TAMPA — Florida State distance runner Ken Misner won the mile and two mile in the Tampa Jesuit Invitational track meet Saturday and was named the most valuable player in the meet, but the Seminoles as a team placed second to the University of Florida.

The Gators won by piling up a 31-point advantage over the Seminoles in the field events. Florida finished with 125½ points, FSU 99½ and Florida A&M University was third with 34.

A&M's Ray Robinson was a runaway winner in the 100-yard dash. Robinson pulled a muscle 30 yards from the finish line, but was so far ahead of the field he still won in a 9.7 clocking. FSU's Doug Brown was second in the event.

FSU's shot putters, who finished 1-2 in this meet last year, fell to 3-4 this year behind two Florida players. And the Gators' Scott Hurley and FSU's Bill Jackson both cleared 15-6 in the pole vault, but the UF player was declared the winner because of fewer misses.
