The Florida State University volleyball team won 41 matches, lost 6 matches and ties 2 matches. Out of 133 games played they won 103. Only 4 teams defeated the Seminoles - Nashville and New Orleans, two apiece, the National Open winners (Hollywood) and 4th National team Des Moines, Iowa.

Won the National Collegiate Championship, the Florida AAU, the Pensacola Invitational, and the St. Petersburg Invitational.
Placed second in the Georgia AAU and the Atlanta Peach Bowl Open.
Placed third in the New Orleans Crescent City Open and tied for 7th in the National Open.

Placed three men on the Collegiate All-American team.

FSU has placed 7 men on the Collegiate All-American team while 8 have been named honorable mention since 1950.

During 1957, the team traveled approximately 6,500 miles playing teams from 13 different states.

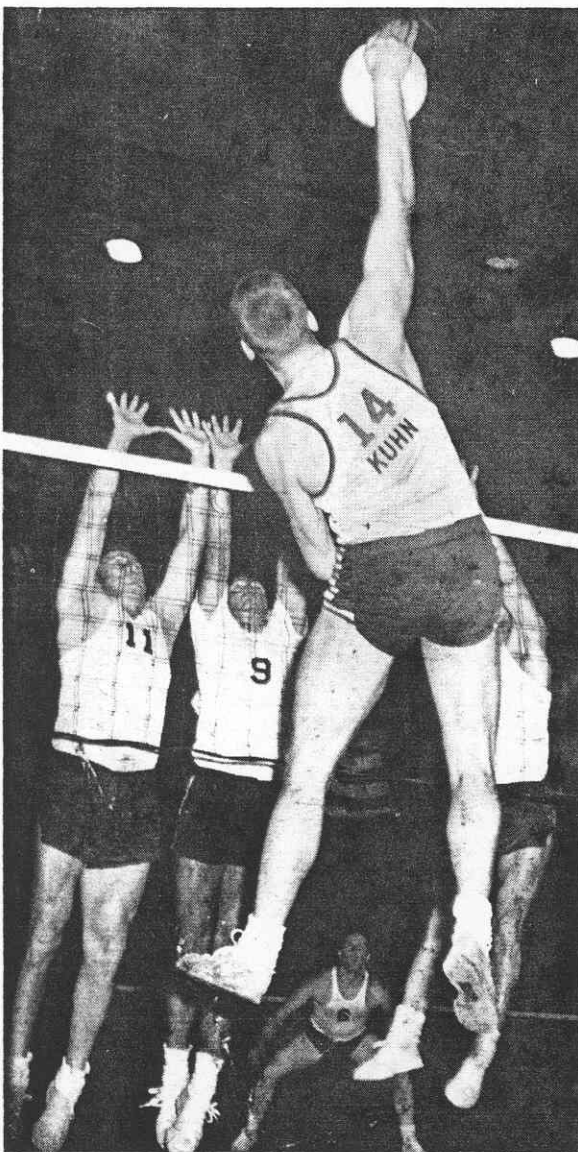

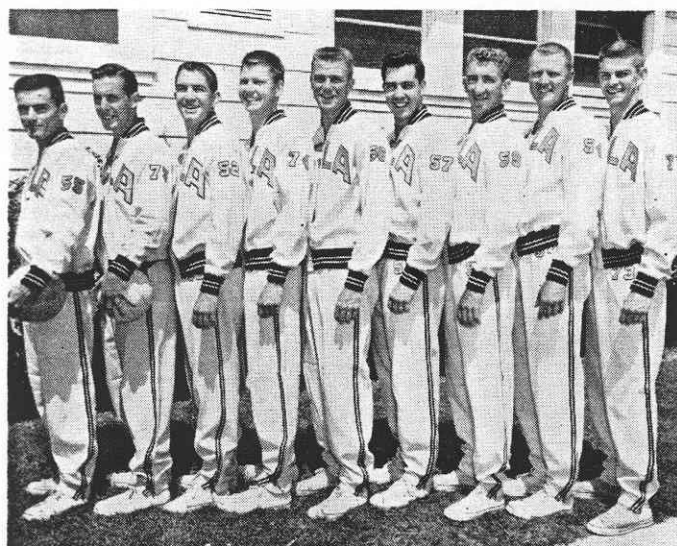
