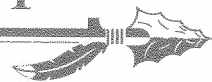

**FLORIDA STATE SWIMMERS NAMED TO THE ALL-ACC TEAM
(Brendon Dedekind named ACC Swimmer of the Year)**

TALLAHASSEE, FL -- Ten Florida State swimmers and one diver were named to the All-Atlantic Coast Conference Team for the 1998-99 season. Nine men and two women garnered the honors for the Seminoles.

Tanya Gurr and Marya Sabesky earned All-ACC honors for the first time in their careers. Gurr, a junior transfer from Indian River Community College, finished 2nd in the 50 Free, 3rd in the 200 Free and 5th in the 100 Free as well a member of the 3rd place 400 Medley Relay and 800 Free Relay, 4th place 200 Free Relay and 5th place 400 Free Relay. Marya Sabesky, a native of Winnipeg, Manitoba, took the second place spot in the three meter springboard and third on the one meter springboard.

Nine men don the All-ACC team for FSU and all but one participated in the NCAA Championship meet. Brendon Dedekind led the squad, as he was named the ACC Swimmer of the Year after winning three ACC titles, breaking an ACC Meet record and two ACC Records, and his NCAA performance as he won the 100 Breast, the second title of his career, and had two other top finishes. Stephen Parry also joined the team after winning three ACC titles and finishing in the top 16 in three events at the NCAA Championships. Other members of the ACC Team include: Keam Ang (third in the 100 Fly and 4th in the 200 Fly at the ACC Meet), Kevin Flanagan (4th in the 50 Free and 8th in the 200 Free), Matt McVittie (2nd in the 100 and 200 Free and 9th in the 50 Free at the ACC Meet), Nelson Mora (4th in the 200 Free, 5th in the 200 Fly and 12th in the 500 Free), Brett Petersen (2nd in the 200 Breast and 3rd in the 100 Breast), Julio Santos (2nd in the 50 Free, 4th in the 100 Free and 8th in the 200 Free) and Greg Main-Baillie (2nd in the 200 Back, 4th in the 100 Back and 6th in the 200 IM).

The Lady Seminoles finished the season 4-4 with a 1-1 record in the ACC and eight swimmers and two divers in the top performers list for the season. The men's team took a 12th place finish at the NCAA's with a 6-1 overall record and 2-0 in the ACC. Nine Seminole swimmers and three divers were among the top performers in the ACC for the season, including six number one spots and the top five spots in the 100 Free.

COLUMBIA, S.C. — Don Gibb, who has developed a nationally ranked swim program at Florida State University, twice been selected Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, coached two NCAA champions, an Olympian and more than 20 All-Americans, has been named the head men's and women's swimming coach at the University of South Carolina. Mike McGee, Gamecock Director of Athletics, made the announcement on Monday.

Gibb, who is labeled as one of the "bright and rising stars in the coaching profession" by U.S. Olympic Coach Mark Schubert, will head up the combined program at Carolina after building a nationally competitive program during his five-year stay at Florida State. Gibb was named the ACC Coach of the Year in 1995 and again in 1998 and coached four Seminole swimmers who were chosen ACC Swimmers of the Year. His FSU teams broke more than 50 school records and claimed nearly 40 individual ACC championships. Gibb took over a Florida State program in 1994 that was unranked and near the bottom of the ACC and led the Seminoles to four straight top 25 finishes, including a top 10 finish two years ago. His ability to turn that program around and his reputation among his peers caught the eye of Mike McGee.

"Don Gibb comes highly recommended from the national swim scene and has developed a nationally ranked program at Florida State that has solid success at both the conference and NCAA levels," said McGee. "We're confident Coach Gibb can elevate the recently combined program here at Carolina into an SEC and national contender."

Earlier this month, it was announced that the men's and women's programs at Carolina would be combined under the direction of one head coach. USC's swim teams have struggled as of late, finishing no better than next to last in the SEC in both the men's and women's competition over the last three years.

