Willie Smith, Auburn junior who was to be the recipient of the errant pass in the 440 Relay:

"They must be giving out paper batons, man. I thought I had it, but then I took my first step and it wasn't there. I don't know what happened."

Harvey Glance, Auburn sophomore who placed fourth at Montreal Olympics in 19.19 behind Hasley Crawford, Don Quarrie and Valeriy Borzow. Glance has never lost to Jones-they have faced each other thrice all in 1976, the Jnior Nationals, the Olympic Trials and the Olympic Games. They ran on the winning 400 Meter Relay together.

"That's a tough break (dropping the baton), but you know those things happen. I was looking forward to running against Johnny.

"Johnny and I are good friends, but we don't go around bragging about what we're going to do. That's what makes it so much fun to run against each other. We roomed together at Montreal, and he was pretty quiet at first. But he loosened up after a while, when he realized he was going to have to put up with us.

"The false start rule is a good one for me. You know, when you get a bunch of good sprinters out there, someone's going to take it. And as good as everyone is, the start is the race. If you get a good one, you might have the race. I wish someone whould have jumped at Montreal. I was so tight, like a drum at 40m. But Hasely got out good.

"It's funny, now I'm the old veteran of the 100. McTear is still referred to as the high school phenom. Not me. I'm the old Olympic veteran. And I'm a year younger than he is. It was funny at an indoor meet in New York this winter. He was on TV with Ali. And Ali said, "I'm the greatest. Now, you say you're the greatest, Houston." Well, now, Houston didn't look like he wanted to say it but he said, "Well, sure, I'm the greatest, too." So how do you think that made me feel. I went out there the next day and beat him."

Anthony Coleman, Kansas high hurdler who received the baton on the exchange during which KU apparently ran out of the zone:

"I don't think we were out of the zone. We might have been close, but I didn't think we were out of it."

With Auburn and Kansas on the final, Oklahoma should have a good chance to complete it's 440 triple here on the Relays Circuit.

MORE TO COME. . .

Friday Afternoon

<u>Jeff Jirele</u>, senior from Illinois who anchored Illinois to victory in 4 Mile Relay with a split of 4:08.6:

"We knew that Eicken (No. 2) had to run between 4:00 and 4:04 to be competitive. And that guy from Providence had so I had to be careful on the last curve. I didn't want to lead so much in the race, so I kind of came up on my toes, like I was hurt at 600 yards and let the other guys go past me. On the last curve, I was careful because I've been burned before by easing off too early."

Boyd Nansel, anchor for third place Drake who is normall a 5000 meter runner and set a personal record here of 4:03.7:

"I knew I had to start my kick early because I don't have any speed. I'm not surprised those guys went past me in the final 220. I haven't done any speed work yet."

All four Drake runners set personal bests.

Craig Virgin, senior anchor for Illinois:

"I did not try to knock anybody's baton," said Virgin of the protest which was made. "I was willing to give him the lead if he wanted to take it."

"We probably would have had a meet record if Jeff (Jirele) had not run a strategic race, but that seems to be the way that everyone runs at Drake."

"But, the best thing is that we won the race. You know, I would loose my stomach for a Drake Relays watch."

Gentlemen, we have royalty competing with us here at the Drake Relays. Godwin Hansen Obasogie is an official Prince. His title is Prince Ogiehugua. His grandfather is King of the Ogiehugua Tribe in the Benin City area of Nigeria. Regal lineage is that the No. 1 son of the King becomes the next king. So, his father's brother is now king. But should he die, and leave no male heirs, Godwin's father would become king (since he is No. 2) and that would place Godwin next after his father. Godwin's grandfather had quite a few wives (6 or 7) and concubines, according to Godwin. The number of wives a man has indicates his particular wealth. But Godwin, more than likely, will take only one. The King of Ogiehungua rules over some 700 people. Godwin's father attended a liberal arts university in Benin City,

MORE TO COME . . .

Ocie Trimble, winner of the Masters 880-Yard Run. He is 46 years old and from Towa City:

"I felt real good the last lap, and I just gave it all I had." "I try to run at least three or four times a week with my kids who run for Iowa City High School. We will usually run some 220-yard reptitions and some 440-yard repititions."

Niall O'Shaughnessy, winner of the special 800-meter. Time was 4:00.33:

"I thought that I ran the first three quarters too slowly, I just didn't like the pace, but I didn't want to take the lead from the start."

"I was hoping Mike (Slack) would have run, I think that if he was in there, we would have had a faster race."

"I tried to win the race and also tried to get under four minutes. I knew that I was close when I heard him (Jim Duncan) say 3:34, and the crowd really helped make it easier to run, but I just missed it."

Charlie Smith, past winner of the reverend James Moackler award, (which is not, as yet a memorial event).

