Saturday. Now I'll go out and do some speed work to get the rest of my workout and some speed work. I'll probably run several 100's and 220's—if they don't kick me off the track."

On his time in qualifying, he said, "That is my slowest time of the year." He had an 8:45 at the Dogwood Relays (Tennessee) this spring for his best effort of the season so far.

What will it take to win here Saturday? "With Silvius (Ken of Eastern Kentucky) Sink (Sid of Bowling Green), Johnson (Jim of Washington), and Kelley (Steve of Indiana) in it I'd guess about 8:40 if it is a good race."

Making reference to the steeplechase layout here and his general dislike for the water jump, he said, "It was great except for the water jump. It is on an angle here—a different setup—you're going forward and then have to change your momentum and make a sharp left turn coming out of the water."

This is the second year he has been running the event—became interested through association with Mike Manly (AAU steeplechase champion). Both had same high school coach. "The race is a real challenge—it is not a race everyone can run. I like it."

REGGIE ROBINSON, UCLA (Talking with Reggie on missed handoff in the 440 prelims).

"What happened is that Welch (Ronnie) pulled a muscle and just didn't quite get the baton to me. When I got into the passing zone I knew something was wrong and I slowed down and looked back. The baton hit me right here (as he pointed to heel of hand). I just never got a grip on it."

How might UCLA go about getting the lost points back? "We'll have to get them back in the 100. We had figured on three or four points in the 100, now we've got to get six or eight."

TOM HILL, ARKANSAS STATE (Junior who last week tied world record of 13.2 in the highs).

"Yes, I felt good today. I ran all out—everything I had. I try not to loaf—that is bad. You can run all out and look smooth. I didn't like that false start though. That's the thing that happened to me last year."

On the technical aspects of his race, he says, "The second half of the race is mine now. I've got to get the first half down—the start. Today I blew it on the last one (hurdle), too. Don't know what I was thinking about when I hit it. That and the start might have knocked the time off (he had a :13.5). I've got to look at all of them," he said when asked about who the guy to beat. "You have to run your race all the way."

As a high schooler, he was a high and long jumper. "It was my coach's idea to change. It didn't make any difference to me—I wanted a college education and if I had to hurdle to get it, I'd hurdle. When I first tried it, it didn't feel so good—if you could see my knees, you'd see I didn't feel right." His first race was a 15.2, but he got down to 14.2 as a freshman, 13.6 as a sophomore, and 13.2 now. He was fifth in NCAA last year (though sitting in blocks, because of false start) he ran 13.7. (13.6 to qualify)

On his 13.2 at Wichita at the National Federation meet, he said, "I felt fast at Wichita, but didn't think that I was that fast—heck, I couldn't even think that fast."

On his nickname of "Super Chicken" he laughs, "I guess they hung that on me because I'm so skinny."

Does he think 12.9 is possible? "I didn't think 13.2 was for me. There is no telling what might be run."

MEL GRAY, MISSOURI SPRINTER (commenting on his recent decision to compete in the NCAA meet):

"I decided to compete when I was selected to go on the tour of Viet Nam. The tour prevents me from working this summer so I decided to take up the time running. We leave on a 17-day tour of Viet Nam on June 29. I am getting married August 8 and after that I'll start practicing for the football season. My race wasn't bad but you can't run in lane 8. I feel like I'm being boxed in. I feel poor now but I'll be better tomorrow. The 100 is my best event right now. Jackson and Hart look like they will be a lot of competition. I like this track. I ran 9.2 here earlier in the season."

ISAAC CURTIS, UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA sprinter:

My leg felt real good today---I've been bothered all season long by a bad hamstring strain but it didn't hurt today." He was busy with a :09.4 100, :20.8 220 and a leg on the 440 relay. He and teammate Eddie Hart have battled all season long in the sprints and are "about even for the year." He prefers the 100, but prior to this season was a high hurdler, with a prep best of :14.0. Expects a tough 100 semi---"there's a lot of good runners in there, it could be anybody's race."

MARK WINZENRIED, WISCONSIN 880-yard runner:

"I'm in good shape. I was relaxed and loose. The preliminaries went like I expected. I thought it would be about 1:50. Three to five guys in this event are evenly matched, such as Sandison, Swenson and Collins. The field is wide open this year. I am looking forward to the AAU meet next week. I am hoping to get some confidence this week."