Mark Schubert, the highly successful men's and women's coach at Southern California who will lead the U.S. men's team at the 2000 Olympic Games, calls Gibb one of the finest young coaches in the country.

"South Carolina has made a great choice in hiring Don Gibb," said Schubert. "He took a struggling Florida State program and led them to a top 10 national ranking. He is an extremely



effective recruiter and I'm confident he has the ability to lead South Carolina into national prominence."

Gibb brings an SEC swimming background to Carolina. He was a five-time All-America swimmer at the University of Florida and was an SEC and NCAA champion in 1983. He was ranked among the top 25 in the world in the 100 meter freestyle in 1982 and 1983 and was a member of the Gator 400 meter relay squad that shared the American record in 1983. Gibb earned his bachelor's degree in Psychology from Florida and was an assistant with the Gator program from 1987-92. He went to Florida State in 1992 as an assistant, before assuming the head coaching position there in 1994.

"As a former student-athlete in the Southeastern Conference, I am extremely excited about having the opportunity of coaching the men's and women's programs at the University of South Carolina," said Gibb. "The SEC offers the highest level of competition and I am looking forward to helping Carolina climb the ladder in the SEC and make an impact nationally."

Gibb and his wife, Gena, have three daughters: Sarah (8), Emily (2) and Hannah (four weeks).

FSU SWIMMING FINISHES 12TH AT NCAA MEET (Parry takes third in the 200 Fly)

INDIANAPOLIS, IN - The eight man squad representing Florida State at the NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships completed competition today at the IU Natatorium on the IUPUI campus. Florida State finished the meet 12th with 136.5 points as Auburn won the NCAA title for the second time in three years, followed by Stanford.

"It's disappointing when you have a squad of this caliber at the meet and don't finish top 10," Head Coach Don Gibb said. "We had a few good swims this weekend; we just didn't execute like we needed."

Florida State's most decorated swimmer in history, senior Brendon Dedekind took fifth in the 100 Free event with a time of 43.29. Dedekind, who will vie for a spot on the South African National team for the 2000 Olympics, established his ninth individual All-American award tonight and repeated his mark from 1997 in garnering three All-American honors in one NCAA Championship. Dedekind is the only athlete from FSU swimming and diving history to achieve this status and holds the 19th spot in the NCAA All-Time Top Performers in the 100 Free.

Stephen Parry, who brought home Florida State's first NCAA Individual Championship in 1997 in the 200 Fly and is the second most decorated swimmer in FSU history, finished third in the event tonight with a time of 1:44.36. He holds the seventh spot in the NCAA All-Time Top Performers list for the 200 Fly and received All-American honors in the event for the fourth year in a row. Parry will also vie for a spot on the British National team for the 2000 Olympics.

"The actual swim was ok but my turns were really off," said Parry. "There was no way to fix it half way through so I did the best I could with what I had."

The 400 Free Relay team of Julio Santos, Kevin Flanagan, Matt McVittie and Dedekind took 10th in the event in a time of 2:56.04, garnering honorable All-American honors.

Florida State ended the meet with five All-American honors and six honorable mention All-American honors and had the top finish from the state of Florida and the ACC. FSU topped the ACC with Virginia finishing 14th, UNC at 30th and NC State taking 34th. The Seminoles topped the state with Miami finishing behind them at 13th and Florida finishing 17th.

The NCAA meet will be televised on ESPN on Sunday, April 4th at 12:30am EST.

DEDEKIND WINS SECOND NCAA INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIP (FSU takes 11th place after 14 events)

INDIANAPOLIS, IN - Brendon Dedekind returned to the medal stand tonight, winning his second NCAA Individual Championship and leading the Seminoles to an 11th place finish after day two of the NCAA Championships at the IU Natatorium on the IUPUI campus. Florida State, with 92.5 points, is ahead of Nebraska by 2.5 and only half a point behind Texas A&M. Auburn leads the field with 341.5 points.

