Trackmen streak by Gamecocks as records fall

Jeff Nedimyer stood alone and intently studied the bar sitting seven feet off the ground. An approach, a Fosbury Flop and Nedimyer had a new Florida State University track record.

In all, two school records came tumbling down and two Seminole trackmen qualified for the NCAA Outdoors as the new Chevron 440 track was inaugurated by FSU's runaway

96-48 victory over the University of South Carolina Saturday night.

Nedimyer had told one alumnus, "Get me a pit and I'll do seven feet before long."

And 2500 Seminole fans did not have long in waiting as Nedimyer left the bar hanging after just brushing it on his third attempt.

In defeat, Bobby Burr also set a new FSU record by finishing second in the mile run with a time of 4:02.4. Burr lost to the Gamecocks' Jim Shaper who nearly provided as many fans with their first viewing of a sub-four minute mile. Shaper hit the tape at 4:00.2.

NCAA 120-yard high hurdle champion Danny Smith outspurred Gamecock freshman Bernard Allen to the wire in tying his personal outdoor best of 13.8 seconds.

Smith later came back to lead a trio of Seminoles to the first three places in the 100-yard dash. Smith's time of 9.6 edged out Vesco Bradley and Jessie Forbes.

Smith, Bradley, Forbes and Joel Garren teamed to outrun South Carolina's 440-yard relay foursome in 40.7 seconds.

Charlie Harris and Rudy Falana led the Seminole charge in the field events. Harris won the triple jump with his sixth

leap over 50 feet this year.

Harris also finished second to Falana in the long jump. Falana scored over 24 feet and just missed placing in the triple jump with Harris.

Osborne Brown, a cast just off his broken thumb, won the shot put and placed second in the discus throw. Keith Ingram was the pole vault winner with a lead of 15-10 — his personal best.

The Seminoles captured the last two events of the night in thrilling fashion after the meet had already been clinched and both teams were running on pride.

Bobby Brooks led a Seminole sweep in the grueling three-mile run with a half lap margin between him and teammate Bobby Burr. Del Ramers finished third to the delight of the crowd.

Wes Koenig's super third leg and Tyrone Frederick's gutsy anchor leg gave the Seminoles a victory in the mile relay with a 3:16.3 clocking. Frederick had been nosed out earlier in the 880-yard run by Gamecock Mike Sheley.

In the end, the Seminoles had more pride and an impressive victory in their pockets.

Netters lose

Reggie Genois got his personal revenge.

Charles Diggins knocked off previously undefeated John Eagleton.

But it wasn't enough for Florida State's tennis team as the University of Miami netters won the remaining four singles and all three doubles matches defeating the Seminoles 7-2 Saturday afternoon on the Tully Gym courts.

Genois overpowered All-American UM netter Joaquim Rasgado 6-4, 6-4, with precise baseline shots and a quick, aggressive style of play.
