TAMULIS AND SORDEL BOOST FLORIDA STATE TO NINTH PLACE FINISH AT LADY GAMECOCK WOMEN'S GOLF CLASSIC

BLYTHEWOOD, S.C. – Florida State junior Kristin Tamulis finished in seventh place and sophomore Carrie Sordel finished in eighth place to lead the Seminole women's golf team to a ninth place finish at the Lady Gamecock Classic at the University Club. Tamulis fired an even-par 72 and Sordel carded a career-low tying 71 to post her second consecutive top-10 individual finish as competition in the 54-hole event concluded Sunday.

Tamulis (Naples, Fla.) tied her career-best with a 221 three-round total in earning her top individual finish of the spring 2002 season. Her even par score of 72 marked the third time during her career she had earned an even par or lower score in a single round. Tamulis' seventh place finish was her third top-10 placing of her career and best since finishing third at the 2001 ACC championship tournament.

Sordel's (Windermere, Fla.) third round score of 71 was the best of the 85 competitors over the final 18 holes of the event. It also tied her career-best round that she shot Feb. 24 during the final round of the Lady Gator Invitational. Sordel has now shot 73 or better in three of her last four rounds. She completed the first round of the tournament in a tied for 46th-place, moved into a tie for 22nd-place after round two and improved 13 more positions Sunday to finish in a tie for eighth place.

Sophomore Alison Curdt (St. Louis, Mo.), sophomore Katie Quinney (Atlantic Beach, Fla.) and senior Alison Zimmer (Tallahassee, Fla.) also competed for Florida State in the event.

Third ranked Duke won the event for the fifth consecutive season. The Blue Devils finished with a tournament record score of 10-over par 874. Duke's Niloufar Aazam-Zanganeh won the individual title in a one-hole playoff. She defeated South Carolina's Kristy McPherson in a play-off on the par 5, 441-yard 18th hole. Aazam-Zanganeh won the event as she pared the hole and McPherson picked up her ball after chipping to within 20 feet of the hole on her fifth shot.

The Seminoles continue their spring schedule as they travel to UNCW/Lady Seahawk Invitational March 25-26.

<u>CAROLINA FINISHES IMPRESSIVE 3RD IN LADY GAMECOCK</u> McPherson Ties for Medalist Honors, Loses Playoff to Duke's Azzam-Zanganeh

BLYTHEWOOD, S.C. – The South Carolina women's golf team posted its second-straight score of 300 Sunday and finished in third place at its own Lady Gamecock Classic at the University Club. Carolina's 895 three-day score was its best since the tournament moved to the University Club in 1996, but still was 21 strokes back of No. 3 Duke, who posted a 298 Sunday and finished with a tournament-record, 10-over-par 874 to capture its' fifth-straight Lady Gamecock Classic title and sixth in seven years at the University Club.

South Carolina junior All-American Kristy McPherson came back from two strokes down entering play Sunday and had a one-over 73 to forge a tie for medallist honors with Duke's Niloufar Aazam-Zanganeh at one-over 215 for the tournament. The two players went back to the par 5, 441-yard No. 18 hole and Aazam-Zanganeh won the playoff with a par. McPherson's second shot on the playoff clipped the mound splitting the fairway, and after playing a chip to about 100 yards away, hit her fourth shot behind the green and picked up her ball after chipping to about 20 feet of the hole in five. McPherson was coming off medallist honors at the Spartan Invitational 10 days ago with this being her third first-place finish of the season.

Duke (874) was followed by No. 8 Texas, who had a the best team score of the day (295) and finished with a three-day 886 total. Thirty-third-ranked South Carolina — which finished ahead of eight teams ranked ahead of the Lady Gamecocks in the latest Sagarin/Golfweek national rankings — was third at 895 with No. 25 New Mexico (902) and No. 10 Vanderbilt (907) rounding out the top five. The 895 by South Carolina was its best team score of the season.

McPherson led a pair of Lady Gamecocks who finished in the top 10 of the tournament. Sophomore Adrienne Gautreaux had a 76 Sunday and finished in a tie for eighth place at 222 for her second best finish and score of the season. Senior Reetta Laakkonen had a 74 (she also had a 73 Friday for her top two rounds of the season) and finished tied for 24th at 226, while sophomore Marci Robinson (80-235, 43rd place) and junior Kacy Thompson (77-239, 51st) rounded out Carolina's players counting to the team score. Sophomore Kory Thompson (76-239, 51st) and freshman Tiffany Catafygiotu (82-246, 69th) competed for individual honors only.

Aazam-Zanganeh and McPherson led the tournament's individual competition and were followed by Duke's Virada Nirapathpongporn (74-216) North Carolina's Ashley Prange (73-219), Tennessee's Young-A Yang (74-220) and Duke's Leigh Anne Hardin (76-220) to round out the top five.

South Carolina next competes at the Liz Muphey Collegiate, Mar. 22-24 in Athens, Ga.