Commenting on his racing tactics: "At the Compton meet I ran in front to get a qualifying time for this meet but that doesn't mean I'm a front runner again. My tactics will depend upon the competition."

KEN SWENSON, HALF-MILER FROM KANSAS STATE:

"I didn't feel too good today. I haven't worked a lot lately. I did feel better the last part of the race, but didn't have much spring in my legs. It will be worse tomorrow."

On time it took to qualify this year---"Thank heavens it was not as fast as last year. I don't think anybody wanted to go that fast again---course, there are not as many quality half-milers this year, I don't think. We're all about 1:48. I ran more outside today than I like to, but in these preliminaries you just have to make sure that you qualify, no matter where you run."

I had figured I'd have to run about 1:50 to qualify and it was apparent that is about what it would take after that 54 first quarter. Tomorrow will be a different story though. Some will depend upon the heat, but it will probably take a 48 or a high 47 to make the finals." What does he think he is ready to run? "We'll just have to wait and see. I don't cut anybody short. When you get this far, everyone is good."

BRIAN McELROY, HALF-MILER FROM KANSAS:

"I figured it would take about a 1:50 to qualify and that is what I was sure I'd have to hit. I felt real good."

McElroy probably had an easier time qualifying than he did getting here. He was driving up (he has a Mercedes) so he could go from Des Moines home. But, just outside of Kansas City, his car threw a rod, he had to be towed back to K-C and then conned the tow-truck man into taking him back out to the interstate, where he started thumbing a ride. "I didn't really know where I was and some old guy picked me up. I told him I wanted to go to Des Moines and he said he'd get me onto the road to here. He let me out on an old country road - it was muddy and I was just out in the middle of cornfields. I waited around for about 45 minutes then flagged down an old lady and asked where I was and how to get to Des Moines. She told me how to get back to the interstate and I started

walking. It is kinda funny now, but I ended up taking off my shoes to finish the walk. When I got back to the interstate I got a ride right away and ended up coming the last 150 miles with a guy from Des Moines. When I got here, he bought me a steak dinner. One thing--it got my mind off the race.

It's really been difficult to get used to losing on the collegiate level. In high school I could run a lousy race and maybe still win, and run a good race and look like a million bucks.

The second outdoor meet this spring, I ran a 1:48.1 leg in the two-mile and got third.. it was a real shock. Now, on a bad day, I look like I'm running backwards."

Is track more "work" now than when he was one of the most sought-after preps in the nation? "At first I wasn't happy at all...now that I've met a few guys on the road and become adjusted to the competition, it's becoming fun again."

## MIKE GOODRICH, INDIANA SPRINTER

"That 20.8 was my fastest time this year but I ran 20.6 last year. The time was okay because I was running very easy. I ran to qualify but the semi-finals will be tougher both in the 100 and 220. I think I have a better chance in the 220 because of the endurance work I've had. I ran some cross country last fall and it could help. I also ran some legs on the mile relay and I was the Big Ten 300-yard dash champion indoors. I missed last year's meet because of an attack of appendicitis. I'd like to make up for it this year. This is my last meet of the year. I have to go home to work.

UCIA MILE RELAY TEAM - which went 3:07.2 (Bob Langston, John Smith, Brad Lyman, Wayne Collett).

LANGSTON: "We hoped that it might take a slower time, but our objective was to give Wayne the lead. I wanted to be sure that John had a lead, too, because he'd just run in the fast heat of the quarter and we hoped Brad would give Wayne the baton in first so he could take it a little easier and we'd qualify."

On chances for title: "It is still going to be hard," said Langston. "What has been put down on paper doesn't mean much. In reality it is quite different."

LYMAN: "Things have got to start going our way now--we had the dropped baton in the 440 and then John gets in the fast 440 heat, have problems in the 100, lose Vaughn in the pole vault, something has to go our way, too."

LANGSTON: "Yea, but we aren't the only ones having problems. Look at UTEP and what happened to all the sprinters. I do think that what has happened has given us a little more incentive."

SMITH: "I know it has given me more drive. We're still in contention. If those of us who are left go out and do our max, we should win."

