

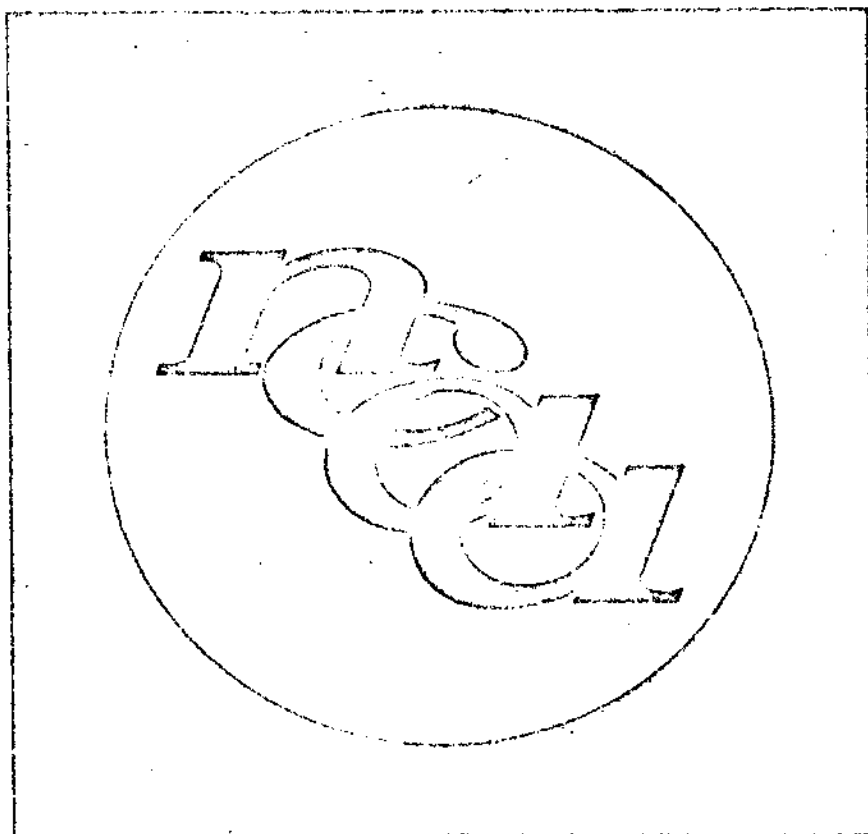

THURSDAY QUOTES--NCAA MEET

- EMMETT EDWARDS**, Anchor, Kansas 440-Yard Relay (NOTE: Kansas broke stadium record of 39.7 with a 39.4 in the first heat. It was the first time the Jayhawks had broken 40 flat this year):
 "I'm not surprised at our time, but I imagine a lot of people are. They would not let us run at Modesto because they said our time was not fast enough. We ran 40 flat this year in rain, in cold, in wind, and we have not had a meet in good weather since the Texas Relays and that was way back in early April. We are not burnt out, and we are ready to go. It's now or never, but we want to show some people we can run."
- EDDIE LEWIS**, Kansas 440-Yard Relay: "We have not practiced in a week, because some of us were working. We were just trying to get it (baton) around today. I think maybe we have it together now. Lutz was hurt at Drake, and I was hurt at the Federation meet, but we are okay now. We were not going all out, but we did want to beat Texas Southern."
- GORDON INNES**, UCLA Steeplechaser, 3rd in First Heat:
 "I did not pay any attention to the pace, because this track is laid out a little bit different and the times did not mean anything to me. I tried to stay behind the leader every time we came into the curve coming down the straightaway because the wind is difficult, but not rough. I was worried about (Todd) Lathers or (Dale) Fleet. Fleet had troubles in our PAC-8 meet and had to drop out and Lathers does not run well in heat."
- MIKE IRMEN**, Kent State Steeplechaser, 1st in First Heat in 8:59.51:
 "That pace was just right. It shouldn't take too much out of us."
- ED LEDDY**, E. Tenn. St., winner of 2nd heat of Steeplechase, in 8:44.90:
 "I wanted to get 8:40, because that's the European qualifying time. Even though it's hot, I still have two days rest, so the hard pace won't hurt me. There was a big pack, and I couldn't get a pattern established for two laps. I was not trying to beat anyone, and I know Doug Brown could have come up on me if he had wanted to."
- TONY WALDROP**, North Carolina miler, 3rd in Third Heat:
 "Before the race I was worried about qualifying, but after the race got underway. It wasn't as much fun to be in the lead with the wind like it was. I was looking around a lot coming down the stretch, looking to see if anyone was behind me. I just didn't want to run hard down the stretch if I didn't have to."
- JOHN HARTNETT**, Villanova miler
 "It's going to be tough Saturday, especially if the wind dies down. There's going to be a lot of people under four (minutes)."
- DENNIS FIKES**, Pennsylvania miler who dropped out of second heat with 110 yds to go:
 "A week ago, I was having the best workouts I've ever had. I got down here Monday and started having nasal problems. I've been feeling poor ever since then. I really haven't had a bad race all year, so I guess I was due one. (His best time prior to this was 3:55.0)."
- TOM BYERS**, Ohio St. miler, won the second heat:
 "This was only my third mile of the year, and I've never been so scared in my life. I can't remember being this excited, either. This is the first time I've ever been asked to come to the interview tent."
