The Florida Relays was just the most recent meet, as the FSU tracksters were rather busy over the spring holidays.

The first meet the Seminoles took part in was a five-way competition on March 17. In that one, the Tribe suffered the keen disappointment of finishing fourth after leading the meet with only four events remaining.

FSU held a two point edge over the rest of the field going into the final four events: the 220-dash, triple jump, three mile and mile relay.

The Seminoles weren't destined to win this afternoon, however, as Charlie Harris pulled up lame in the triple jump and eliminated any possible points there. Then Joel Garren, who was running well in the 220 and looked to get a high place, pulled up lame halfway through the race, and FSU failed to score. With Garren out, the mile relay didn't do well, and in three mile.

So in those final four events, three that FSU hoped to score well in, the Tribe didn't get a point and fell to fourth behind host Louisiana State, Alabama and Southern Illinois.