LYMAN: "I can never give Wayne as much of a lead as I want. One thing about it. Tomorrow we go all out. The relay is the last thing and we go all out--no need to conserve anything. We'd like to get close to last year's team record (3:03.4). John and Wayne were on that one."

COLLETT: "I couldn't have been happier with what the first three runners did--I was in first place and I couldn't ask for more. I think I'm in better condition than last year. I'm a lot stronger and have a lot more experience."

On UCLA's chances to win the meet: "An awful lot of things will have to go our way. Right now, the way I see it, California is the team to beat. That 18 in the sprint will be hard to overcome."

JORMA VESALA, (23-year-old junior at Los Angeles State--native of Finland--leads the DECATHLON with 3881 points after 5 events)

"I had a pretty good day, I'm 40 or 50 points above my previous best first-day total. This is the first year I've concentrated on the the decathlon, I came over here as a high jumper. That's probably my best event." (He did 6-7½ Friday.)

RICK WANAMAKER, DRAKE (2nd in DECATHLON with 3808 points after 5 events)

"It was a day of turnabouts. I had my best times in the 100 and 400 meters, but was a half-foot under my best in the high jump. (He has cleared 7-0.) I really haven't worked on the high jump for two weeks because of a strained muscle."

Wanamaker scratched on two of his three long jumps, both of which were measured at 22-6 (nine inches over his only legitimate jump of 21-9).

"I knew I had to be sure and get at least one legal jump so I moved my steps back two feet on my first one. I also scratched on my first shot put and did only 44-1--some three feet under my previous best...I'm still 50 points over my best first day total. I think it will go down to the 1,500 points over my best first day total. I think it will go down to the 1,500 meters tomorrow. He (Jorma) has a best time of 4:36 while mine is 4:50."

STEVE DE AUTREMONT, OREGON STATE (Senior who won the hammer throw for the second straight year. DeAutremont won the title last year at 190-5).

"It was a good day. I really like these facilities. I set my personal best of 205-9 here earlier in the season when I won at the Drake Relays. The ring was very fast and I'm stronger and my turns are a lot better than a year ago. I used to throw the shot and discus but I started throwing the hammer when I was a freshman in college. Gabor Simonyi (former Hungarian coach now living in Canada) has given me a lot of help in the event. I'm still not in my prime. You don't reach your prime in this event until you are 34 to 36 and I'm only 23. I plan to keep on throwing for another 14 years."

DeAutremont went unplaced in this event at the 1968 NCAA meet. He stands 6-0 and his weight is 240 pounds. His hometown is Eugene, Oregon.

With SCOTTY HENDRICKS and DONNY ROGERS of Texas A & M 440 RELAY TEAM

On Marvin Mills' injury. "We're hoping it is just a cramp," said S. Hendricks. "It bothered him yesterday and he still came back today. We just need one more out of him. If he can't run, we're finished." (Rocky Woods is here, but is still hurt--he pulled again last week, and cannot run.)

Hendricks--"All three of our exchanges were bad today, but we were running real well in between." If we put it all together, what can this combination run? "I think we can get 39.4," said Hendricks. On UTEP (a team which beat A & M on the coast) being out, Rogers said, "I'd guess you would say it helped us, but I'd rather beat them on the track."

On running the three races, two to get into the finals, Rogers, a freshman, said, "It is not hard for me to get up everytime, but I think it might be for Curtis. It is tough though when you have to go 39.8 everytime."

As they were watching the 440 first heat and Curtis Mills, Hendricks pointed to Mills and said, "He is the greatest runner I've ever seen or ever will be associated with."

## HENDRICKS and ROGERS Cont.

As a unit, this is just the third time they have run together and yesterday was the first time they have been together for a month--Woods came back, then pulled last week.

"If we still had him, they wouldn't be catching him like they just did me," said Rogers. "That Black (Larry of North Carolina Central) can really fly, I thought he caught me," said Rogers.

Hendricks cut in then with, "Donny came out of the curve in good shape. I think he just let up at the tape." Rogers quickly shot back, "It was more like I tied up at the tape."

## PAT MATZDORF, UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN (High Jump winner)

"I'm glad it's over. I didn't come here expecting to win but I thought I would place high. I didn't think I had it in the trials yesterday but I had it today. I was coming down on the bar yesterday but I moved up my starting point about a half foot today. Bill Perrin (Wisconsin assistant track coach) has helped me a lot. He told me to lift my trail leg instead of kicking it. I started jumping today at 6-6 to gain confidence."

