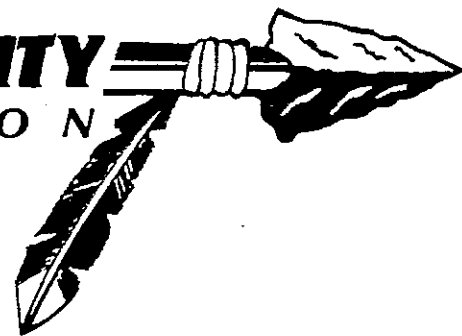

Tallahassee, FL - Florida State swimming coach Terry Maul has announced the signing of eight swimmers and two divers during the recent national signing period.

Joining the FSU women in the fall will be: Cara Duncan (sprint freestyle) of Lake Brantley High School in Longwood; Colleen Carpenter (backstroke) from Westwood High in Austin, Texas; Marder Gaztanaga (distance freestyle) of Bolles High in Jacksonville; Malindy Dorminy (breast/freesstyle) from Tift County High School in Tifton, Georgia; and diver Amy Koffee from Upper Perkiomen High School in Green Lane, Pennsylvania.

Duncan was the Florida state champion in the 50 and 100 freestyle last year. Carpenter finished third in the Texas state high school championships in the 100 back with a time of 57.30, faster than the Florida State school record. Gaztanaga is currently a member of Spain's national team.

The Florida State men have added: Frank Bradley (Individual medley/breast) of Fort Lauderdale's St. Thomas Aquinas High School; Kyle Gilliam (breast) of Anderson High in Anderson, Indiana; Chip Haberstroh (IM/butterfly) of Boston College High in Canton, Massachusetts; Erik Hoag (breast/backstroke), a transfer from the University of Florida; and diver Jair Castrillon, a transfer from Oral Roberts University.

Bradley was the state champ in the 100 breast and swam the second fastest high school time in the 200 IM this year. Gilliam finished his senior season ranked in the nation's top ten in the 100 breast. Castrillon is the current South American one meter champion and has finished second in the NAIA the past two years.

Both the Florida State men and women finished fourth at the Atlantic Coast Conference Championships in February and sent three swimmers in the NCAA Championships.

## **Swim Teams Conclude Season**

Records: Men 8-4, 3-3 in the ACC, 4th at the ACC Championships  
Women 6-5, 3-2 in the ACC, 4th at the ACC Championships

**The ACC Championships:** Florida State's men and women both improve on last year's fifth place finish at the ACC Championships by taking fourth at this season's meet February 24-27 in Chapel Hill, NC. Both the North Carolina men and women captured the team titles. Florida State was well represented in individual events, finishing with four individual champions. Freshman Helen Jepson and sophomore Dora Bralic won on the women's while freshman Robert Braknis and sophomore Ignacio Merino captured titles on the men's side. Jepson took the 200 butterfly in an FSU record time of 2:00.92 and Bralic won the 100 breaststroke in 1:04.29. Both Braknis and Merino set school records in their title winning swims. Braknis took the 100 backstroke in :48.81 and Merino captured the 200 butterfly in 1:47.29. Florida State set one other school record at the meet. The men's 400 medley relay team of Braknis, Merino, Greg Miller, and Jose Gutierrez finished third in a record time of 3:19.44. Jepson (100 fly, 1650 free), Bralic (200 breast), Braknis (200 back), and Merino (200 breast) also took second. Senior diver Rob Caicedo also placed second on the one and three meter boards.

"This was the best team performance I've had in all of my years of coaching" said FSU head coach Terry Maul. "To have four individual champions at this level is outstanding. The best thing about it is that all four of them are either freshmen or sophomores."

**The NCAA's:** The performances of Helen Jepson, Robert Braknis, and Ignacio Merino earned them spots in the NCAA Championship Field. The women's event was held in Minneapolis, MN March 18-20, while the men's meet was March 25-27 in Indianapolis, IN. None of the Seminole swimmers scored at the meet but that did not discourage head coach Terry Maul. "It was a great experience for our young swimmers to go and compete with the best. It will be very beneficial next year."

**All-ACC Selections:** Six Florida State swimmers and divers were chosen to the 1992-93 All-ACC team. On the men's side, senior diver

Rob Caicedo, sophomore Ignacio Merino, and freshman Robert Braknis were honored. Lady Seminoles selected were freshman diver Julie Henderson, sophomore Dora Bralic, and freshman Helen Jepson.

**Returning Nucleus:** FSU head coach Terry Maul has got to be excited about Florida State swimming and diving next year. All four of FSU's conference champions return as well as the majority of the rest of both squads. Notable losses will include Rob Caicedo, Kiki Steinberg, and Missy Connolly.

**School Records Fall:** Nine school records were broken during the 1992-93 season. Senior Kiki Steinberg broke a pair of Florida State school records at the Seminole Winter Invitational in December. The Sarasota native broke her own mark in the 200 backstroke with a time of 2:02.07. She also shattered the mark in the 100 backstroke with a 57.65 performance.

At the ACC Championships seven other FSU marks were shattered. Ignacio Merino set three: 100 butterfly (:48.64), 200 butterfly (1:47.29), and the 200 breaststroke (2:00.01). Robert Braknis shattered two: 100 backstroke (:48.81) and 200 backstroke (1:46.70). Helen Jepson set the 200 butterfly mark, coming in at 2:00.92 and the men's 400 medley relay team of Braknis, Merino, Greg Miller, and Jose Gutierrez broke the school record with a time of 3:19.44.

**Seminoles Sign One:** The Florida State men's swim team signed one athlete during the November early signing period. Kyle Gilliam, from Anderson, Indiana, will attend Florida State next year. He has been regarded as one of the country's top 10 prep breastroker's.

**Head Coach Terry Maul:** Terry Maul is in his 18th year with the Florida State swimming program. The 1968 graduate of FSU has guided 32 All-Americans and has led the Seminole swim program to an overall record of 174-94-2 during his stint in Tallahassee.

### FSU NAMES ASSISTANT SWIM COACHES

TALLAHASSEE, FL -Donald Gibb and Jodi Yambor have been named assistant swimming coaches at Florida State University.

Gibb has been the assistant coach at the University of Florida for the last five seasons where he coached four swimmers who competed in the Barcelona Summer Olympics, three of which medaled.

A 1983 graduate of Florida with a degree in sports psychology, Gibb was a member of the NCAA championship team in '83. He also participated in the finals of the Pan American Trials where his team set a U.S. Open record.

Yambor, a former All-American swimmer at the University of Miami, has served as an associate coach for the Hurricanes for the past four seasons. Prior to coaching at Miami she was the assistant at FSU from 1980-84.

In her four year collegiate career she led the Hurricanes to two AIAW National Championships in 1975 and 1976. Yambor was named an All-America in 15 events and was a member of Miami's 200-yard medley relay which set a U.S. record.

Yambor graduated cum laude in psychology at Miami and received her master's in motor learning and Ph.D. in sports psychology from Florida State.

Gibb and Yambor will replace Sid Cassidy, who was recently named head coach at James Madison in Virginia and Marian Cassidy who is now an assistant at Miami.

###