- NATE ROBINSON**, Texas high hurdler, won the first heat of 120-yard highs:
 "I got a good start and felt like my technique was good for a change. I really felt good. I think I could have run faster. I think I'm ready."
- EFREN GIPSON**, Lamar hurdler, won third heat of 120-yard highs:
 "I hit three hurdles, the wind was giving me some trouble, but I was running well in between. (He eased up considerably at the end of the race.) My finish I've always considered the best part of my race, so I felt pretty good about my performance. I've just got to quit hitting the hurdles."
- LARANCE JONES**, NE Missouri St. quartermiler, won third heat of 440:
 "I've been getting the shaft as far as publicity goes. Everyone is saying, 'who is this Larry Jones, and where is NE Missouri St., and what is all this trouble he's causing?'. Everyone is pointing a finger at me and saying, 'what an ass'. They make me feel as if I had committed some kind of sacrilegious sin. If I had known the consequences of the international rule regarding professional athletes, I never would have signed, but that's the problem. I didn't have an agent negotiate my contract. New York (Giants) is looking out for me, and if they had known the consequences, they would not have signed me. I never would have signed a contract under the old rule. I didn't sign until the NCAA changed its rule making a professional in one sport eligible in another sport for collegiate competition. Anyone who is in college and not a professional in his sport should be able to run here. Before they changed the rule, I had planned to wait until after the track season to sign. I was a wide receiver and kickoff return specialist at NE Missouri."

LARRY JONES, cont.: "We have a tremendous field, and with the competition as it is, and if the wind dies down, we could go into the 44s."

TERRY ERICKSON, Southern Illinois, finished second to Jones in third 440 heat:
"Yeah, I thought about the consequences of running against Larry, and the consequences are, I might break 45. I never considered not running. Larry's the best in the world, and I've been waiting all year to run against him. The rule where they may make everyone ineligible is an asshole rule."

DARWIN BOND, Tennessee, first heat of 440, winner:
"The NCAA has slacked off in its strict rules. Even the NCAA repealed its 1.6 rule. And now an athlete doesn't have to predict 1.6 to be eligible, but the AAU still treats athletes like pawns."
"What can we do? All the great quartermilers of tomorrow have run against him (Jones). I think there will be some kind of compromise."
"Without the colleges to develop the athletes, there wouldn't even be an AAU."

STEVE WILLIAMS, San Diego St. (favorite in the 100-yard dash):
"I have a strain on my left leg, and it hurts every step of the way. I hurt my leg three weeks ago in our conference meet. It's my inside leg on the 220 and I can't negotiate a curve. That's why I scratched in the 220. I couldn't even stay in my lane on the curve after we crossed the finish line like the judges holler for you to do. I have no time in mind, I'm just trying to run an even pace until the finals. Who am I worried about? Everyone who steps on the track." (Williams ran a 9.19 in Thursday's qualifying, the best of the night.)