The Seminoles started the night after being disqualified from the 200 Medley Relay for leaving the block too early.

"I was really disappointed with the relay situation," Head Coach Don Gibb said. "We lost 28 points and would have had an ACC record but you can't go back and change it."

Stephen Parry scored the first points for the Seminoles, finishing 11th in the 100 Back and 14th in the 100 Fly, earning two honorable mention All-American honors. He also holds a spot on the NCAA Top 25 All-Time performances in the 100 Fly.

"Stephen (Parry) had a rough night," Gibb said. "He swam four events today. He does a good job considering we ask a lot of him."

Dedekind, who holds the 4th spot on the NCAA All-Time Top performances list for the 100 Breast, made FSU history tonight with his win in the 100 Breast in an ACC record and school record time of 53.16, also a personal best. He became the only swimmer or diver from Florida State to ever win two NCAA Individual Championships in a career and has now achieved eight All-American

"I knew I had to take a good start and turns and then just hold on," Dedekind said. "My pace was fast for a 100 Breaststroker but I worked my stroke and kept a good lead. Finishing 2nd in the 50 Free made a little hungry for this win but it's all in the day. Each competition day is different and you never know what can happen."

Brett Petersen finished 14th in the 100 Breast in a time of 55.11, garnering honorable mention All-American honors. Other Seminoles competing in the individual events today were Keam Ang (28th in the 100 Fly), Matt McVittie (37th in the 200 Free) and Nelson Mora (42nd in the 200 Free).

McVittie, Mora, Julio Santos and Parry completed the night for the Seminoles, finishing 16th in the 800 Free Relay with a time of 6:38.57.

The NCAA Championships conclude on Saturday with the preliminaries at Noon and finals at 7:00pm. Florida State will compete in the 100 Free, 200 Breast, 200 Fly and 400 Free Relay. The NCAA meet will be televised on ESPN on Sunday, April 4th at 12:30am EST.

FSU SWIMMING FINISHES FIRST DAY OF COMPETITION AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS
(Dedekind finishes 2nd in the 50 Free)

INDIANAPOLIS, IN -- The eight man squad representing Florida State's swim team finished 8th with 58.5 points after the first day of competition this evening at the 1999 NCAA Championships in the IU Natatorium on the IUPUI campus. Auburn leads the field with 173 points after six events.

Florida State started off the night with the team of Brendon Dedekind, Julio Santos, Kevin Flangan and Matt McVittie finishing 6th in the 200 Free Relay with a time of 1:18.99, establishing All-American status for the second straight year and establishing the top finish in the event in FSU history. The relay also bettered their qualifying time by two seconds. Dedekind went on to finish 2nd in the 50 Free, becoming the first swimmer in FSU history to garner seven career individual All-American honors. Santos finished tied for 7th in the consolation heat of the event with a time of 20.66, finishing tied for 15th in the event and receiving honorable mention All-American honors. Kevin Flanagan also swam in the event this morning.

"It's always disappointing to finish second in a race but I was pleased with the swim," Dedekind said. "Sometimes you have to finish 2nd and get back in the pool to train harder for the next race, which is exactly what I plan to do."

The Seminoles finished the night with the 400 Medley Relay. Stephen Parry, Brett Petersen, Keam Ang and Dedekind took the 10th spot in the relay event, giving them honorable mention All-American honors and topping their qualifying time this morning.

Competition continues Friday with preliminaries beginning at Noon and finals following at 7:00pm. The Seminoles will compete in the 200 Medley Relay, 100 Fly, 200 Free, 100 Breast, 100 Back and 800 Free Relay.

FSU SWIMMER HEADS TO NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

TALLAHASSEE, FL -- Junior Anne Blachford will return to the NCAA Championships for the second time in her career this weekend, March 18-19. The competition will be held in Athens, hosted by the University of Georgia.

