I don't know if I was really psyched up for the race or not. I never expected it to be so hot. I had three hard races, the relay, the semis and the final. On the relay, I had a hard time getting my legs loose. I wasn't paying that much attention to the other teams, but we were ~~xxxxx~~ somewhere in the middle of the field when I got the baton."

Rudy Chapa, Oregon, 5000m winner: "It was too hot out there. (About strategy) I knew Deegan was a tough kicker but I've run lots of 1500s this year and I have a lot of confidence in my kick. (disappointed that Romo didn't run?) No, not really. I enjoy running against him but I don't know how enjoyable it would be here at nationals. (About Kimeto going out early) I think Josh was trying to pull a psyche job. He hasn't been running that well this spring and that first mile he ran today was murder. I knew he'd come back to the field. (About when planned to kick) If I was by myself, I was going to go at 3:30. If somebody would have been there with me, I'd have watched them and gone whenever they did. (any disappointments in race?) The only thing I didn't do was run consistent 65's but, really, everything went well for me. Herro (Romo) didn't run. Joel (Cheruiyot) fell yesterday and Samson ran a tough race yesterday. Everything just fell into place for me. The people here are unbelievable. They carried me the last four laps. You can hear everything they scream. I try to concentrate on what I'm doing but when I passed Samson, the crowd responded, and I felt I had to keep going instead of just settling in front of him. I had to keep going because of the crowd."

Kent Gardenkranz, Brigham Young, winner of discus: "If I ever get my technique down, I will throw 230. I figured 205 would win. I will finish my education at Brigham Young at Christmas and then I plan to go to California to train. My wife is an American citizen and we have a son. I may try to get a master's degree."

FSU sprinters reach semis

EUGENE, Ore. — Florida State's sprinters were right on schedule here Thursday even though misfortune struck down Ron Nelson and Kevin Johnson on the first day of the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships.

Jesse Forbes in the 100 meters, Mike Roberson in the 200 meters and Walt McCoy in the 400 meters all advanced into semifinals as did the 440-yard and mile relay teams.

But, Nelson, anchoring the 440-yard relay, re-pulled his hamstring and will be replaced by McCoy for today's semifinals. Johnson, running the fastest 100 meters of his life, still failed to qualify after finishing fifth in his heat race.

He clocked 10.29 in the heat won in 10.24 to miss out for a shot at today's semifinals.

Forbes, running in another heat, finished second while clocking a 10.29, the exact time recorded by Johnson, who ran with Roberson, Forbes and Nelson on the 440-yard relay.

Roberson, who cruised into Saturday's 200 semifinals with a 20.64 clocking, had teamed with Forbes and Johnson to give Nelson a 10-yard lead, and it turned out he needed it all to limp in fourth in 40.44 and barely qualify.

McCoy, who easily qualified in the 400 with a 46.31 clocking, will now anchor both the 440 and mile relay teams, and will be required to run three races today.

He got the mile relay team of John Citron, Lynn Brown and Earl Caruthers home in 3:11.99 in the preliminaries Thursday.

Citron in the hurdles and Donnie Cook in the 5,000 meters failed to qualify for the semifinals.

FSU runners make finals

EUGENE, Ore. — Sophomore Greg Foster, running despite a trick knee, raced to an American record of 13.22 seconds and missed the world mark by only one hundredth of a second in winning the 110-meter high hurdles title at the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships Friday.

Florida State representatives fared well as the 400-meter relay team qualified for today's finals; Jesse Forbes ran a 10.36 to finish 5th in the 100-meter finals; Mike Roberson is in the finals of the 200-meter; and Walter McCoy is in the finals of the 400-meter run.

In the 100-meter run Friday, Southern Cal's Clancy Edwards set a meet record with his time of 10.07 seconds. Auburn's Harvey Glance, the former record-holder, finished third behind Edwards and Texas A&M's Curtis Dickey.

FSU posts best track finish in school history

EUGENE, Ore. — Florida State's track team, scoring more points and finishing higher than any Seminole team in history, placed 22nd nationally with nine points in the 1978 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championship that concluded here Saturday.

The previous best finish came in 1974 when the Seminoles were 25th with six points.

Brad Cooper landed four of the Seminoles' points in the discus with a fourth-place finish, highest among the 10-man team. Cooper tossed the discus 188-feet, 2-inches.

FRESHMAN WALT McCoy and senior **Jesse Forbes** each got two points for finishing fifth in the 400 meters in 46.01 and in the 100 meters in 10.36, respectively, while the 400-meter relay team picked up a point for sixth place with a 40.35 time.

World-class sprinter **Mike Roberson**, however, ran into misfortune and missed qualifying for the 200-meter finals despite running his best time ever (20.50), a new school record.

Roberson, needing to finish second or better in his heat race to advance, found himself in what proved to be the fastest of the heats and wound up third.

Roberson's 20.50 semifinal time would have placed him fourth in the finals.

McCoy, who anchored the 400-meter relay in place of the injured **Ron Nelson**, became a track All-America for the fifth time this season in adding the fifth place finish in the 400 and the anchor leg run here. Earlier he had won the NCAA Indoor 600 and ran a leg on the mile-relay.

FORBES, THE lone senior among the Seminole scorers here, became an all-America for the second time in individual events. As a sophomore he had finished sixth in the 100-yard dash in 1974.

The University of Southern California took the team title, scoring only in six events but getting victories from **Clancy Edwards**, **Billy Mullins** and its 400-meter relay team. It was the 27th NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championship for the Trojans. USC, the dominant team in the meet's 57-year history, had

the title clinched before the final event, the mile relay, in which it finished fourth.

USC WOUND up with 59 points, compared to 50 for UCLA and Texas-El Paso, which tied for second.

Edwards, a senior, was the Trojans' workhorse and the outstanding performer in the three-day meet at the University of Oregon's Hayward Field. He won the 100-meter dash in meet record time of 10.07 seconds Friday, then came back Saturday to capture the 200 in 20.16, another NCAA Mark, and ran the third leg of the Trojans' winning relay.

Remarkable **Henry Rono** of Washington State, running despite an injured foot, smashed his meet record in the 3,000-meter steeplechase with a time of eight minutes, 12.39 seconds.

Rono's clocking bettered the time of 8:18.63 he had set during Thursday's qualifying and his victory ended the three-year reign of Texas El-Paso's **James Munyala**. Munyala had been attempting to become only the second runner in NCAA history to win the same event,

or its equivalent, four times.

BUT HE WAS over matched by his fellow Kenyan. **Rono**, forced to withdraw from Friday's 10,000-meter race because of the injury after having set meet records in the steeplechase and the 5,000-meter race during Thursday's qualifying, came back with a vengeance in beating **Munyala** for the first time.

Rono also holds the world record of 8:05.4 for the steeplechase, set earlier this year.

Munyala finished a distant second in 8:24.0. **Henry Marsh** of Brigham Young was third and **Tuwei** wound up fourth.

SENIOR MIKE Tully of UCLA set an NCAA record and won the pole vault at 18-1¾. Although Tully's leap was well below his collegiate record of 18-8, set two weeks ago at the Pacific-8 Conference championship meet in Corvallis, Ore., he did surpass the NCAA mark of 18-112, established by **Earl Bell** of Arkansas State two years ago.
