### Final Round Championships Quotes – Head Coaches

#### **Andrea Gaston, Southern California head coach (Team 1<sup>st</sup>, +45)**

"Obviously, we are extremely excited to bring home the national championship. All year long, that's what we have been preparing for. Since the West Regional, we have led wire-to-wire, so we peaked at the right time. These players have played their hearts out the last seven rounds. They have had the attitudes of champions. We welcomed the difficult conditions the first two days because we felt prepared for it, and the way they played through the wind and rain set the stage for us winning the championship."

#### **Laurie Gibbs, Pepperdine head coach (Team 2<sup>nd</sup>, +60)**

"All along we said that we wanted to be in it on the final day and the final group and then see what happens. When we got here, we knew that we had the talent to win and that we had to play solid. It didn't happen, but we are really happy. We played well, it was a great week and we learned a lot. We know that we can be in this position again and next time, we can have the national championship."

#### **Susan Watkins, Texas head coach (Team 3<sup>rd</sup>, +61)**

"Our performance today was really pretty good. They kept fighting and that's all I can ask. That was our goal for the entire event. We knew we needed to play hard today and that we needed to go low, but we didn't get as low as we needed to. We were really trying to put some pressure on the teams behind us and I think we did. Overall, the event was great. They fought; putts didn't drop but we stayed patient and composed. There is no question that if the first two days had gone a little differently for us, we could have made a difference in the end."

#### **Therese Hession Ohio State head coach (Team 4<sup>th</sup>, +62)**

"I'm just really proud of the girls because they worked hard all week. They never gave up, and we went through a lot of tough moments on this course because it can just wear you down, but they held their chins up high and I couldn't be happier for them."

#### **Devon Brouse, Purdue head coach (Team 12<sup>th</sup>, +82 – host school)**

"Purdue did a heck of a job hosting the NCAA Championships. I am so proud of all the people that helped make this event possible; I had coaches talking about how this course is good enough to host the U.S. Open. I can't tell you that I'm pleased or excited about how my team performed this week, because I'm not. I feel that we could have played a lot better. We didn't handle the greens as well, and if anybody should be able to handle these greens it's our players, because they're the ones who are practicing and playing here all the time. It's a bit of a disappointment not to finish higher, but at the same time I feel a lot of pride for Purdue staff and the event they put on this week."

### Final Round Championships Quotes – Participants

#### **Mikaela Parmlid, Southern California (T-1<sup>st</sup>, +9 – won title in one-hole tie-breaker)**

"I knew coming into the today's round that I was in the lead, but there are a lot of holes out there. My driver wasn't working too well for me, but my irons were great so I was able to make up for my drives. I am a fighter and I knew that I would have to fight all day to win the title. I knew that there was a problem regarding the penalty stroke, so I was surprised when I was told there would be a playoff. I thought the stroke penalty was going to keep me out of a playoff situation. I'm just glad I had the opportunity to win it. I've been in playoffs before, and now I am 3-for-3 in my career when that happens."

**Andrea Vander Lende, Florida (T-1<sup>st</sup>, +9)**

"I had to wait probably an hour or so (before the playoff hole), but I just practiced a little bit and warmed up. I was ready mentally, so that's what is the most important. The smartest thing to do would probably have been to chip out and set myself up for a good third shot, but I took the risk of hitting a wood out of the rough, but oh well. If someone had told me before the week started that I was going to get second place, I would have been very pleased. I haven't had the strongest year and my shoulder has been hurting a lot, so, overall, I am definitely pleased."

**Kristen White, Ohio State (T-6<sup>th</sup>, +12)**

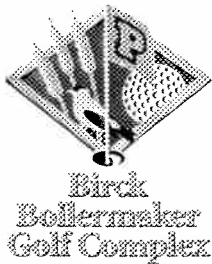