REGGIE JONES, Tennessee sprinter
"I slowed up some at the end of the 220 and I almost made a mistake. I was leading but I just wanted to take a fourth. I knew one dude was close to me, but I didn't know the other guys were so close, too. Those others snuck up on me, I should have looked around. In the 100, my coach told me to ease up in the last 40 yards."
"People keep asking me when I'm going to run a 9.0. Everyone expected me to break the world record when Ivory Crockett ran the 9.0. That dude's good. He can do it again. I get tired of hearing people say that the only reason we had the good times was because it happened on Tennessee's track. The fact that Tennessee always turns out fast times isn't true. This year is the first time we've had fast sprint times since John Carlos ran. The people on the West Coast think their people are supposed to win everything. At the Penn Relays they were surprised when they didn't beat us in the relays. They said they all had bad sticks, but we had a bad stick on the first day and got that straightened out before the second day."
"I figured to bring my time down to 9.3 this year but all these 9.1s and 9.2s surprised me. For some time I was pushing so hard for the world record to the point where I was running tight. I've decided now to go out and let the time happen on its own."

ROBERT PRINEAUX, Texas 440-yard hurdles (did not qualify):
"I'm disappointed. I gave it my best shot. I went all out and that was all I had. It's been a long year. I really felt that I could at least make it into the finals. Realistically, I couldn't have expected much beyond that. When you miss a half a season, you just can't stay up with them. Right now I've got to go over to coach Price and apologize. I've got to tell him I'm sorry I couldn't help him out this year. I'm not too down, I'm just going to rest, get healthy, and get ready for next year."

BOB CASSELMAN, Michigan St. hurdler who hit the 8th hurdle and fell:
"I hit the hurdle with my trail leg. I had switched down to 15 steps and it felt so easy I guess I just relaxed and quit concentrating. I've been after this (NCAA Championship) since my sophomore year. Two years ago I was second at Eugene, but was disqualified, then last year I hit a hurdle. I just don't know. I wanted to win this and was confident that I could. I just don't want it to end this way. I guess I'll go to the AAU meet. I feel I've got to prove myself --that I can win the big one."

PAUL GEIS, Oregon, winner of first heat of three-mile run:
"This was the first race I have run outdoors in Texas since I left Rice two years ago. I'd forgotten about the humidity and I needed this race to blow my tubes out. My breathing was a little rough with the heavy moisture, but I've cleared that up. I kept looking back the first couple of laps or so checking the pack. Fortunately Gordon (Minty) broke away on the seventh or eighth lap, and I wasn't worried after that. When you are running with a big pack like this it worries you until you break away. You don't want to leave anything to chance on the last two laps. The pace was exactly what we wanted."

JOHN NCENO, Washington St. three miler (from Kenya), won the second heat:
"It was a lot harder race that I had planned to run...it's too hot. If this weather continues, it's going to be a hard race. I don't like the heat."

PETE FARMER, Texas El Paso, won the Hammer Throw by 25 feet with throw of 230-6, which is nine inches short of NCAA record and a new school record. (An Australian, Farmer also set the Australian national record):
"The ring was slick and I was having trouble with my footing. I still feel like I'm just getting ready--my peak is yet to come."

WESLEY SMITH, La. Tech long jumper who pulled up lame and finished third:
"I pulled up lame on my second try halfway down the runway. I just couldn't go anymore. I felt good in the trials. I had good speed and good lift before I pulled up. (He has been hampered by a pulled hamstring throughout the year.)

CHARLTON EHIZUELEN, Illinois triple jumper:
"I warmed up for over an hour and that was too long of a warmup. I just wanted to get my three jumps in and get ready for tomorrow. Tomorrow I won't run very long." The crosswind is very tough and will hurt our distances."

LARRY JONES, NE Missouri St. quartermiler:
"I liked the pace better last night. The pace will be strong again tomorrow. For those who want to sit back and come home at the end, it won't be there. I'd like to get in the 44s and we can, if the weather is good."

