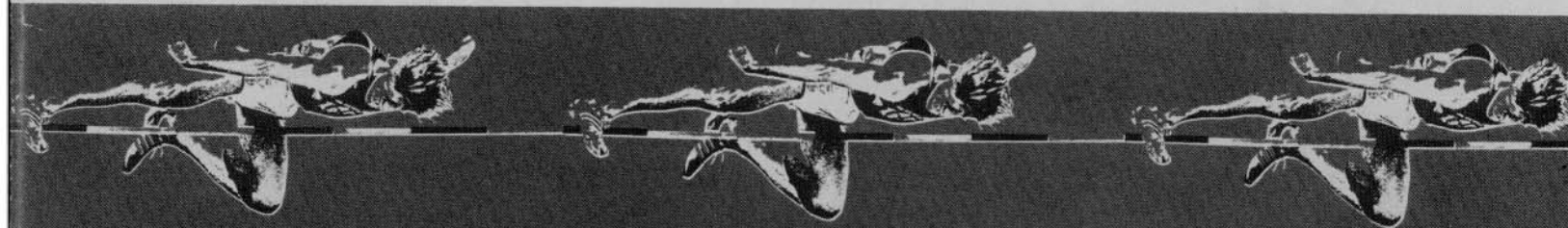

John Ngono of Washington State was selected the outstanding performer of the 1975 NCAA Track & Field Championships in a vote by the track and field writers of America.

6-Mile John Ngeno WASHINGTON STATE, Champion (28:20.66) New Stadium Record)

Also defending champion, winning last year '28:14.46

I expected an easy 6-mile, like 29 minutes. The three mile tomorrow will be hard. All the other runners like Geis and Rose will be fresh. To train for this meet I've been running 120 miles a week. At Montreal I want to run the 10,000 meters.

Shot Put Hans Hoglund UTEP, Champion (70-0, New Stadium Record, 2nd best collegian all time)

I expected to throw 69 feet tonight. The 70-foot throw felt good right away, but I didn't get my legs into it properly, so I could have done better. I felt I was ready for a good throw because three weeks ago in practice I threw 64 feet, then two weeks ago 65 feet, and last week 66 feet. In workouts I do a lot of jumping of hurdles for explosiveness. The discus throw isn't right for me today. Perhaps after the Olympics next year I may give it a try because I think I have the flexibility for it. This throw today won't affect the stipend I receive from the Swedish Federation. It is awarded to any athlete who places in the top 15 in the world. Even if I threw a worldrecord I would receive no more money.

Jesse Stuart WESTERN KENTUCKY, defending champion
who broke his finger in the NCAA Indoor Meet this March.

"I wasn't able to train for three months because of the broken finger and just started back a few weeks ago. I guess this wasn't a bad throw considering that." (He threw 64-1)

Paul Cummings, Brigham Young: When asked how he felt from coming back two weeks of battling with the flu he said, "This is the best I've felt all year, the question is whether I'll still be strong Saturday. I don't think the altitude will bother Coghlán that much, there have been fast times at altitudes higher than this, the final will go sub-four minutes." (First in first heat)

Mark Schilling, San Jose State: "I think the altitude is going to play a major part because most of us are not used to it. I've been training for two weeks at Lake Tahoe, but I could still tell the difference. It'll go four minutes or faster in the final easily with Cummings, the finals won't be a tactical race, he'll go out hard by the third lap. (Third in second heat of mile)

Jerald Jones, Idaho State: "I thought the time would be a little faster, as soon as I heard it was 2:04 at the half, I decided to go out to keep it from being a kicker's race. Cummings looked very smooth with no pressure. Waigwa ran 4:05 staying fifth most of the way. Coghlán just played with the pack until 220 yards to go. It'll take four minutes to win. Today the altitude wasn't important but Saturday it will play a big part." (Second in second heat of mile.)

Keith Francis, Boston College, 880 runner : "I wasn't sure about the altitude, because it's the first time I've run at altitude. The bear could hit somebody but not me. I've had my three weeks vacation in China and now I'm here to take care of some unfinished business. Some press people here are not impressed with some of the runners in the field including me. I want to prove them wrong."

Thom Garrison, Tennessee, winner of first heat in 880 "I had no trouble with the altitude, I like the BYU track, it's the first time I've seen a blue one. I think Francis is the man to beat. A fast first quarter 52 or 53 seconds will be the key to winning the final."

