### **SEMINOLES' WESTRUP EARNS ALL-AMERICA HONORS FOR SECOND CONSECUTIVE SEASON**

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Florida State University sophomore golfer Caroline Westrup, who finished in a tie for 11<sup>th</sup> place at the 2007 NCAA Division I Women's Golf Championship, has earned All-America First-Team honors for the second consecutive season as announced by the National Golf Coaches' Association at its annual post championship banquet.

"I'm honored to earn All-American honors again this season," said Westrup. "Being named All-American is a goal of mine each season and I am happy to reach that goal this season. I am going to work even harder to play better next year and set even higher goals for myself and my teammates. One of my top goals will be to have our team qualify for nationals so we can all share in the experience together."

Westrup is the first golfer in school history to earn All-America honors twice during her career. She is one of eight Florida State golfers to earn All-America honors at least once during her career.

Westrup's sophomore season has been one for the record books. She earned seven top-five individual finishes, and finished four tournaments with her final score at even par or better. Westrup shot impressive sub-par rounds to lead the team to its two team championship victories this year at the Cougar Classic and the Florida State hosted Chrysler Challenge. She earned medalist honors twice -- at the Tar Heel Invitational and Chrysler Challenge.

Westrup continued her outstanding career as she performed as the Seminoles' top golfer for the second consecutive season. She led the team with a career-low 72.29 strokes in 24 rounds of play, rounds scored at par or better (twelve), rounds scored at 75 or lower (16), and low single-round score (66). Her career-low single-round score of 66 came in the third round of the fall 2006 Cougar Classic.

Westrup spent the majority of the fall season ranked as the nation's No. 1 player and finished the regular season ranked as the nation's No.3 women's collegiate golfer according to GolfStat. She was named to the All-Atlantic Coast Conference women's golf team for the second consecutive season in a vote by the league's nine head coaches.

Westrup is already on the of Seminole All-Americans that includes Michelle Guibault (1981), Lisa Young Walters (1981), Barb Bunkowsky (1982), Nadia Ste-Marie (1989), Karen Stupples (1995) and Kristin Tamulis (2003). Both Stupples and Tamulis are currently playing on the LPGA Tour.

"I am really proud of Caroline and am proud of the way she played this season," said Head Coach Debbie Dillman. "It's a pleasure to be able to coach her every day and it's a pleasure to have her as a member of our team. She is a credit to Florida State University and it's certainly an honor to have a two-time All-American as part of our program."

### **HONORS CONTINUE TO ROLL IN FOR SEMINOLES' WESTRUP – NAMED ALL-AMERICA FIRST-TEAM BY GOLFWEED MAGAZINE**

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Florida State University sophomore golfer Caroline Westrup has added another All-America First-Team honor to her quickly growing resume as she was today named to the *GolfWeek* Magazine list of the nation's top golfers by the editors of the publication. It marks the second All-America First-Team mention for the sophomore who is currently playing at the British Women's Amateur.

Westrup has now earned All-America First-Team honors from the National Golf Coaches' Association and *GolfWeek* Magazine for her performance during her sophomore season. She finished the season ranked third in the *GolfWeek* / Sagarin power rankings and ranked sixth in the nation in the GolfStat head-to-head statistics. Westrup (Ahus, Sweden) finished her sophomore season with a career-low 72.40 stroke average in 11 events.

Westrup has earned All-America First-Team and All-ACC in both 2006 and 2007. She is the first golfer in school history to earn All-America First-Team honors twice during her career and the first golfer in school history to earn All-ACC honors during the first two years of her career. She finished in a career-best tied for 11<sup>th</sup> place at the NCAA Division I Women's Golf Championship at LPGA International in Daytona Beach, Fla. in May. Her finish in the 2007 national tournament ranks as the highest finish for a Seminole individual in the NCAA Championship finals.

Westrup won the individual title at the Women's World Amateur Championship in South Africa in Oct. of 2006. In winning the event, she helped Sweden to a second place finish in the team standings.

Westrup has earned 12 career top-five individual finishes with five top-five finishes as a sophomore. As a sophomore, she finished first at the Florida State hosted Chrysler Challenge, tied for first at the Lady Tar Heel Invitational, second at the Cougar Classic, second at the ACC Championship, third at the Lady Gator Invitational, tied for third at the Liz Murphey Collegiate Classic and tied for fifth at the NCAA East Regional Championship.

Westrup was Florida State's top individual finisher in all seven events during her freshman season and in nine events she completed as a sophomore. She was a cumulative total of 36 strokes over par during her ENTIRE freshman season and a cumulative total of 30 strokes over par during her ENTIRE sophomore season.

Westrup is also an academic standout with a 4.0 grade point average during the spring of 2006 and 2007 and Dean's List honors (3.5 gpa) or better during the fall of 2006. She is majoring in sport management.