"I got a little ccccockky after the event was mine a couple years ago and slacked off mmmmy tttraining. But, this year, I'm in shape, have been training hard for the run and will go at it full tttilt--I'll be on my kkknees tttrying wwen itts all ocover. LLLast night, I tapered off and wwwent to bbbed (mine) eearly--nnot bbbecause I rrreally wwwanted ttto, bbbut bbbecause I ccouldn't find anything. Yet, in tapering off like this, I might have place myseld in position for a grand slam, winning the first Ja SSSimon imagination award, which is really only a moral(s) victory."

Mac Wilkins, world record holder and Olympic Gold Medalist in discus throw:

"Throwing both events is kind of tough. If I'm going to throw 70 feet in the shot put or approach the discus world record, I don't know if I can throw both events. This throwing area at Drake is unusual. You sort of lose perspective because the distance markings weren't there. Yes, it seems like we were throwing slightly uphill."

Dyrk Dahl, freshman at Oklahoma who anchored OU to the two-mile relay victory:

"I was so scared before the race today that I threw up before the race. Right over there by the starting line. The race went just like I hoped it would. It was slower at the beginning and then a big kick."

Harvey Glance, Auburn sophomore who anchored to victory in the 880 Relay:

"I felt a twinge on the curve," he said, grabbing high right thigh. He continuously massaged it as I spoke with him. "Willie Smith blew it wide open. I just tried to hold the leg."

Johnny Lam Jones, Texas anchor in 880 relay:

"I was going as hard as I could -- just like any other race."

MORE TO COME . . .

Mike Boit, second in the special 800 meter run. He is running unattached from Palo Alto, Calif.

"He should be very happy (Wilson) with his race, he seemed to be. I think it is good for young runners to get a chance to run against better runners. He proved he's of equal ability. Americans don't believe they should have to run against us, but it's good."

Rick Wohlhuter, third place in special 800:

"I though it was a good time for me, this early. I haven't been training very hard. That was really a surprise when Randy popped through there, there just wasn't much we could do. He had the momentum. Boit and I were battling and he just flew past."

Randy Wilson, Oklahoma junior from Knoxville, Iowa, who won 800 in 1:46.1:

"I had to warm up extra long today because of Boit and Wohlhuter being in the race. I had trouble getting to sleep last night. When I got up to them on the last curve, I didn't know if I could get through them. I thought I had waited too long. I was hoping to get third and a good time. I could see Wohlhuter and thought I might be able to catch him, but then I was afraid Boit might be 10 yards ahead of him. The pace was just right, 53.5 at the quarter and I stayed as close as I could.

"I had an invitation to run in this race, and I thought I'd better accept it. This was a personal best by three seconds. I've run a couple good relay legs this spring.

"I figured Boit would go out fast."

Mac Wilkins, his series was fantastic, all over 200 feet with no wind:

"At age 40, I hope Al Oerter is enjoying it. You have to be realistic about his comeback. The world record is 20 feet more than his best ever and he's 40 years old.

"My goal in track are to compete as much as possible, not just in the Olympics. What I'd like to do is compete against him some time.

"I didn't get serious with training this year until February. My goal this year will be technical things, and to improve on the world record (232-9). I think I can do that without a wind."

68th DRAKE RELAYS QUOTES

Saturday

John Gregorio, Colorado TC teaches school in Denver, commutes from Boulder; a partner in Frank Shorter's running shoe shop in Boulder; granduated from U of Colo in 1974:

"I got a stich in my side about at 4 miles, that's why I dropped back. When that happened someone's coach over on the east side yelled, 'Pass that guy, he's dying!' That did it, I wasn't dying. So with about 5 laps left I was okay and went after them. I had so much left at the finish. Just like the 5000 at the US Olympic Trials last summer."

Dave Jones, marathon winner from Owatonna, Minn. teaches 6th grad there; runs with Bruce Mortenson who won here in 1970 and 1971; rand for Mankato State:

"Boy, my kids will be happy. That's the first marathon I've ever run. I did a few 20 milers last winter in training. Usually I just run 70-75 miles a week, and do 100 now and then. I used to try to get into the Drake 10,000 but I never was fast enough. Up there in Minnesota, it's just too cold to get good times this early.

"Bruce and I ran together today and he told me how to run the course. He waid to wait until the 13 mile mark, that's when there is a big hill. After that I started speeding up. I kept telling myself not to get too self-confident.

"For the past five years I felt like I could run a good 10,000, but I never got invited. I guess this is my favorite event now."

He's 28 years old.

Tim O'Brien from St. Cloud Minnesota felt his toe nail ripping off with 4 miles left so he just took off his showes and ran barefoot the rest of the way -- ala Abebe Bikila.

Teri Anderson, 2nd in women's 5000 meter is a grad student at Kansas University; she runs for Athletes in Action and coaches the women's team at KU:

"I should have kicked past her (Neppel) faster. And I think I kicked too early, moving with 660 left was too much."

