

FLORIDA STATE TO FACE NO. 1 NORTH CAROLINA AT ACC TOURNEY

Having played three games in the last four days of the regular-season, the Seminoles (4-13-1) regroup for their match with the Tar Heels at the ACC Tournament.

THE GAME

11/2 vs. North Carolina 1 pm

The nation's No. 1 team, the North Caroiina Tar Heels enter the ACC Tournament with a perfect 7-0 league mark and an overall record of 20-0.

The first time vs. the Tar Heels:

The Seminoles took a 1-0 lead at the 52:35 mark on a Janine Lavoie goal after a wild penalty box scramble. UNC then inserted seven starters into the lineup, but FSU GK Melissa Juhl continued to thwart UNC with several remarkable saves. UNC's Debbie Keller scored a pair of goals, including the game-tying goal with 4:03 left in regulation and the winner at 4:28 in OT to lead the Tar Heels to their 17th victory the season and 27th consecutive win. Juhl recorded 17 saves in a game which was played in heavy downpours of rain.

FSU SOCCER NOTES

ON THE ROAD AGAIN AND AGAIN

The Seminoles endured a very trying and hectic regular-season schedule in its inaugural season. Florida State enjoyed just five contests at the friendly confines of Seminole Field, while playing 13 matches, including the last 10, away from Tallahassee. October was especially hectic with eight total matches, including three in the last four days of the regular season.

WHO ARE THESE SEMINOLES?

Twenty-two players don the first-ever Florida State soccer roster --- 12 of whom are scholarship athletes. Fourteen hail from our very own Florida while four are from Georgia, one is from Michigan, one is from Texas, one is from Tennessee and one is from Canada. The young squad consists of one senior, two juniors, two sophomores and 17 freshmen.

JUHL SUFFERS SEASON-ENDING INJURY

Goalkeeper Melissa Juhl sustained a broken bone in her pinky finger in the final minutes of last Friday's match at Georgia. The injury has forced Juhl to miss the remainder of the season. Juhl played 1266 of 1650 possible minutes for the Seminoles this season. She recorded 155 saves -- which not only ranked first in the ACC, but doubled the saves of all other league players.

STRADTMAN GOES DOWN

Midfielder Jacki Stradtman suffered a broken arm and tore her medial collateral ligament in Friday's match at Georgia. Stradtman played in 16 matches, had five starts, scored one goal and assisted two others for four points.

LYNCH LAYS IT ON AT THE END

Forward Lauren Lynch, who had scored just two goals going into last weekend's action, recorded a hattrick against Georgia, bringing the Seminoles to within one goal of the Bulldogs. She scored FSU's lone goal vs. Wake Forest as well, bringing her total point total to 14 points, good for second place on the team.

HAT-TRICK ... TWICE

Alexandra Osorio and Kelly McGrath each scored three goals in FSU's 11-0 victory over Jacksonville on Wednesday, Sept. 13. The duo make up two of the team's top three scorers with Osorio recording 15 points and McGrath scoring 12 points.

GAME-WINNERS

Alexandra Osorio, Kelly Huff, Lizzie Easton and Kelly McGrath have each been credited with game-winning goals this season. Osorio's was an unassisted goal at the 19:00 mark of the West Florida game, while Huff's was scored just two minutes into the Jacksonville match. Erica Schuler got the assist on that one. Easton scored on a volley from 18 yards out at the 59:00 mark of the Memphis game, giving FSU a 2-1 advantage. The Noles went on to win 3-1. In Nebraska vs. lowa State, McGrath came in off the bench to score FSU's second goal from point blank range.

'NOLES GO 2-3 AT HOME

The Seminoles finished the home slate of their inaugural season with a 2-3 record. The season's greatest attendance was when the then 10th-ranked Duke Blue Devils came to town. An estimated 903 fans crowded the soccer facility and were rewarded with probably the Seminoles best 90-minute outing of the season.