Mark Enyeart, Utah State, : The altitude is no big factor, although mentally it might hold some runners back it won't affect me since I trained here." On being a converted quarter-miler Enyeart said, " If the pace is slow, being a quarter-miler helps your kick. If it's a fast pace it doesn't matter. I think the first lap in the finals might be 51 or 52 seconds."

Boris Djerassi, Hammer Champion (225-8)

"I was chasing it all day and wasn't hitting it. Farmer and I traded the lead from the very start--it gets you more psyched up that way. My improvement this year has been steady. I started this year on an ice-cold New England day. As the weather got warmer, so did I. The Olympics are definitely my next big goal."

Peter Farmer, Second place Hammer, defending champion (225-5)

"My limit is 255-260, and by Olympics time I should be in the 245-250 range. I am disappointed losing, but I just wasn't ready--not taking anything away from Boris who is a great competitor."

(Farmer changed his style this season and commented): "I'm trying to relax my hand and turn from the side of my foot rather than the flat, but I'm still having trouble pulling it."

Charlton Ehizuelan, Long Jump champion (26-11, new stadium and NCAA Meet record)

"I knew I was going to jump that far today. I've been jumping well all year. If you get a big final jump, you usually win. It's a psychological thing, if you get a big one on the last jump it psyches out the other jumpers."

"I prefer the long jump over the triple jump, because I've been so close to twenty-seven feet. I knew I was going to jump well today because of the good competition--everyone else was jumping well. When the wind changed to an aiding wind, I knew I would have a good series of final jumps. The pressure was on here, because everyone wanted to be National Champion."

"Danny Seay and I are about the same, but I think I'm stronger than him in competition. I told all the jumpers at the USTFF last weekend that I would win this weekend."

Danny Seay, Long Jump second place (26-7 3/4)

"I thought I had him on the final jump. That 26-11 really psyched me up. But usually when he says he's going to beat me, he does. That's what he told me today."

880 MARK ENYART, UTAH STATE, winner of 3rd heat: "I didn't want to run it that fast (51.0 first quarter), it'll be that fast tomorrow in the finals." (about his late emergence as a half miler) "People don't really believe in you, although they are starting to now. It helps when you win some meets. My next competition will be the AAU."

Enyart's time was 1:47.63 tied stadium record

880 DAN DEAN, WEBER STATE, winner of 1st heat: "I tried to stay with Garrison (Thom, Tennessee), and I guess I did. My coach (Chick Hislop) told me my time was slow at the 660 mark but I came on strong the last 220. (about tomorrow's chances) I will see if I can get them tomorrow. I think 1:48.2 to 1:48.8 will win it. A 1:48.7 won it last year.. (on having Enyart and Schultz also in finals) I think it's good to run against somebody you know. We were all rooting for each other."

Dean's time was 1:49.0.

100 Hasely Crawford EASTERN MICHIGAN Champion (9.35)
"At one point, I didn't think I could catch Outlin. He started very fast. I've been training very hard the last two weeks and I've had several very tough meets. My stomach was tight this week, and I had trouble breathing through my nose, probably because of the altitude. I was confident that I would win, but I was tired. I just felt sluggish. I've been running fast this year, 9.4's and 9.5's. It's hard to say if Valeriy Borzov is the world's fastest sprinter, in fact it's tough to say who is the fastest. But Steve Williams is one sprinter I watch."

100 Clifford Outlin AUBURN Second,
"My start wasn't as good as it was in the semi-finals. I knew those other guys would be coming after me. The no-fault start rule has helped me."

100 Reggie Jones TENNESSEE Third place
"I tried to forget about last year when I won the meet. I don't think there's as much pressure--just the pressure I put on myself. It was a matter of becoming more relaxed during the race. It used to be that 100 yards was long enough for me, but tonight it wasn't. This year the 220 has been my best event because I've been running overdistance."

KEITH GOLDIE, LONG BEACH STATE (winner at 252-0): "I guess I just have natural ability with the javelin, I don't use any particular technique. At every meet I receive two or three suggestions on how to improve on my technique. But today I obviously had something. I never lifted weights prior to this year, and I didn't even start throwing the javelin until I was a freshman at Long Beach State (he's a senior). At that time I was only jumping 6-8 and figured there was no future in that."