Blachford, who came to FSU from Brampton, Ontario, will compete in the 200 IM and 50 Free on Thursday and the 100 Breast on Friday. She qualified in the 200 IM and 100 Breast at the ACC Championships with times of 2:01.93 and 1:03.74 respectively. Her time of 23.27 in the lead off 50 Free time for the 200 Free Relay was also enough to earn her a spot in the field for the 50 Free.

In 1997, Blachford finished 13th in the 200 IM, earning Honorable All-American honors, and 23rd in the 100 Breast. She finished 4th in the 200 IM and the 100 Breast at the 1999 ACC Championships in February.

FSU FINISHES 2ND AT THE ACC CHAMPIONSHIPS

COLLEGE PARK, MD -- The FSU men's swimming and diving team won four of the final events of the meet but finished 6.5 points behind the champion, University of Virginia, at the ACC Championships in College Park, MD. The Seminoles finished with 697.50 points, followed by UNC (585.5), NC State (545.5), Clemson (352), Maryland (315), Georgia Tech (192.5) and Duke (113).

"Very unfortunate to lose by 6.5 points but everyone stepped up and did their job well," Senior Stephen Parry said. "Felt we were the dominant team after winning so many individual events and sweeping the relays."

"We had some really great individual performances and incredible relays," Head Coach Don Gibb said. "The seniors should be proud of their performance at their last ACC Meet."

The Seminoles started the night with Bill Schultz finishing 10th in the 1650 Free. Parry then won his 2nd event of the meet and 5th of his career as he took the 200 Back in a pool record time of 1:45.05. He then went on to win his 3rd title of the night in the 200 Fly, setting an ACC Meet and pool record. Greg Man-Baillie finished 2nd in the 200 Back as Brett Petersen finished 2nd in the 200 Breast and Brent Burkman was 3rd on the 3-meter springboard.

Brendon Dedekind won his 10th career title tonight, becoming only the 2nd person in ACC history to win double digit events in a career. He won the 100 Free in a time of 42.96, breaking the ACC Record, Meet record and pool record. Matt McVittie took 2nd in the event as Julio Santos and Kevin Flanagan took 4th and 5th respectively. The Seminoles ended the meet on a high note as McVittie, Kevin Flanagan, Santos and Dedekind won the 400 Free Relay in a pool record time of 2:55.87. This win gave the Seminoles a clean sweep of the relays, becoming only the 2nd team in ACC history to sweep all five relays.

"We did a great job in our relays and in our individual events," Senior Brendon Dedekind said. "We have the strongest team going to the NCAA's and should have the top finish from the conference."

"It's time for us to take what we've done at the ACC meet and learn from it," Gibb said. "We have to go on and prove we are the best in the ACC at the NCAA's."

FSU SWIMMING AND DIVING SECOND AFTER DAY TWO OF ACC CHAMPIONSHIPS

COLLEGE PARK, MD -- The Florida State swimming and diving team had another successful night, finishing 2nd after Friday's competition at the ACC Championships, hosted by the University of Maryland. The Seminoles ended the night with 435.50 points, only 32.5 points behind leader Virginia with the UNC Tar Heels in 3rd with 418 points.

Stephen Parry, Brett Petersen, Keam Ang and Brendon Dedekind started the night for the Seminoles, winning the 200 Medley Relay in an ACC Meet, pool record and NCAA Consideration time of 1:28.37. Dedekind went on to win his second event of the meet, winning the 100 Breast in an NCAA Automatic time of 53.36 which was a pool record. Dedekind came the second swimmer in ACC history to win a career nine ACC titles and will compete for his 10th in the 100 Free on Saturday. Petersen finished third in the 100 Breast in an NCAA Consideration time of 54.77.