DARWIN BOND, Tennessee quartermiler:
"I am ready, but everyone here is ready. I felt good about my race today. I was a little worried because I didn't have much time. I was in the second heat of the 440 relays and then in the first heat of the 440 (he had only two flights of 120-yard high hurdles rest in between), but I felt strong at the end. (On the possibility of Tennessee winning team championship) I think we are going to win it, so does every one on our team. We are positive thinkers."

STEVE WILLIAMS, San Diego sprinter who ran a 9.19, but was preliminarily timed in 8.9: (after semifinals)
"I could have told everybody that wasn't that spectacular. I was just cruising. I'm just trying to get through qualifying. My leg hurts."

DANNY SMITH, Fla. St. hurdler (Dallas Cowboys free agent), third in 120-highs:
"I'm satisfied. The wind made it a little tough. I was too close to the hurdles and gliding over the top, but overall I'm pleased with my race. I might go to the AAU, but I don't know. I've got to start getting ready for football."

STEVE WILLIAMS, San Diego St. sprinter, after he finished second to Reggie Jones in the 100 finals:
"I got out poor and was tight during the whole race. Who won it? I thought I had. My chest hit the tape. I didn't even try to lean at the finish. I was a couple of yards back at the 50-yard mark. I have just been trying to float through these races. Now I've got a couple of weeks to lay off and get my legs well before the AAU meet."

REGGIE JONES, Tennessee, winner of the 100-yard dash:
"I'm proud I was able to come down here and do the job. I sat home last week and watched Steve Williams, Don Quarry, and Ivory Crockett on television. I just wanted to show everyone Reggie can run, too. I was glad Steve had all the pre-meet publicity. I went into the race with the attitude some win and some lose. That way I wouldn't be let down for my other races if I lost. Right now the only thing I'm worried about is Tennessee winning the NCAA title. We have the momentum going now and Doug Brown and people like that are going to let up. When I got in the blocks, I relaxed, and did everything I was supposed to do and it happened."

STEVE WILLIAMS (San Diego) to Reggie Jones after the victory ceremony: "You have it going. What you need to do is get some experience in Europe running in bad weather, rain, and away from home before 1976."

CHARLES FOSTER, North Carolina Central, winner of high hurdles:
"I had an adequate start. I moved up after the fourth hurdle. Over the sixth hurdle I saw (Larry) Shipp's foot out of the corner of my eye, so I picked it up. When I came over the last hurdle I didn't see anyone's foot and I knew I had it."

JESSE STUART, Western Kentucky, winner of the shot put:

"I wasn't relaxed, but I wasn't uptight. I had a good psyche and it helped me win. I knew all along I could win it, but I was surprised I was able to win with the mark I had. I figured it would take 68 feet to win."
(On smoking between throws) "I'm not trying to set any examples for American youth. I'm just trying to win the shot put."

DOUG BROWN, Tennessee distance runner who stepped off the track mid-way of the six-mile race, was not injured. He stepped off because he was out of race and he wanted to save himself for the three-mile Saturday.

WASHINGTON ST. ASS'T. COACH RICK SLOAN ON SIX MILE WINNER JOHN NGENO:

"He ran a very smart race. I thought he was outstanding in this type heat. It's not something he's used to running in. People saw a really great distance runner perform tonight."

JOHN NGENO, winner of the six-mile, immediately after his race (before warming down):

"I was pleased with my race, but the heat bothered me. I can run faster but I'm glad to win."

(As soon as the race was over Ngeno jumped in the water on the steeplechase track.)

TED CASTANEDA, Colorado, runner-rup in six mile:

"I expected Ngeno to make his move when he did. When I've run against him in the past I learned to expect him to slow down on the next lap and run fast, slow, fast, slow. But, he ran fast, fast, fast laps and by then I had let him get away. Last week I ran a 3:58 mile, but I hate to run the same race two weeks in a row. That's why I picked the six mile."
(Castaneda suffered severe blisters on both feet and missed the awards ceremony while having the blisters treated.)

