VIRGINIA WOMEN BOUNCE BACK WITH 6-0 WIN OVER FLORIDA STATE Padula and Dimililo score early while defense does not allow a shot Cavallers remain half-game out of 2nd-plac in ACC race

Charlottesville, Va. (10/13/95) - Nine different UVa players had a goal or assist and the Cavallers defense did not allow a shot on goal as the #5-ranked University of Virginia women's soccer team got back on the winning track with a 6-0 victory over visiting Florida State in Atlantic Coast Conference action Friday at Klöckner Stadium.

Virginia (12-1-2, 3-1-0 ACC) looked to its leading scorers-sophomore Dina Padula and senior Kristin DiMillio--for an early 2-0 lead and then scored four times in the second half to provide the final margin. The Cavaliers now have 53 goals for the season, just four shy of equaling the team record of 57 set in 1989.

With the win, UVa stayed within a half-game of North Carolina State and Maryland (both 4-1-0) in the race for 2nd-place in the ACC. N.C. State handed Virginia its first loss of the season Tuesday (1-0) but UVa already has beaten Maryland (4-0). The Wolfpack and Terrapins still have to play this season while Maryland likewise has yet to play defending NCAA champion North Carolina.

UVa plays at Wake Forest on Saturday and wraps up ACC play with a home game vs. UNC (Oct. 22)

and a game at Duke (Oct. 27), which is currently 3-2-0 and still must face the Tar Heels.

Florida State (4-8-1, 0-4-0 ACC), which is one of 28 first-year Division I programs in the country, falled

to get a shot on goal despite a few good chances in the second half.

With 20 minutes to go, FSU's Katie Lunn sent a lead pass into the box for teammate Kelly McGrath, but UVa freshman sweeper Karem Esteva was there to meet McGrath and send the ball away. Three minutes later, Lunn had a chance to get open for a shot but Esteva again was there to foil the attempt. A few moments later, McGrath slanted across the top of the box amidst double coverage before sending a ball 15 yards over the crossbar.

Padula opened the scoring in the 8th minute after DiMillio had maneuvered through the middle and passed to freshman Carryn Welgand at the right post. Welgand's shot from three yards out was deflected by FSU goalkeeper Melisa Juhl, but Padula was there to send home the goal (7:48).

Five minutes later, senior Jen Gilpatric dribbled up the middle and let the ball go to DiMillio, who turned

and sent in a 15-yard shot (13:23) for her 10th goal of the season.

Junior Liz Kelley scored early in the 2nd half after a cross from the right by Weigand glanced off her head amidst a crowd of players and went into the net (46:41). Twenty minutes later, Kelley sent a crossfield pass to Gilpatric, who then blasted a 10-yard shot off the left post. But junior Kelly McLaughlin was there for UVa's second rebound goal of the game (65:21).

Sophomore Katie Kiladis came off the bench for UVa's final two goals, giving her four goals this season on just five shots. Sophomore Tania Jovanovic initiated the first score, taking a long kick from goalkeeper Brit Swenberg and dribbling toward the left endline before sending a pass across the goalmouth to Kiladis (75:22). The assist was Jovanovic's 9th of the season, trailing only Padula's school record 11.

Junior midfielder Annie Murphy assisted on the final goal, with 10 minutes remaining.