Matzdorf is a 6-3 sophomore from Sheboygan, Wis. He jumped 6-11 in high school and 6-10 last year. He set a personal best of 7-1 3/4 last week in a state AAU meet in Milwaukee. He was the Big 10 indoor champion and placed third in the NCAA indoor meet but did not place in the Big 10 outdoor meet.

## ARNIE ROBINSON, SAN DIEGO STATE COLLEGE (long jump winner)

"My 25-10 came on my first jump. I knew I needed a big one early. I knew the wind would shift (shifting from aiding to adverse) and it did. I'm not used to being first. I've never won a big meet before. I must have been saving up for this one."

Robinson is a 6-2, 160-pound junior from San Diego. His winning leap was a personal best, surpassing the 25-6 jump he had at San Diego Mesa Junior College last season. His season best entering the meet was 25-2.

## TOM ULAN, Rutgers 440-YARD runner

"I didn't feel easy in the heat. My first 220 was not fast enough. I really like this track. It's quick and not too hard. I feel I have a good chance to win. I'm getting stronger every meet. The tough competition the last several weeks has helped a lot."

## MARK WINZENRIED, WISCONSIN (880)

"I feel great--that is something, a 1:52 compared with a 1:47 plus last year. I'm sure not complaining. I felt a lot looser today. I was tight yesterday."

On what might have been said to Ken Swenson of Kansas State as they came down the stretch, he said, "I don't remember saying anything. We looked at each other and smiled, but I don't remember saying anything. I'm sure he was thinking about the same thing as I was--we were surprised and thought there would be a mad sprint at the end."

## KEN SWENSON, KANSAS STATE (880)

"I didn't feel real good today. I'm not used to starting real slow. I like to go out in about 53 and I don't like to be out front. I'd rather be in the middle."

SWENSON, Cont.

"On the last curve, everyone was way behind and I guess I was surprised. I think everyone was psyched out at the quarter because it was so slow (56 was the announced time)."

"I feel kinda tired. There is not much to do during the day around here. I've got to find something to do to kill time. Waiting is for the birds." When it was suggested that he might be like Marty Liquori and play pool, he said, "I play pool too, but it is still boring walking around the table."

Asked if he was going to work out anymore this afternoon after the slow half, he laughed and said, "I should go run another half after today. I knew right after the first 220 that it would be a slow one--we were almost walking."

PAUL GIBSON, TEXAS AT EL PASO (High Hurdles Winner)

"I only knew I won when I looked at the photo. I'm 22 tomorrow so this is a good birthday present. I caught Walker at the fifth hurdle and we were even after that. Being disqualified in the 440 relay had some effect on me. It tired me but it did warm me up for the high hurdles. I thought the final would be faster. The track seemed a little softer this year; softer than when I ran here last year."

Gibson is a junior from Carlsbad, N.M.

TOM HILL, ARKANSAS STATE (High Hurdler)

"I guess I tried too hard. They just ran better than I did. With the race I ran I'm grateful for where I finished. I hope to do better in Bakersfield next week."

PAT COLLINS, OREGON STATE (880-YARD runner. Winner of the first semifinal heat in 1:49.3)

"Everything seemed to fall together in the race. The false start broke the tension. It should be fast tomorrow. Swenson and Winzenried didn't have to put out too hard today. Nobody will run away with it. I expect the race to be won in the 1:47s."

WES WILLIAMS, SAN DIEGO STATE (440 Intermediate Hurdles)

This season, Williams, who won the first heat of the 440 intermediates in semifinals, has run both Wayne Collett and Ralph Mann this year, going against Collett early in the year, with Collett winning in 51.2 (Williams had a 51.8). Ran Mann week before last and lost--"I had the misfortune of drawing an outside lane for that one. I've felt before I couldn't run out there. I like to be where I can see the other competitors. I run my best then. But, I ran a good time two weeks ago and now I'm confident I can run a good race, regardless of the lane."

What might it take to beat Collett and Mann tomorrow? "Probably 49.5 or under--most likely a world record. I feel I'm way ahead of last year (last year, he was second to Mann in this meet with a :49.7). Last year, in early June, I was at 50.9. This year at the Kennedy games, I had a 50.5. I feel way ahead. I guess I'll find out tomorrow."

