Lady Seminoles just miss medley record

From the Records-Are-Made-To-Be-Broken department:

The Iowa women's distance medley relay team ran a meet-record 11:36.80 on Friday to win that event. Florida State's team was second with a time of 11:39.72. That FSU team - Karla Severs, Angela Harris, Tracy Howze and Carrie Boyd would have had meet and track records, if not for Iowa's winning the event. Though Iowa's time was better, both times broke existing meet and track records.

The meet and the track are, for the record, the FSU Relays and Mike Long Track. On Friday, the Relays ran most of the women's finals, some men's finals and some preliminary men's events for today's finals, which begin at noon. Friday could just as well have been

called FSU Day.

In the women's finals, the Lady Seminoles swept the top three places in two events. Kari Keith, as she is accustomed to doing, won the javelin with a toss of 160 feet, 2 inches. Rosa Diaz (144-10) finished second, and Kim Mann (140-1) finished third. In the 100 meters, it was Patrice Verdun (11.70), followed by Lisa Horton (11.89) and Trinette Johnson (12.12).

Lady Seminole high jumper Holly Kelly set a meet record with a leap of 5-111/2.

Kim Batten set a meet record in the 100-meter hurdles (13.50), in addition to finishing second in the triple jump and anchoring the 4x100 relay.

Most of the men's finals are today, but FSU's Rodney Lawson made short work of winning the 110-meter hurdles on Friday with a time of 13.98.

"We've had a great day across the board," said FSU coach Terry Long. "I think that's pretty obvious to everybody. This is a great reflection on the track program at Florida State University. Rodney Lawson beat a very strong field to win that event."

That Keith and Batten won their events was old news, but Long was particularly excited about a couple of Lady Seminole newcomers. Carmellia Shivers,

a junior-college transfer, finished second (to Batten) in 100-meter hurdles (14.09), second in the 400-meter hurdles (1:00.34), fourth in high jump (5-53) and 15th in shot put ($33-2\frac{1}{2}$). And freshman Kim Mann scored a personal-best point total and finished second in the heptathlon.

"Mann isn't just a nice surprise," Long said. "That's almost a shock. But we're very happy to see that."

Florida A&M field-event whiz, Tiffany Daughtry, won the discus and placed third in the shot put, but she wasn't particularly pleased with her day.

"I'm winning, but it's not really up to par for me," Daughtry said. "I'm not getting much competition. I wouldn't give myself an A-plus for today. I'd be about a C right now. I'm doing a lot better in practice."

Batten also says "I think I can run faster," even though her 100-meter hurdle time was excellent. "I felt pretty strong in the race," she said. "Running a 13.5 is pretty solid. But if I work hard, I can run faster."

Records set as Relays wind down

The proof was in the record book. The latest edition of the FSU Relays track and field meet was indeed one of the strongest for an event trying to gain a bit of its old luster.

Twelve meet records were set in the non-scored, three-day event that ended Saturday at the FSU's Mike Long Track. The event also received the endorsement of Tennessee head track coach Doug Brown — he plans on bringing his traditionally strong team back next year.

"It was a very good meet," Brown said. "The key was having teams like Iowa State, Tennessee and Florida State — strong, complete teams in all events. The distance medley relay was a good example of there being pretty good competition here. To have four teams under 9:50 (in that event) in March, that was just outstanding."

Brown knew of what he spoke. The Tennessee coach is a former Olympic distance runner. The distance medley relay, held Friday, was won by Florida State team in arguably the Relay's best event. Four teams — East Tennessee State, Iowa State, Tennessee and FSU, ran under the old meet record.

FSU's Jason Frank kicked past his competitors in the final stretch after falling into fourth place moments earlier. Among those who Frank who held off was Iowa State's Joseph Koech — a member of ISU's national championship cross country team, and one of the nation's premier distance runners.

Frank, who also anchored FSU's winning sprint medley relay (3:20.74) relay Saturday, said the FSU showing in the two-day event is a promising sign for his teammates.

"We're young but we're building quickly — I think we're going to be really tough ... by Metro time," said Frank, who also anchored FSU's winning sprint medley relay Saturday.

The spring relay provided FSU's with one of its few victories Saturday. Most came the day before. The 4 x

800 men's team (7:29.26) picked up a victory yesterday as did the men's 4 x 400 relay (3:09.42). Both won in the college division for FSU.

Individually, former FSU runner Carla Boravicka won the women's 3,000 meters. David Lucas won the 400-meter hurdles and the FAMU women's 4 x 800 women's relay team finished second to Iowa State to highlight other action among local athletes.

At least one Seminole had an off day. Larry Carr failed to be in the chase for the meet pole vault record yesterday. That was left up to David Watson, who competed unattached. He set a meet record with a vault of 19-feet and 1-inch. Carr, cleared 17-feet, more than a foot off his personal record.

As for the sprints on FSU's track Saturday, Tennessee did especially well in those and the field events. Individual winners for the Volunteers included: Kevin Fitzpatrick (discus), Bobby Jenkins (high jump), Vince Martin (long jump) and Tommy Walker (100 meters).

Jenkins, after clearing 7-foot-1, failed in his attempts at the meet record of 7-5. Walker (10.59) edged Miami football player Randall Hill in the open event of the 100 meters. Hill also finished second in the 200 meters.

Iowa State women's team set meet records in the 4 x 800 relay and the sprint medley (3:41,74). FSU finished second in the sprint medley.

'Tennessee had an amazing meet, just superb, and so did Iowa State," FSU head coach Terry Long said. "But I was very pleased with our showing - both men's and women's. It was just tremendous meet for us. We did some very good things."
