LADY SEMINOLE SOCCER "The Milestones"

On October 20, 1996 the Lady Seminoles made program history when they shut out then-10th ranked Clemson 1-0 at the Seminole Intramural Soccer Complex. In the game's 68th minute forward Lauren Lynch, a sophomore from Kennesaw, GA, took a loose ball off the post and put in for the game's lone score. Not only was it the first win over a nationally ranked opponent for the Tribe, but also the program's first ACC win!

In the 'Noles next ACC match-up against 12th-ranked N.C. State on October 27th at the SISC, Florida State not only outshot, but outsaved the Wolfpack in a come-from-behind 4-2 win. FSU's second all-time conference win and second against a ranked opponent was sweet, as the 'Noles were forced to come from behind twice to pull out the crucial win. In the winning effort FSU outshot an ACC opponent for the first time, 12-9, and ACC Player of the Week goalkeeper Melissa Juhl, a sophomore from Marietta, held a 3-2 save advantage over her 'Pack counterpart. This was the first come-from-behind win in program history, let along being down twice.

The two ACC wins combined can definitely make a claim as probably one of the finest back-to-back performances in the conference this season. Both teams were at a season-high ranking when they visited Tallahassee, but left knowing they were gping to drop in the next poll. Statistically, the Lady 'Noles were split even 17-17 in shots on goal combined, but Juhl took the nod outsaving her counterparts 6-4. The only two assists to come in the milestone wins were from FSU's forwards Anglea Bonaffino, a freshman from Ontario and Alexandra Osorio, a sophomore from Miami.

Florida State Head Coach Heather Kerby-Nelson:

"We've been happy with the season."
