

Lady Tribe splits weekend pair

The Lady Seminole basketball team, priming for next week's state playoffs, lost to Albany State but roared back to blast FAMU in games over the weekend.

Florida State fell to Albany State Friday night 61-43 as Albany's Eloise Milling fired in 28 big points. The Tribe was paced by Bobbi Parr's 11 points and Barbara Koontz' 10.

The Lady Seminoles paid a visit to Gaither Gymnasium Saturday, beating the Rattlers handily for the second time this season, this time winning 51-25. Yvette McKinney

rediscovered her shooting eye and poured in 16 points to lead the FSU attack. Barbara Koontz followed with 13 points and Bobby Parr added 10.

"We showed real poise in coming back to beat FAMU," stated head coach Millie Usher. "Everybody played well, and it was our first step to repeating as state champs."

The Lady Tribe record now stands at 9-12 with the split this weekend.

Monday afternoon the Seminoles will journey to Gainesville to face the Florida Gators once again. The series with the Gators stands at 1-1 this year and Monday's will be the rubber game.

Florida State will begin the defense of their state crown Thursday night when the Florida State tournament begins in Lake City. The Lady Seminoles will face the winner of the University of Tampa-Florida A&M game in the first round play.

The tournament is a double elimination with 10 women's teams from around the state participating. The Seminoles should face their toughest competition from Flagler College and the University of Miami Hurricanes.

FSU upsets Tar Heels
