FSU TRACK AND FIELD TEAM MEMBERS RETURN FROM 106TH PENN RELAYS Select Seminoles competed with the world's top athletes

PHILADELPHIA, PA -- A select group of Seminoles took part in one of the world's great sporting events, the 106th annual Penn Relays, which concluded Saturday. This highly publicized event will be broadcast from 4-5 p.m. EST on Sunday, April 30th on ESPN. Roughly 96,000 spectators attended the Penn Relays, with more than 48,000 on Saturday alone.

Ten thousand athletes from around the world traveled to Philadelphia to participate in the three-day Carnival. This year's event featured some of the world's top athletes who attended the Penn Relays as a first step on their road to the Olympic Games in Syndey, Australia. Marion Jones, Maurice Greene, Michael Johnson, Gail Devers, and World Championships relay veterans Jerome Davis, Angelo Taylor, and Calvin Harrison headlined the USA contingent.

Reigning ACC Indoor and Outdoor long jump champion Joe Allen placed sixth in the college men's long jump championship with a mark of 24'09.00". Freshman hurdler Danyne Brown, a New Jersey native, placed ninth in the college men's 110m hurdles with a time of 14.88 and posted a time of 56.12 in the men's 400m hurdles. Pennsylvania native and Seminole sprinter, Nakeya Crutchfield, traveled to Philadelphia and was able to compete in front of her home crowd this weekend.

The Seminoles will return to action Saturday, May 6th when they travel to Life College in Atlanta, Ga for their third United States Track Coaches Association Quad-Meet of the outdoor season. Florida State will compete against East Carolina University, the University of Kansas and Life College in the one-day event.

FLORIDA STATE TRACK AND FIELD MEMBERS HEAD TO PENN RELAYS Seminoles send a select group to Penn after exhausting championship weekend.

PHILADELPHIA, PA - Five members of the Florida State track and field team will travel to Philadelphia, PA to compete in the 106th Penn Relays this weekend. Members from the ACC's top women's outdoor team and the ACC's second-place men's team will compete against a field of athletes from all over the world.

Pennsylvania native, Nakeya Crutchfield, will compete in front of her home crowd just one week after placing second in the 100m and 200m dash at the ACC Outdoor Championships. The sophomore from Coatesville contributed 16 points to the Seminoles team title at last week's ACC Outdoor Championships.

ACC women's shot put champion Makiba Batten will also make the trip to Philadelphia this weekend. Batten was a major part of the Lady Seminole's ACC team title by winning the shot put title (10 points) and placing second in the women's discus (8 points).

Junior Sara White rounds out the Lady Seminole contingent traveling to Pennsylvania. White, from Port Charlotte, Fl, placed fourth in the women's hammer throw and 10th in the women's discus at the ACC Outdoor Championships.

Joe Allen will represent the Seminoles at the Penn Relays for the men. The junior from Toledo, Ohio is the reigning ACC Indoor and Outdoor long jump champion. Allen also placed second in the triple jump at the ACC Outdoor Championships last weekend and he led all Seminole men with 18 points.

The final Seminole heading to Philadelphia is freshman hurdler Danyne Brown. Brown, a freshman from New Jersey, finished sixth in the men's 110m high hurdles and sixth in the men's 400m hurdles at the ACC Outdoor Championships last weekend. His six-point effort was the fifth best point total for the second-place Seminoles.

The Seminoles will return to action Saturday May 6th when they travel to Life College in Atlanta, Ga for their third United States Track Coaches Association Quad-Meet of the outdoor season. Florida State will compete against East Carolina University, the University of Kansas and Life College in the one-day event.