"I'm really up for it, too. My roommate, Arnie Robinson won the long jump. The pressure is on me to win now. We kid each other a lot and have a lot of fun talking about what we've done. Now he has won and I gotta keep even with him. Lot of people looked over him. He's a star now--is there. It has been a long time for him to get the recognition due him."

## WILLIAMS, Cont.

A senior at San Diego State, Williams got started in the intermediates at the end of high school. He was a half-miler in high school and was at an indoor meet, where he was to run the 660. They had the 70 hurdles set up and started "messing around warming up over them and decided to enter the event. I won it. Also won the 660, but was disqualified. Then the coach at Mesa Junior College contacted me--he knew I ran the half and was interested in the hurdles then, too, and started me in the intermediates."

Also, he did beat Collett in the Kennedy Games. "He was sick then and I don't call that a win over him. Maybe I can change that tomorrow."

## EDDIE HART, UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA (100-Yard Dash winner)

"I thought the track would be faster. We're not very happy with the times but that was the best start I've had this year. I'm very happy and surprised we finished 1-2. The 220 tomorrow is going to be a tough race. The turns here are difficult to run."

Hart is a junior from Pittsburg, Calif. He won the 100 at the Pacific Eight meet.

This is the first time two runners from the same school have finished one-two in the NCAA 100-Yard dash.

## DAVE MAGGARD, California Head Track Coach

"I'm not surprised we are this high. We just wanted to score more points than last year when we had zero. A lot still depends on tomorrow. We'll score some more but UCLA, Oregon, UTEP and Washington State all are capable of a lot of points. Both Hart and Curtis ran great in the 100."

## KARL SALB, KANSAS (Shot Put champion)

"My knee is fine, I guess. I don't know if it bother me or not. I hope not. I'm having trouble pushing across the ring. It was hurt a little in football, but it was no bother indoors, or up till lately."

What is his position on going out for football this fall? "About the same as last year right now. I don't know. We'll see what the summer brings. If I don't qualify for some tour this summer, I'll drop weight (he goes 285 now) and go out for football. Also, if I miss one of the early ones and there is a later one I make, then I wouldn't go out for football."

"Course, if I throw 63-10 next week, I don't have to worry about making a tour." Was he surprised about competition today? "A little--there was some competition out there." How many times did the lead switch? "I was trying to take it easy on my first two throws and then go all out for a good one, but that didn't work. I didn't have a good mark after the first two throws and couldn't go all out and stay in the ring. I'm not sure enough of my form to do that. I've been working on my form the last three or four weeks and been consistently throwing well over 64. Actually, I guess my form is not that far off. I felt slow today--guess I have poor form in meets. I must tighten up or something. I wasn't getting power up into it today."

BOB BERTELSEN, OHIO UNIVERSITY (6-MILE Champion)

"I ran real relaxed today. I worked out hard all the way. I was worried about the last lap--I'm not known for my kick. I like to go out early and take the lead."

On his win--"This is the best, what you work for." (He is 6-0 and 140 senior from Almeria, New York.

Earlier this year, ran at Drake Relays and finished fourth with a 29:02. He was 26th in NCAA cross country championships--"That's the worst place to finish--the first 25 are All-Americans."

How did he account for his much better time on the same track--"Competition and the fast early pace from Pearce, I guess. It was faster than I expected. I figured it would be about 14:05 at three miles and it was about 13:57. I would like to develop a kick and I do think I'm gaining some speed."

Asked if he was shooting for the record--"I was half trying to do it--inside I was trying to do it--but I was worried about finishing, the no-kick was in my mind. I really didn't know where I was, I didn't look back and didn't know where anyone was in the race." Informed he ran about a 66 last quarter, he said, "that is faster than usual; I generally hit about 70. I think the crowd gives you a little extra--it makes you feel good inside."

JOHN Van REENEN, Winner of Discus:

"I pulled a muscle in my back while warming up this afternoon," he said. I was trying to stretch out a little, touching my toes. I should have done it slowly and systematically, but hurried and pulled a muscle in my lower back.