The Seminoles went one-two in the 200 Free as Parry won his first event of the meet in an NCAA Consideration time and pool record of 1:36.81 and Matt McVittie finished 2nd in the event with his NCAA Consideration time of 1:38.33. Nelson Mora finished 4th in the event as Keam Ang finished 3rd in the 100 Fly and Greg Main-Baillie finished 4th in the 100 Back. Divers Brent Burkman and Glenn Gonzales qualified for the finals on the 3-meter springboard as Ben Nuttall finished 11th. McVittie, Mora, Santos and Parry finished the night strong for the Seminoles, winning the 800 Free Relay in a pool record and NCAA Consideration time of 6:33.71.

The final day of competition in the ACC Championships begins with the preliminaries at 11:00am on Saturday, the 1650 Free beginning at 5:00pm and the finals starting at 7:00pm. The Seminoles are in search of their first ACC Title and could sweep the relays with a win in the final event of the meet, the 400 Medley Relay.

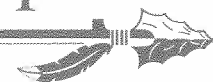

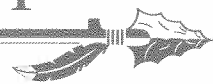

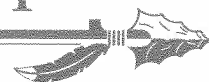

FSU SWIMMING AND DIVING SPLITS WITH VIRGINIA

TALLAHASSEE, FL -- The Florida State swimming and diving teams split a dual meet with the Virginia Cavaliers this morning at the Bobby E. Leach Center on the FSU Campus. The men won the meet 147-81, improving their record to 5-1 (2-0 in the ACC) as the women fell to 4-3 (1-1 in the ACC) with a 98.5-134.5 to Virginia.

The Seminoles took first place finishes in 10 of the 13 events and took the top three in the 50 and 100 Free events. Senior co-captain Stephen Parry won the 200 Free (1:41.49), 200 Fly (1:47.46 which is an NCAA B Consideration time) and the 200 Back (1:48.44). Brendon Dedekind won the 50 Free in a NCAA B Consideration time of 19.91 as Julio Santos and Kevin Flanagan finished second and third in the event respectively. Santos, Chad Onken and Matt McVittie took the top three spots in the 100 Free as Greg Main-Baillie won the 200 IM. Brent Burkman led the diving squad, winning both the one and three meter diving competitions and qualified for the NCAA Zone Regionals with his score on the one meter.

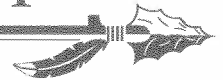

FSU SWIMMER RECEIVES ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

AUSTIN, TX -- Maria "Mara" Toole, a swimmer for the Florida State Lady Seminoles, was honored at an awards luncheon sponsored by the National Association of Academic Advisors (N4A) at their annual convention on June 14, 1998. Toole was one of only eight student athletes across the country to earn the N4A Achievement Award, given to student-athletes who have overcome great personal, academic or emotional odds to achieve academic success while participating in intercollegiate athletics.

During her freshman year at Florida State, Toole developed what she believed was a cyst on her shoulder. After having the shoulder checked by doctors, she was struck with the news that the mass was actually a rare form of cancer called "Ewing's Sarcoma," which usually originates in the bone. More extensive testing indicated more tumors - this time in her lungs - and so began Toole's struggle for a second chance at life. During intense radiation and chemotherapy treatments, Toole continued to pursue her academic goal and enrolled in nine hours of coursework at a junior college near her Tampa home. The treatment took a toll on her, both physically and emotionally, but she kept fighting.

"My love for my sport, my team, and the athletic department at Florida State provided me with the burning desire and competitive rage to beat the odds," said Toole.

Toole is currently in remission and has returned to FSU in top form. During the 1997-98 academic year, Toole, the captain of the swim team, was a representative to the Student-Athlete Advisory Council, maintained a 3.0 GPA and was named to the Dean's List and the ACC Honor Roll.

"By Majoring in Child and Family Services, I hope to pass on the knowledge I have gained, through my experiences as a student-athlete and cancer patient, to the children and their loved ones that I will work with," said Toole, who will graduate from FSU next year.

He served as an assistant coach with the Chinese National Diving Team from 1985-91 where he helped Chinese divers Ni Xiong (1996) and Ming Gao (1988 and 1992) to gold medals on the three-meter board at the 1988 Olympics and Deliang Li to a bronze in that event in 1988. Chen has also coached a pair of World Champions.

