Ken Misner, Florida State's distance ace, qualified for the NCAA six-mile event over the weekend as he ran second in the Kentucky Relays with a 28:56.5 clocking.

The national qualifying time was 29:30.0 and the St. Petersburg senior's performance assures him of an NCAA berth in June at Seattle, Wash.

After running second to Pitt's Jerry Richey in the sixmile on Friday, Misner joined his Florida State teammates Saturday in Columbia, S.C., for the State-Record Relays.

Misner set a meet record by capturing the two-mile in

8:54.2 as the Seminoles claimed four first places.

Jim Buck, who already holds the school Javelin record, won his specialty with a toss of 229 feet, 7 inches. Bill Jackson and Jay Young finished one-two in the pole vault as both cleared 15 feet, 1 inch. Jackson was awarded first because of fewer misses.

Senior Bruce McCampbell tied for first place in the discus with a toss of 166 feet, 7 inches while Seminole George Frank was fifth with a 155-3 effort.

Chuck Crowder threw the shot put 52 feet, 9 inches and this was a personal record for the Tallahassee senior and gave him a second place.

In the running events, Doug Brown ran a 9.6 100, good for third place. John Fuss was fifth in the intermediate hurdles and the 440 relay team of James Cofer, Brown, James Broun and Joel Garren finished second with a time of 41.2.

Randy Stwo, Bernie Waxman, John Fuss and Garren combined for a fifth place finish in the mile relay with a 3:14.9 clocking.

The Seminoles' next meet is the Gulf Coast five-way event in Tuscaloosa, Ala., April 17. Competing schools will be Florida State, Florida, Auburn, Mississippi State and host Alabama.