I consider this my worst throw--it was pathetic. Yesterday, I was not even trying and was hitting 191. Day before I felt tremendous, too, and was going over 200 feet in a work out.

I was after the record today, then had the back problem. The circle was a little slick, too. It is a painted circle and when it got wet, there was no way to grip with shoes. They did get the circle dried out pretty good, but my shoes got wet in the grass."

Was he surprised he was able to defend his title? "Yes, I'm surprised, I should have been beaten the way I was able to throw. The worst I've had before today was a 193 in the rain against Oregon."

SID SINK, Winner of steeplechase in record time:

"I like running in the rain. I really don't know why, I guess because it cools you off and relaxes you. I did feel real good and didn't really notice the rain too much. I was thinking too much about winning the race.

I have run under worse conditions before--once in a blizzard in cross country meet in Michigan. I don't know how much faster the time might have been if the weather had been good or I had been pushed the last lap. Really, I was kinda dying at the end. I was having trouble getting over the hurdles.

I've never been as nervous as I was before this race for some reason. Maybe it was because we've been here so long. I've had five days to think about the race. I think I ran it 500 times this morning. Everytime I thought about it though, I was winning. Wottle (Dave) and I tried to think about other things, but we always seemed to come back to our races."

RICK WANAMAKER, Decathlon winner from Drake:

"My poor performance in the high jump yesterday (6-6 as compared to his personal best of 7-0) was actually an advantage. It really spurred me on. Right after that I set personal bests in the 440, high hurdles, discus and pole vault. That's what I had to do to win. My legs felt terrible. They were really cramped at the end but it didn't matter in the 1500 because I knew I didn't need a lot of points. The rain didn't bother me. I kind of enjoyed it. Competing on your home track was a big incentive. It's nice to win your last college meet on your home track. I worked as hard as I could the last month but had a hip muscle problem. It really hurt my high jump but it helped the other nine. I still haven't reached my potential in the decathlon."

MARTY LIQUORI, Villanova miler:

"I wanted to get out in front because it was a crowded field. I came out only five minutes before the race. I knew it was Oregon weather but I didn't know Divine was hurt. I heard the crowd (down the straight) so I was sure that it was Wottle. I didn't realize he had that kind of kick. Jerry Richey told me about it after the race. I ran the race the way I wanted. I'm sorry the pace wasn't faster on the second quarter. Ortiz didn't scare me. I ran against him in high school and beat him when he tried the same tactics."

BILL SKINNER, Javelin winner from Tennessee:

"I felt very strong. I was nervous but the more nervous I get, the better I throw. I'm sorry Murro wasn't here. It was a great victory but something was missing. It's hard to throw on a field so far away from the stadium. You can get psyched up better in a stadium. Schmidt was definitely the man to beat. Schmidt is a fighter right to the end. I expected him to come up with a big throw on his last try."

RALPH MANN, world-record setter in 440 Intermediate Hurdles - Junior from Long Beach

Noting that his former American record in event was set here, now the world mark on the track, and that his grandmother lives here, he said "I'm going to come back here every chance I get."

On the great time--"I guess it was because of the pressure on the last lap."

"What a race! I wonder what it might have been if it had been dry. I was worried about the rain and wind. I have so many to thank--Joel MacDonald (high school coach in Long Beach), the coach at BYU (Willard Hirschi)---BYU was the only one to recruit me. I have to thank Wayne (Collett), too.

On how he got started on the event. "There are no intermediate hurdles in California high school. I had a 14.2 in the highs and best I did was make the semi-finals in the state meet. Yes, I ran against Wayne in high school, many times, we were in the same conference. He beat me every time." How many times did Collett beat him? "As many times as I ran against him--all I saw was the back of his shorts--he beat me so many times I lost track.

I think I got him between the seventh and eighth hurdle. I was afraid of him as long as I could see him. From the last hurdle to the finish, it is about three miles. I got a beautiful lane draw and Wayne was out in eight--I told three of my friends to throw pop corn at him to slow him down. From the way it looked to me through my peripheral vision, I was surprised there was 4/10 difference. As long as I was under the record, it was great.

You can say this was my first win ever over Collett. I never thought I would break 49 seconds and I couldn't believe it when they told me I had a 48.8. I was so nervous I couldn't put my top on. I couldn't win at the quarter till they put hurdles on the track.