NCAA MEET--LAST DAY

ED LIPSCOMB, Oregon State, winner of pole vault:

"I've been out here for six and one-half hours and that's a long day. I'm tired. I'm happy I won, but I'm also happy the Pac-8 did so well (Four of the first six places.) I was worried when it took me three jumps to clear 17-3 but after that I talked to Jim Taylor and that was when I knew I had him beat. He told me he was tired and, besides, he has never beaten me before. I'd love to tour Europe on the track circuit. I'm looking forward to vaulting against Casey Carrigan." (his personal best was 17-4 in the Pac-8 meet three weeks ago.)

JEFF TAYLOR, Washington, second in pole vault:

On going over 17-3, his personal best--"I was completely shocked. I had good concentration and was jumping well, and it just worked. I thought I had it wrapped up before Lipscomb went over. This is a breakthrough for me, now I feel I can go higher."

RON ADDISON, Tennessee, second to teammate Doug Brown in steeplechase:

"We felt it was important to do well in the steeplechase because this could set the tone for the Tennessee team. This was my best run ever, but I knew I could cut seven or eight seconds off my times because I had not run the steeplechase all-out in over a month. In other meets I have been involved in a lot of other events. My whole philosophy today was just to stay with Doug. If he had opened a gap, I might have faded, so I just concentrated on staying with him."

DOUG BROWN, Tennessee, winner of steeplechase:

"I knew I would win it, I only hoped that Ron Addison would stay with me and come in second. The problems I had last night in the six-mile were due to over-heating. I've had troubles with my foot lately--last week I had treatments--but last night I had problems with over-heating. With three laps to go I looked back and saw that Addison and I had 25 yards on the field. I told Ron 'We got it Ron--one, two, Ron'. I predict us to win and North Carolina Central second."

ROGER FREBERG, UCLA, second in the discus:

"I'm not going to the AAU in two weeks because I have been signed by the Rams. I was predicted to finish fourth or worse, but I felt confident because I have been consistent all year and before we left we talked to Min Tiff and he said that experience counts in a meet like this. This is my fourth year at the national meet."

ZDRAVKO PECAR, Brigham Young, winner of discus:

"The wind was strong and I'm not used to this kind of humidity, but I'm very happy to have finished my college career with this victory. I finished third my freshman year, but injuries hampered me my sophomore and junior years. I have felt good all year, I have improved consistently, and I felt I was ready for a good NCAA meet. My poor position in the trials helped me. It made me realize I had to avoid mistakes to win the NCAA."

TONY WALDROP, second in mile, from North Carolina:

"Maybe I'm a little bit tired. An ear infection may have affected my conditioning, but Paul ran a smart race and was in a class by himself today."

BRUCE COLLINS, Pennsylvania, won 440-yard int. hurdles: (he won NCAA in 1972 and was second last year)

"I think '72 may have been my best year. I've accomplished what I came here to do. Last year I think I may have made a mistake. I ran to qualify at LSU instead of running to win like I did in '72 and like I did here. I'm not going to AAU in two weeks because I'm leaving Monday for a tour of England and other European countries."

WILLIE THOMAS, Tennessee, won 880:

"I was last making the final turn, but that suited me just fine. I was boxed in and was able to conserve my strength up to that point. I had confidence I could kick it in. I started going by the others --boom, boom, boom. It was almost like they were standing still. I knew I had to do it because we needed the points. I wasn't the least bit concerned by the fact I was in last place so late in the race."

NCAA MEET--LAST DAY

ED LIPSCOMB, Oregon State, winner of pole vault:

"I've been out here for six and one-half hours and that's a long day. I'm tired. I'm happy I won, but I'm also happy the Pac-8 did so well (Four of the first six places.) I was worried when it took me three jumps to clear 17-3 but after that I talked to Jim Taylor and that was when I knew I had him beat. He told me he was tired and, besides, he has never beaten me before. I'd love to tour Europe on the track circuit. I'm looking forward to vaulting against Jesse Carrigan. (his personal best was 17-4 in the Pac-8 meet three weeks ago.)

JEFF TAYLOR, Washington, second in pole vault:

On going over 17-3, his personal best--"I was completely shocked. I had good concentration and was jumping well, and it just worked. I thought I had it wrapped up before Lipscomb went over. This is a breakthrough for me, now I feel I can go higher."