Scott Hunter, Southern Illinois pole vaulter broke a lower (Lombard) vertebrea during the indoor season. He spent some time in the hospital and he wasn't certain whether he would be able to vault out doors any. The doctor told him not to do any running. He broke the vertebrae by planting the vault pole too hard when his stop was off. It just broke.

James Walker, Auburn sophomore, 5-9 3/4 by 155, winner of HH in 13.79:

"I got a really good start. I was happy with it. But they caught up with me. That's why I made a surger over the last two hurdles.

"Being tall like Coleman (KU's Anthony) is a disadvantage. When you run fast you come up on the hurdle. So being short, isn't so bad."

- Nat Page, sophomore from Missouri winner of HJ at 7-3, won at Texas with 7-3, 2nd at Kansas with 7-2:
- "Iwasn't certain how well I would jump today because of the hurdles. I was out here since 8 am because of the shuttle hurdles. I was happy."
- Niall O'Shaughnessy, Arkansas senior from Limerick, Ireland who anchored Arkansas to Relay's Circuit sweep in distance medley:
- "Someone stepped on my heel. It didn't hut my running any. The only thing I was worried about was winning. It didn't psyche me out... I went out as fast as I could in the first quarter so I could sit on the leaders. Sorry, I have to run. We have to catch a place." Seems like he's always running.
- Charlton Ehizuelen, Illinois senior from Nigeria who won triple jump with final jump of 54-11 3/4 which was wind-aided; his father is retired but was a police officer in Benin City, Nigeria; he plans to stay in the States for a year or so after graduation to keep training:
- "That wind makes no difference. I just wanted to get over 54 feet. Someone had moved my stop marker at the head of the runway, that's why I had to remeasure my step on the last jump. It was a super jump. I have just been doing a lot of things right lately 26-5 yesterday and 55-feet today."
- Ehizuelen just about went out of the pit. In fact, his toes seemed to scrape the end of it as he flew out. Then he threw his arms up in the air. He had fouled on three of his previous five jumps, that's why he checked his step.
- Hubert Butler, Jackson State junior winner of pole vault at 17-3; graduate of Lincoln of E. St. Louis HS in 1974; finished tied for 2nd at Illinois state meet behind Tim Johnson: (Note, his 17-3 was in jump-off)
- "I've been vaulting since I was in 8th grade. The vaulter on the team didn't work at it very hard so I decided to try it because it looked okay. I've go a good plant, that's 80% of vaulting. Before I came out here today, I was afraid I would be embarrassed. I knew what I was capable of doing but didn't know if I could take advantage of the situation." His PR was 17-1 prior to today and he is 145-1b. 5-foot-9.
- Willie Smith, junior at Auburn who was a prep 220 record holder in New York City. He is a very muscular individual and he felt somewhat nauseated after the 400;
- "I didn't know where anyone else was. I was just running as fast as I can. My first two years at Auburn were mediocre. Now I just want to become consistent under 46 seconds. Two weeks ago I ran 46.0, last week 45.8 and now 45.3. If that's the next step, then I want to be consistent at under 45-seconds."
- Francie Larrieu-Lutz, Pacific Coast Club who won women's 1500:
- "I'm kind of in a school syndrome now, but I'm not certain what I want to do. My training kind of has its ups and downs. Sometimes I like it and then other times

I don't. My coach has really helped me a lot the last two years. Last year I improved on everyone of my times. He really helped my speed. (Davis is a former Univ. of Texas 800 runner). I won't ever go to the 500m because it isn't an international event. This is the only place where it is run. I might try the 3000, but I prefer the 1500 and mile."

Mike Roberson, Florida State sophomore at Florida State won the special 100m; he is a hurdler by trade who was the first prep to ever run 13.2 (1975):

" I was in the outside lane and could run and not be noticed by the other two guys. They were in there fighting with each other and I wasn't in the crowd."

Harvey Glances

"It started to pull in the last few yards (his right thigh)." It started to bother him yesterday after the 880 relay and the injury is a continuation from a strain he had much of last summer.

Johnny Jones:

"I kind of saw Roberson out there at the end. Every race I just go out there and try to win. This time I didnot. I was looking forward to the race."

Dyrk Dahl, freshman at Oklahoma whose father is in the military after having run at Oklahoma in the early 1950's and he won a couple Big 8 champs in the 440:

"I wanted to win a watch for my dad. I promised him that the first time I won two watches at one meet, I would give him one. He never won a relays watch but he must have had 20 or so 2nd and 3rd place medals." His dad is 1956 OU grad.

Randy Wilson, anchorman on Oklahoma's sprint medley relay which won a Triple Crown here today:

"They gave me too big a lead again. You can't beat that! I like to run from behind. When those guys have to chase me, it takes a little bit out of them."
