FLORIDA STATE COMPETES AT NCAA INDOOR TRACK CHAMPIONSHIPS

March 9, 1996

Indianapolis, IN -- The women's 4X400M relay team finished second and Erica Shepard placed seventh in the country in the 800M at the NCAA Indoor Championships.

The 4X400 meter relay team of Sophia Danvers, Maria Embon, Yashiva Edwards and Erica Shepard were clocked at a time of 3:33.59 in the finals. LSU, which also won the overall women's title, took first in the event with a time of 3:32.53. The foursome had the second fastest qualifying time on Friday of 3:35.92 going into Saturday's final. The Lady Seminoles finished first in the ACC Indoor Championships in the 4X400M relay in Greensboro earlier this season.

"I was very pleased with the women's relay team," commented Coach Terry Long. "They knew coming in they had a shot to make some noise in the finals and they stepped it up. Erica came in with one of the top 13 or 14 times in the country and did a great job for us with her seventh place finish."

Erica Shepard also had an impressive final, with a seventh place time of 2:08.41 in the 800 meter run. Shepard was an ACC Champion in the same event at the conference indoor meet. She qualified for the final with a time of 2:08.53 in Friday's prelims.

Patrick Hayes, the only competitor for the men, competed in the 55M and 200M dashes. The sophomore did not advance out of the prelims of the 200M with a time of 21.74. Hayes advanced as far as the semi-finals in the 55M dash, but did not qualify for the finals. Hayes ran a 6.32 in the prelims and 6.29 in the semi-finals.

George Mason took home the team title on the men's side after the final scores were tallied.
