FSU TRACK TEAMS TAKE FOURTH PLACE AT ACC INDOORS

BLACKSBURG, VA -- The Florida State men's and women's track teams both finished in fourth place after the final day of competition at the ACC Indoor Track & Field Championships. The men totaled 56 points, while the women came in with 73 points. North Carolina won the women's team championship while Clemson took home the men's team title.

The Seminole men had three scorers in the 60m dash as Patrick Hayes, Travis Minor and Germaine Stringer placed fifth, sixth and seventh, respectively. Hayes clocked in at 6.77, Minor at 6.82 and Stringer at 6.85. The times were collegiate bests for Hayes and Stringer while Minor, the ACC Rookie of the Year as a tailback for the FSU football team, competed in the 60m dash for the first time. Stringer, who is also a two-sport athlete as a wide receiver, added an eighth place effort in the 200m (21.60).

Darius Jones was the top individual finisher for the FSU men as he finished second in the high jump with a mark of 6-9.75. Danny Smith (1:51.65) and Jody Lawrence (59-4.25) added third place points in the 800m and weight throw. Also taking third were the 4x400m (Zyris Hill, D. Smith, Minor and Hayes) and distance medley (Aaron Scheer, Antonio Smith, Nafthaly Kurgat and Dave Ogletree) relay teams with times of 3:14.39 and 9:57.96. In the pole vault the men went 4-5-6 as Jason Dean, Kristopher Richardson and Darius Jones each went 15-5.75.

Lakeisha Mose won the ACC title in the women's weight with a throw of 62-5. The collegiate best toss is an FSU record as well as a solid NCAA provisional qualifying mark. Mose recorded a third place finish in the shot put during opening day action. Senior Rikke Ronholt also won an ACC Championship (800m), clocking in at 2:14.97.

Freshman Chinette Johnson proved her versatility as she scored in three events in her first ACC Championship. The Tallahassee native was sixth in the triple jump (40-2), seventh in the pole vault (8-2.50) and the 400m (57.07).

Also scoring well for the Lady Seminoles were Tonya Carter and the women's 4x400m relay team. Carter was third in the 60m dash in 7.49 and the 4x400m relay team, which included Ronholt and Johnson, was second in an NCAA provisional time of 3:42.74.

FSU MEN THIRD AFTER FIRST DAY OF ACC INDOOR TRACK CHAMPIONSHIPS

BLACKSBURG, VA -- The Florida State men's track team finished the first day of the ACC Indoor Track Championships in third place with 22 total points. NC State is first with 60 points and North Carolina stands in third with 27. The women are eighth with nine points as North Carolina leads with 86 points and Clemson is third with 34 after six events.

Sophomore Donald Heaven, a two-sport athlete who is a starting offensive guard for the Seminole football team, recorded a third place throw in the men's shot put at 54-2. Also picking up third place points was Zyris Hill in the long jump with a mark of 24-7. Tallahassee native Darius Jones added a seventh place effort in the long jump and the Seminoles took third in the distance medley.

For the women, Lakeisha Mose led the way with third place points in the shot put after a toss of 57-6.25. Chinette Johnson placed seventh in the new event of women's pole vault (8-2.50) and Shannon Steele was eighth in the high jump (5-5) to complete the scoring for the Lady Seminoles.

Action resumes tomorrow morning with the finals in several field events while the afternoon session features the finals in all of the sprint and distance events and concludes with the mile relay.

First Day of ACC Indoor Track and Field Championships Complete: N.C. State Men Take Early Lead

Blacksburg, VA - The N.C. State Wolfpack claimed the first day lead at the ACC Men's Indoor Track and Field Championships after an impressive showing in the day's field events.

The Wolfpack made their move by finishing first and second in the long jump. Cordell Smith claimed the individual championship with a jump of 24'07.25" while Eric Riddick claimed second with the same distance. Curtis Brookshire also scored for N.C. State in the long jump by finishing tenth with a jump of 22'07.25". The Wolfpack was also helped by John Patterson's second place finish in the shot put with a throw of 54'11.25".

The other Wolfpack individual champion came in the 5000 meters. Pat Joyce claimed the win with a time of 14:19.11 while teammate Chan Pons, running the 5000 meters for the first time this year, finished second.

One more individual championship was decided on the day while on relay was also completed. Allen Bradd of North Carolina won the individual championship in shot put with a throw of 57'04.75". Meanwhile, the N.C. State distance medley relay team of Aaron Saft, Henry Aaron, Dan Smitas, and Robbie Howell won in a time of 9:54.10.

Two ACC Championship meet records were set during Sunday's competition. Jeremichael Williams of Clemson set the new record in the 60 meter hurdles by finishing in a time of 7.82. Meanwhile, his Tiger teammates Carlton Chambers and Charles Allen tied for the new meet record in the 60 meter dash with a time of 6.70.

The meet will resume Monday morning with the finals in the remaining field events starting at 10:00 a.m. The afternoon schedule features the finals of all of the sprints and distance events as well as the Mile Relay.

Also picking up third place points was Zyris Hill in the long jump with a mark of 24-7. Tallahassee native Darius Jones was seventh in the long jump, and the Seminoles took third in the distance medley.

For the women, Lakeisha Mose led the way with third place points in the shot put after a toss of 57-6 $\frac{1}{4}$. Chinette Johnson placed seventh in the new event of women's pole vault (8-2.50) and Shannon Steele was eighth in the high jump (5-5).

Tar Heels Rule First Day of Women's Indoor Track Championships

Blacksburg, VA - The North Carolina Tar Heels claimed the first day lead at the ACC Women's Indoor Track and Field Championships, claiming four of the five individual championships decided on Sunday.

The Tar Heels dominated the day's field events, claiming all four individual championships and two runner-up places. Tar Heel freshman Joy Ganes won the high jump, clearing 5'08.50", while teammate Jennifer Dixon laid claim to second place with the same height. Meanwhile Stefani Dixon gained the individual championship in the pole vault with a time of 10'02.00". The Tar Heels also gained the individual championships in the long jump (LaShonda Christopher, 20'07.75") and the shot put (Mandy Schnupp, 49'05.50").

In the other individual championship decided on the day, Laura Rhoads from N.C. State, competing in the 5000 meters for the first time this year, easily won the event, finishing in a time of 16:30.00. Her time was a full 43 seconds faster than the second place finisher.

The distance medley relay was the lone relay championship run during the day's events. The Georgia Tech team of Nicole Campbell, Nia Simmons, Tahira Anderson, and Beth Mallory won the event in a time of 11:49.55.

Several ACC meet records were set on Sunday. Georgia Tech's Andria King set the 60 meter hurdles record with a time of 8.15 while Simone Tomlinson of Clemson set the mark in the 60 meter dash with a time of 7.34. Monique Hennegan of North Carolina set a new standard in the 400 meters at 52.88 while teammate Stefani Dixon cleared 10'02.00" to set a new pole vault mark.

The meet will resume Monday morning with the finals in the remaining field events starting at 10:00 a.m. The afternoon schedule features the finals of all of the sprints and distance events as well as the Mile Relay.