Florida State finished the season ranked 24<sup>th</sup> nationally in the final *GolfWeek* Magazine poll.

### **SEMINOLE GOLFERS WESTRUP AND BLIXT EARN COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT SECOND-TEAM HONORS**

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Florida State University golfers Jonas Blixt and Caroline Westrup, who both earned All-America honors for their success on the golf course, have earned ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District Second-Team honors for their success in the class room. Blixt and Westrup were named to the District 3 University Division teams in voting by the members of the College Sports Information Directors of America.

Blixt, who owns a 3.25 grade point average in multinational business, has been a member of the Florida State Director of Athletics Academic Honor Roll in each of his three seasons at Florida State. He earned Dean's List Honors during the spring of 2005 and was named to the All-ACC Academic Golf Team in 2006. In addition, he was named to the 2006 Cleveland Golf national All-America Scholar Team.

Blixt earned All-America Second-Team honors in leading the Seminoles to a tied for 13<sup>th</sup> place finish in the 2007 NCAA Championship finals this season. The finish was the highest for the Seminoles since they finished seventh in 1995. Blixt also became the first Seminole golfer in school history to win the individual title at the ACC Championship in 2007.

Westrup, who holds a 3.650 grade point average in sport management, has earned Florida State University President's List honors twice during her first four semesters (4.0 GPA during the spring of 2006 and the spring of 2007). She was named to the All-ACC Academic Golf Team in 2006 and has been a member of the FSU Director of Athletics Academic Honor Roll during both of her first two years as a Seminole.

Westrup earned All-America First-Team honors after finishing tied for 11<sup>th</sup> at the 2007 NCAA Division I Championship finals. She earned two individual victories and finished the season with a career-low 72.60 stroke average. After winning the individual world championship at the Women's World Amateur Championship in 2007, Westrup ranked as the No. 1 collegiate player during the entire fall of 2006 and the beginning of the spring 2007 season.

### **FLORIDA STATE'S WESTRUP NAMED TO ALL-ACC WOMEN'S GOLF TEAM FOR SECOND CONSECUTIVE YEAR**

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Florida State sophomore Caroline Westrup, the nation's No. 3 ranked player according to GolfStat, has been named to the All-Atlantic Coast Conference women's golf team in a vote by the league's nine head coaches. It marks Westrup's second consecutive selection to the all-conference team for the Seminole sophomore who is among the National Player of the Year contenders and a virtual lock to earn All-America First-Team honors for the second straight season.

Westrup (Ahus, Sweden), is the only third player in Florida State women's golf history to earn All-ACC honors multiple times in her career and the first in school history to earn the honor as both a freshman and a sophomore. Only Karen Stupples (1994 and 1995) and Kristin Tamulis (2001, 2002 and 2003) have earned the honor more than once as Seminoles with Tamulis as the schools only three-time All-ACC honoree. Both Stupples and Tamulis are enjoying professional careers on the LPGA Tour. Stupples won the 2004 British Open.

"I'm happy to be named All-ACC but I'm even happier that we are playing in the regionals this week," said Westrup. "To be able to share this with my teammates and Coach Dillman is very special to me. Playing with my teammates and working with our coaching staff has helped me be really comfortable at Florida State. I am working toward my degree and playing with great teammates – those are the things that make me happy keep me focused. I really appreciate the recognition from the ACC coaches and hope that our team can continue to play well."

Westrup enters the NCAA East Regional on Thursday with a career-low 72.48 stroke average in nine events this season and has earned two individual titles – at the Lady Tar Heel Invitational during the fall season and at the Florida State hosted Chrysler Challenge during the spring season. Westrup has earned top five individual finishes in six events and has not finished lower than 16<sup>th</sup> in any event this season. She has finished lower than fourth only four times in 16 career events.

Westrup earned individual medalist honors and was named the world champion as she finished as the low player at the Women's World Amateur Championship in October of 2006. She led Sweden to a second place finish in the team standings in the event.

"Caroline is an extraordinary player and a wonderful person," said Head Coach Debbie Dillman. "She continues to amaze us with some of the shots that she makes and with her ability to play through just about any kind of distraction on the golf course. She is truly one of the top players in the world with a very bright future ahead of herself."

Dillman has now coached 10 players who have earned All-ACC honors a total of 14 times since Florida State joined the ACC for the 1992 season.

Florida State begins play at the NCAA East Regional at the University Course in Baton Rouge looking to earn a top-20 national finish for the third time in the last four seasons. Atlantic Coast Conference Champion Duke placed five players on the 2007 All-ACC Women's Golf team as well as capturing Coach, Player and Freshman of the Year honors, as selected by the league's nine head coaches.