RON ADDISON, Tennessee, second to teammate Doug Brown in steeplechase:

"We felt it was important to do well in the steeplechase because this could set the tone for the Tennessee team. This was my best run ever, but I knew I could cut seven or eight seconds off my times because I had not run the steeplechase all-out in over a month. In other meets I have been involved in a lot of other events. My whole philosophy today was just to stay with Doug. If he had opened a gap, I might have faded, so I just concentrated on staying with him."

DOUG BROWN, Tennessee, winner of steeplechase:

"I knew I would win it, I only hoped that Ron Addison would stay with me and come in second. The problems I had last night in the six-mile were due to over-heating. I've had troubles with my foot lately--last week I had treatments--but last night I had problems with over-heating. With three laps to go I looked back and saw that Addison and I had 25 yards on the field. I told Ron 'We got it Ron--one, two, Ron'. I predict us to win and North Carolina Central second."

ROGER FREBERG, UCLA, second in the discus:

"I'm not going to the AAU in two weeks because I have been signed by the Rams. I was predicted to finish fourth or worse, but I felt confident because I have been consistent all year and before we left we talked to Mlin Tiff and he said that experience counts in a meet like this. This is my fourth year at the national meet."

ZDRAVKO PECAR, Brigham Young, winner of discus:

"The wind was strong and I'm not used to this kind of humidity, but I'm very happy to have finished my college career with this victory. I finished third my freshman year, but injuries hampered me my sophomore and junior years. I have felt good all year, I have improved consistently, and I felt I was ready for a good NCAA meet. My poor position in the trials helped me. It made me realize I had to avoid mistakes to win the NCAA."

TONY WALDROP, second in mile, from North Carolina:

"Maybe I'm a little bit tired. An ear infection may have affected my conditioning, but Paul ran a smart race and was in a class by himself today."

BRUCE COLLINS, Pennsylvania, won 440-yard int. hurdles: (he won NCAA in 1972 and was second last year)

"I think '72 may have been my best year. I've accomplished what I came here to do. Last year I think I may have made a mistake. I ran to qualify at LSU instead of running to win like I did in '72 and like I did here. I'm not going to AAU in two weeks because I'm leaving Monday for a tour of England and other European countries."

WILLIE THOMAS, Tennessee, won 880:

"I was last making the final turn, but that suited me just fine. I was boxed in and was able to conserve my strength up to that point. I had confidence I could kick it in. I started going by the others --boom, boom, boom. It was almost like they were standing still. I knew I had to do it because we needed the points. I wasn't the least bit concerned by the fact I was in last place so late in the race."

PAUL CUMMINGS, Brigham Young, winner of the mile:

"My season is over. Due to a construction job this summer, I won't be competing in the AAU meet or touring Europe. My workout schedule will be the same as last summer's. I'll try to get in 10 miles a week or so. I was worried entering the last lap, and I never was confident until I crossed the finish line. The wind hurt everyone's time and the high humidity affected us all. My high altitude training is an advantage in this humidity, I think. I wish they would scheudle a meet in higher altitude, though. I'll be glad to get home at the NCAA next year. (The meet is going to be held in Provo, Utah.)"

JAMES GILKES, Fisk, won 220, tying the best time ever with a 19.9, wind or no wind:

"I was a bit tight because of a groin injury and I knew I wouldn't be too good around the turn. But I felt I could finish strong because I normally come from behind and I was correct. I was five or six yards in back of Jones, but I wasn't overly concerned because I thought I could overtake him. Larry Black took me to Jones, and I think I passed him with about ten yards left to run."

REGGIE JONES, second in 220, from Tennessee (also won the 100):

"After so many races (10 since Thursday) I am surprised I did this well. Even though I had a good lead I realized there was a possibility Gilkes could overtake me. I was more relaxed in the semifinals and did a much better job then. Overall, I'm very pleased with my first NCAA meet."