I've been mainly training over distances and have extensive weight training. I'll take any one on who says weight training is for the birds."

KEN SWENSON, 880 Champion from Kansas State University:

"I ran the race pretty much as I wanted. I got boxed in the first 200 yards, but that couldn't be helped the lane I was in.

I'm still in a daze, I'm just starting to come back to life. I didn't realize I was running until the last 100 yards and I said 'hey, wait a minute, this race is almost over.'

These races are fun to watch, but when you run in them they are kinda tense.

Before a race like this, you are so wound up you don't realize what you are doing till it is over. You run kinda by instinct. You think about the race before the start and before you know it, things just happen.

I had to open up a hole at the quarter and stepping sideways like I did kinda threw me off. I almost had to stop. At the quarter, I had planned to stay inside, but not get boxed like I did. At the quarter, all started moving and I had to jump outside or I would have been passed by all.

When you get an inside lane, (Swenson was on the inside at the start), you have to jump right out or get boxed. I don't like to jump out front, I'd rather run in the middle. I was running slower than the rest and they all moved in on me.

I'm real happy with the time. Did I think I'd have to go that fast--only if I had to.

I've just been informed that I can run in the American Games the last of August -- if I'm not drafted first. I've got number 90--and from a little town, that is about as high as you can get." (Swenson is from Clay Center, Kansas, a senior. He's getting married in August).

Whether I run in the future depends on Uncle Sam. If I don't get drafted, or if I get on the Army track team, I'll keep running-for two more years and try for the Olympics."

CURTIS MILLS, third in the 440:

"I got cold before the race, the rain was really bad. I took out too quick and I tied up at the end. I don't think the race I ran before in the relay really hurt me--it actually helped warm me up. I messed up. I'll get them next week at Bakersfield."

## STEVE PREFONTAINE, record-setter in Three-Mile:

"I'm through going out fast (as he has previously). I know that I'm as fast as all the 5,000 meter men in the world. I have a 3:57 mile behind me. I'm just going to keep them guessing from now on. Nobody will be running away from me this summer like they did last year."

On the way he ran the race today--"Why should I take off when I can run an easier race and go out at the end. I wasn't running for time today. I was glad someone else took the pace there for awhile. I knew it would still depend on the last quarter and I knew I was faster on that than the rest."

On his foot injury--"I had the foot padded and taped. I haven't looked at it yet. I'm kinda scared to do it. My foot really didn't bother during the race, just during the last about 165 yards."

## WILLIE TURNER, Oregon State winner of the 220:

"I respected every runner out there. You know that when you get this far you are facing the seven fastest in the country. I did focus on Gray (Mel) and Hart (Eddie). I also knew that all were swift curve runners and I had to run a good curve and be within two or three yards of them when we got to the straightaway. I feel my straightaway running is the fastest around and when I came out of the curve, no one was really out in front and it made me feel good. I ran a decent curve."

"I thought I could win with about 75 yards to go and I started accelerating, but nothing happened. Apparently all of us were building up. But then they must have hit their maximum and I reached down for another gear and kinda got out like a slingshot. Still, with about 30 to go nothing was happening, and I had to do it again."

I figured that with 20 to go from the tape I was going to win."

## WINNING UCLA MILE RELAY TEAM:

Bob Langston who ran the first leg on the team was pleased, saying "I don't normally run this event as I am a half miler, but when Reggie Echols hurt his leg yesterday (Friday), I ran."

I hate this weather. It was rainy and cool. It was hot when we came here on Monday but it turned cool and didn't help."

Wayne Collett turned in the fastest time of his life in the anchor leg of the relay. "Lane eight did bother me," he explained. "You could feel the people leaning over the rail in the stands."

Collett also said the scoreboard at the far end of the track and the flat curve underneath it caused some difficulty. But his 44.5 time was the best of his life and he said he could have had some help on that from his friend Mike Larrabee, formerly a Cal runner, who gave him a different pair of shoes this morning.

Both Collett and sophomore Brad Lyman said that "If any other team won the NCAA championship, we're glad that California did. We have been good friends with the Cal team all year long."

The entire team returns next year, with Collett being a junior and John Smith who ran the second leg being a sophomore.

UCLA turned in a 3:06.1 to win, one second better than its previous best time.