Chen, 36, has served as a diving coach on the club level in North America since 1991, and was an assistant coach at the University of Illinois from 1992-93.

As a competitor, Chen was a member of the Chinese National Team from 1976-1982. He was a six-time Chinese national finalist on the three and 10-meter boards and was his country's national junior champion in 1976.

Chen will assume his duties in August. The FSU men's swimming and diving team is coming off a 13th place finish at last March's NCAA Championships. It was the second consecutive top 15 finish at the national championships for the Seminoles.

Florida State's Brendon Dedekind named ACC Men's Swimmer of the Year; Virginia's Rebeca Cronk tabbed ACC Women's Swimmer of the Year

GREENSBORO, NC — Florida State's Brendon Dedekind was selected 1999 Atlantic Coast Conference Men's Swimmer of the Year, while Virginia's Rebecca Cronk earned ACC Women's Swimmer of the Year accolades, as selected by a vote of the head coaches.

A senior from Natal, South Africa, Dedekind earned his third consecutive ACC Swimmer of the Year honor, becoming the first in the history of ACC swimming to claim the award three times. During the 1999 NCAA championships, he picked up his second NCAA individual title as he won the 100 breaststroke with a time of 53.16. He also finished second in the 50 freestyle (19.48) and fifth in the 100 freestyle (43.29). The Seminoles' most decorated swimmer in history, he is a nine-time All-American after garnering three All-American honors during the 1999 national championships.

At the ACC championships in February, Dedekind picked up seven titles, including four in relay events to bring his four-year total to 21 individual conference crowns (10 in individual, 11 in relays). His time of 42.98 in the 100 freestyle not only broke his own meet record from 1997, but also established a new league record, breaking the old record of 43.07 by David Fox of NC State in 1993. For his performance he was named ACC Meet Co-Most Valuable Swimmer with teammate Stephen Parry.

On the women's side, Cronk captured the ACC individual championship in the 50 and 100 freestyle and swam on four league title-winning relay squads en route to earning ACC Swimmer of the Year honors. The junior from Charlottesville, Va., set an ACC meet record in the 100 freestyle with a mark of 49.49 and at the time of the championship, the four relay teams established both meet and overall conference records.

At the national championship, Cronk finished seventh in the 50 freestyle with a mark of 22.69 and 16th in the 100 freestyle with a time of 50.36. She was also a member of the relay squads that placed among the top 16, including the 200 medley relay team that finished fifth with a time of 1:40.89.

Virginia's Ed Moses and Danica Wizniuk were tabbed as the ACC men's and women's Rookie of the Year after posting impressive performances in both the league and national championships. Moses, hailing from Burke, Va., broke the ACC meet and conference record in the 200 breaststroke with a time of 1:57.37, then came back in the NCAA championship to break his own conference record finishing second place with a mark of 1:57.06.

Wizniuk, a product of Alberta, Canada, captured four ACC meet titles, including record-breaking performances in the 200 breaststroke and as part of the 200 and 400 medley relay squads. For her performance she was named ACC Meet Most Valuable Swimmer. In the nationals, she finished second in the 100 breaststroke and 10th in the 200 breaststroke. Wizniuk also swam the second leg of the 200 and 400 medley relays that finished fifth and seventh, respectively, in the NCAA championship.

A 20-year coaching veteran, Virginia's Mark Bernardino earned ACC Coach of the Year honors for both men's and women's swimming. This marks the sixth time he has been named men's coach of the year and eighth time he has received the top honor among women's coaches. He led the Cavaliers to both the men's and women's conference title, as well as a 10th place finish in the women's NCAA championship and a 14th place finish in the men's. A 1974 Virginia graduate, Bernardino has been head coach at his alma mater since 1978 and has compiled a 145-55-1 (.723) record in women's swimming and a 127-78-0 (.620) in men's swimming.