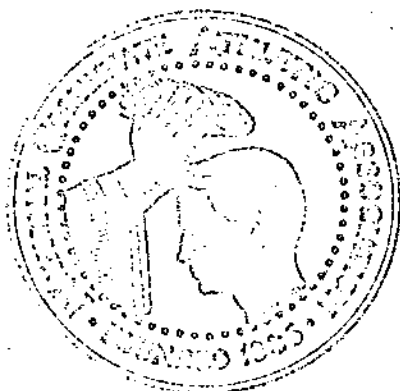
AUSTIN, Tex. (AP)-----Reggie Jones, the Tennessee freshman, from Saginaw, Mich., who scored 18 points and ran on a third place relay in leading Tennessee to the NCAA outdoor track title here, was named the meet's Outstanding Performer in voting by the Track and Field Writers of America.

Jones had 30 votes in the writers and broadcasters' poll while other votes went to high hurdle champion Charles Foster of North Carolina Central, six mile king John Ngeno of Washington State, 440 titlist Larence Jones of Northeast Missouri State, decathlon winner Runald Backman of BYU and 220 champion James Gilkes of Fisk.

Jones won the 100 yard dash Friday night in a wind-aided 9.19 and then came back to finish second Saturday in 20.00 behind Gilkes' brilliant, though wind-aided, 19.90.

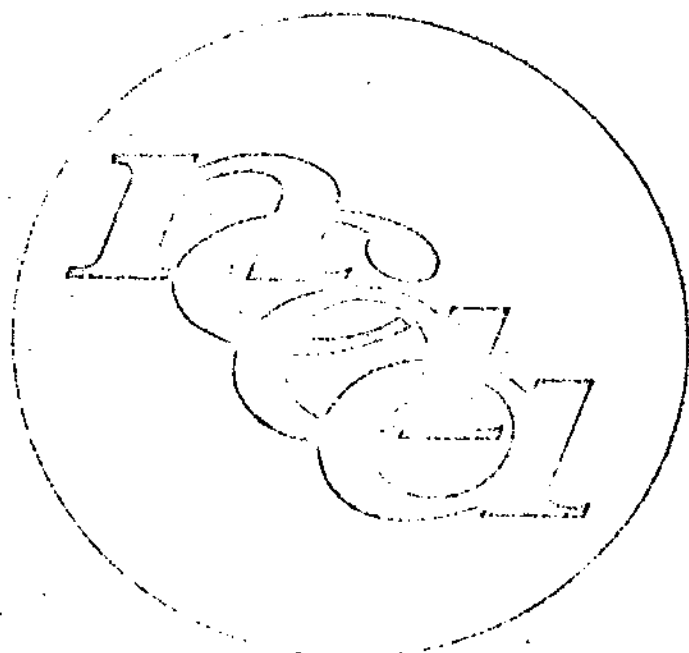
Jones also ran the second on the Volunteers' third place 440-yard relay unit that finished behind Kansas and Texas Southern.

Following first day of decathlon (June 4, 1974)

Ronald Backman, Brigham Young: "I was expecting to score 4,100 points today (instead he scored 4,120). My high jump was better than what I expected to do. But really, I hardly ever work on the high jump in practice. I work mostly on the throwing events and because of this I have improved the throwing events a lot. There are five more events and I should score 77 to 7800 points. I have had trouble with my right heel all year. I hurt it the first time I jumped in practice outdoors this year. I hurt it again today on my first jump. But I jump off my left foot in the high jump so it didn't bother me in the high jump. The bone in my right heel is hurt where there is little padding over the bone. I had it taped after I injured it."

Bob Coffman, Southern California: "Hell no, I never thought I would be in first after the first day. I don't know how to explain why I had three personal records. 3884 was my best first day before this. I usually score about 400 points less than I score the first day. I plan to go 14.1 in the highs tomorrow and pick up a lot of points there. I was surprised at my performances. But I had laid off of heavy work for the past week after going through a decathlon over a three-day period. I hoped to be fifth or sixth after the first day."

Craig Brigham, Oregon: "Generally, I'm pretty well pleased. I dropped my 400 meters time two seconds (to 50.9). There were some events I didn't do as well as I had hoped to do, but the 400 meters made up for any disappointments. I'm a lot higher than I thought I would be after five events."

