The Florida State University volleyball squad placed third in the recent Mid-South tournament in Memphis, Tenn. according to a report by Athletic director Howard Danford, coach of the squad.

The tourney, a double-elimination affair, saw the Seminoles defeat a Memphis entry twice and the NASHVILLE sextet once before bowing to the defending champions from the host city and Mobile, tourney winner.

Newton Sayer of the Seminoles was accorded a spot on the all-tournament team.