ED WILLIAMS, ALABAMA (runnerup at 246-3): "I was a quarterback in high school and that's part of the reason I throw the javelin so well. I just rare back and let it fly. Until the second meet of the indoor season I was a high jumper. But then I injured my knee and turned to the javelin throw. I've never done any weight training. There's a possibility I may try the decathlon next year, but both my knees are very weak and that effects the number of events I can try."

DAN RIPLEY, SAN JOSE STATE (co-record holder, runnerup): (discussing the weather conditions) "It was a good wind, perfect, a nice tail wind. You couldn't ask for better conditions. My groin pull is no problem, I pulled a hamstring a couple weeks ago, but nothing affected me today. My last vault at 18-4 felt the best. I felt I had a chance at it, but it wasn't good enough. This was my longest season, I worked hard in the summer, I had a full indoor season and a long outdoor season. Some injuries kept me out and I got a little rest. I'm not going to be in the AAU, I'll rest for awhile and workout a little this summer and get a job. I'm not sure what my limit is. If I didn't think I'd go any higher, I guess I would quit."

EARL BELL, ARKANSAS STATE (co-record holder, champion): (with a cigar in his mouth) "On my first try at 18-4, If I'd had the standards closer to me then the pit, I might have gone over. My three older brothers vaulted and when I was a kid, I wanted to imitate them. At age seven, I vaulted seven feet, I've gone up 12 to 14 inches every year except this one. I even love to jump inpractice. My dad, William, was my first coach, he helped me all through high school." (when asked about the altitude) "I got a cold from the altitude. I sat in bed the last three days drinking Nyquil. The weather was beautiful during the jump, but lousy during the interviews."

QUOTES -- NCAA Track and Field Championships Saturday, 7 June

Steeple James Munyala UTEP Champion, 8:48.0

"I was surprised that nobody went with me when I jumped to the lead. I expected Addison of Tennessee to come with me, but nobody did. I ran on my toes all the way, so I wouldn't slip on the wet track. But I still had trouble on a couple of times. If the weather had been good today, I was shooting for a time of 8:20. I feel like I'm in good enough condition to run that fast."

Steeple Randy Smith, WICHITA STATE, 2d

"Munyala jumped us right at the water jump and I lost him in the crowd. I was concentrating on jumping the water jump, and wasn't watching him. That's when he got his big lead. At that time I would have needed to have sprinted to catch him, and that would have ruined any chance I had to finish high."

Mile Eamon Coughlan VILLANOVA champion 4:00.06

"The race didn't go exactly the way I expected. Cummings waited longer to take the lead than I anticipated, and then during the last lap, I started my kick a little earlier than I had planned. At one stage, during the last curve, I was afraid I might get boxed in. But I sprinted through a couple of guys and was open. I was most concerned with Waigwa because he had run 3:55 last week. I was really surprised that Schilling finished so well."

Mile Mark Schilling, SAN JOSE ST. Second

"Coming down the straight I tied up and I thought 'oh damn!' I thought the rain, cold, and altitude would play a bigger part. They were there, but had little effect. In a race of this caliber, anyone of the twelve entries could win. Second was OK,--I'm glad--but it's not as good as first. I planned to stay no worse than fourth as long as possible, trying to keep from being boxed. I wanted someone else to set the pace and do the work and I figured Cummings would. I've been racing Cummings since I was a junior in high school. He's got me 3 to 2."

Mile Jerald Jones, IDAHO STATE, 6th

"I've run smarter races. I wasn't ready for the early pace, although I knew it would be that fast. I was boxed and couldn't move outside. On the last 330 I tied up badly anyway."

I decided to run my own race this time. I didn't have my regular fast first 330. I wasn't worrying about anybody else. I decided to take it easy the first 110 and then come off the final turn strong. I didn't work out at all after the PAC-8 meet, and I took it easy this week. Last year it was tough for me, but I stuck in there

220 Reggie Jones, TENNESSEE Champion

I know that Jilkes would be burned out from the semis because he had to run so hard. When I came off the curve I tried to use my arm swing and to relax. As big as I am, I had to take it easy on the curve because it is like trying to park a big car in a big garage. Now the main thing is that I want to get in there with Big Boy Williams."