Roger George, Fresno State: "That's not a bad first day. I hate to be in the outside lane in the 400 meters so that 48.9 is a super time. I didn't go as far as I had hoped to be in the shot put."

Bill Hancock, Southern Illinois: "I'd have to call this a big disappointment. The shot put and high jump weren't what thought they would be, hope they would be or should have been. It's disappointing when you win two events and aren't in the top six. I'll just have to do better tomorrow."

Roger George- - I never thought that I would make it that last lap. I knew that Backman was ahead of me in points, but I couldn't worry about him. No if's about it, I'm happy with this decathlon. All of them were good marks. I had PR's in the high hurdles, pole vault, and was very close in the 1500-meters.

Craig Brigham of Oregon - - My speed deceived me in the pole vault. I thought I was going faster than I actually was. I didn't have enough speed in my takeoff and I stalled out over the bar. On my second jump I came down beside the pit and I landed on my buttocks. It's ironic it happened in my best event, but those things happen. I just have to look at it philosophically.

Quotes: Following second day of decathlon 'June 5, 1974'

Runald Backman - - 1974 winner - - I was happy to just complete the two days. I'm getting ready to eat a big meal, and then rest. I haven't eaten a good meal in the past two days. I've lost three to four pounds during the past two days. I knew Roger George was a good 1500-meters' man, but I tried to keep my own speed. I'm not so good in the running events, because I work out so much in the technique events. I am going home to Sweden and take it easy for two weeks; then the Swedish outdoor season starts, and I will compete all summer in Europe. I am studying physical therapy, and I want to be a physical therapist when I'm through competing.

PAUL CUMMINGS, Brigham Young, winner of the mile:

"My season is over. Due to a construction job this summer, I won't be competing in the AAU meet or touring Europe. My workout schedule will be the same as last summer's. I'll try to get in 10 miles a week or so. I was worried entering the last lap, and I never was confident until I crossed the finish line. The wind hurt everyone's time and the high humidity affected us all. My high altitude training is an advantage in this humidity, I think. I wish they would schedule a meet in higher altitude, though. I'll be glad to get home at the NCAA next year. (The meet is going to be held in Provo, Utah.)"

JAMES GILKES, Fisk, won 220, tying the best time ever with a 19.9, wind or no wind:

"I was a bit tight because of a groin injury and I knew I wouldn't be too good around the turn. But I felt I could finish strong because I normally come from behind and I was correct. I was five or six yards in back of Jones, but I wasn't overly concerned because I thought I could overtake him. Larry Black took me to Jones, and I think I passed him with about ten yards left to run."

REGGIE JONES, second in 220, from Tennessee (also won the 100):

"After so many races (10 since Thursday) I am surprised I did this well. Even though I had a good lead I realized there was a possibility Gilkes could overtake me. I was more relaxed in the semifinals and did a much better job then. Overall, I'm very pleased with my first NCAA meet."

Memphis, Tenn.---Toggie Jones, the Tennessee freshman from Sargent, Mich., who scored 18 points and ran on a third place relay in leading Tennessee to the NCAA outdoor track title here, was named the meet's Outstanding Performer in voting by the Track and Field Writers of America.

Jones had 30 votes in the writers and broadcasters' poll while other votes went to high hurdle champion Charles Foster of North Carolina Central, six mile king John Ngono of Washington State, 440 titlist Larence Jones of Northeast Missouri State, decathlon winner Runald Backman of BYU and 220 champion James Gilkes of Fisk.

Jones won the 100 yard dash Friday night in a wind-aided 9.19 and then came back to finish second Saturday in 20.00 behind Gilkes' brilliant, though wind-aided, 19.90. Jones also ran the second on the Volunteers' third place 440-yard relay unit that finished behind Kansas and Texas Southern.

The 20-year-old Jones, 6-3 and 135 lbs., lost the 100 to Clifford Outlin of Alabama but won the 220 in the Southeastern Conference meet at Gainesville last month.
