FLORIDA STATE TO CONDUCT NATIONAL SEARCH FOR NEW WOMEN'S SOCCER COACH

TALLAHASSEE, FL -- Heather Kerby-Nelson submitted her resignation as Florida State's head women's soccer coach on Tuesday. Kerby-Nelson, who has been FSU's only coach since the program began in 1995, compiled a 31-43-5 record over four years with the Seminoles, including a 7-11-3 record this past season. The Seminoles lost 2-0 to Virginia in the first round of the ACC Soccer Championships last week in Orlando.

"After careful consideration I believe it is in my best personal interest and the continued development of the soccer program that I submit my resignation as Head Soccer Coach at Florida State," said Kerby-Nelson. "I have thoroughly enjoyed the challenges and accomplishments of the past four seasons, and extend my best wishes to the soccer programs future successor and the athletic department as a whole."

Florida State Director of Athletics Dave Hart said he would engage in a national search to find FSU's new soccer coach. "Acceptance of Heather Kerby-Nelson's letter of resignation as head coach of our women's soccer program is accompanied by appreciation for her energy and efforts in establishing a base for a young program to build on," said Hart.

"We will now go on a national search to identify Heather's successor with the goal to hire the best soccer coach we can attract to move our program into the national spotlight," Hart added.

FLORIDA STATE NAMES WOMEN'S SOCCER COACH

TALLAHASSEE, FL -- Florida State University Director of Athletics Dave Hart announced Tuesday the hiring of Patrick Baker, former University of Pennsylvania head soccer coach and the 1999 Under-21 National Team assistant coach, as the new head coach for the Seminole soccer program.

"We are very pleased to have Patrick Baker coming to Florida State to lead our women's soccer program," said Hart. "Patrick fit our profile extremely well. He is highly respected by his peers in intercollegiate soccer as well as in Olympic Development Programs and national team circles. He shares our vision of building a nationally-competitive women's soccer program at Florida State."

"I am honored that Kim (Record) and Dave (Hart) chose me to lead this program," said Baker. "The program has great potential to be a high profile and nationally competitive women's soccer program.

"The good thing about coming into a program at this time is it allows the players to know that a coach is in place and we can get right into meetings and let them know what we expect. We'll use the spring to gauge the current talent and identify our strengths and weaknesses."

Baker becomes FSU's second women's soccer coach after serving as the head coach at the University of Pennsylvania for five years where he established a 42-37-5 record. Baker led the 1997 squad to the best finish in school history as they finished 14-5-0 and were crowned the ECAC Champions. He was also named the 1997 Mid-Atlantic Region Coach of the Year. Baker served on the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Division I Mid-Atlantic Rankings committee from 1995 to 1998 and served on the Intercollegiate Soccer Coaches Association of America (ISAA) South Region Rankings Committee from 1990 to 1993.

Baker is also a noted member of the United States Youth Soccer community. He currently serves as the U.S. Youth Soccer Association South Region Coach and has attended South Region Olympic Development (ODP) camps since 1990. Baker has a total of 12 years experience at all levels of the Olympic Development Program. He served four years at the U-14 state level in North Carolina and was the 1996 U-17 ODP state coach for Pennsylvania. Baker coached the U-16 and U-18 ODP South Regional camps for eight years and was the assistant coach for the U-17 South Region team from 1991-93. Baker was the U.S. South Region Amateur coach for five years where he received the national coach of the year award in 1994.

Baker continues to assist head coach Lauren Gregg with the women's national team for the third consecutive year. He served as Gregg's volunteer assistant for the U-20 national team the past two years and was recently named the assistant coach for the 1999 U-21 women's national team.

"Patrick brings a tremendous amount of experience to this program from the highest levels of youth soccer," said Lauren Gregg, assistant women's national team coach and head coach of the U-21 team. "He has done a tremendous job as the regional head coach for ODP and has developed many great coaches and players who have been an impact at the national level. With his high level of enthusiasm he will do a fantastic job in making the Florida State program a competitive one in such a prestigious conference."

Prior to his head coaching stint at the University of Pennsylvania, Baker achieved much success at the Division III level where he coached North Carolina Wesleyan to three NCAA Division III tournament appearances and Top 10 finishes. He was the South Region Coach of the Year while at N.C. Wesleyan and was the chair for the NCAA Division III South Region Committee in 1993 as well as a member of the NCAA Division III South Region Tournament Committee

"There are still some good players in this year's recruiting class that have not yet made up their mind where they want to play," said Baker. "Coming in right after the holiday gives us some time to recruit and bring some of those players to FSU."

Baker received his Bachelor of Arts from Otterbein College in 1989 where has was a starter all four years for the men's soccer team and garnered all-conference and all-academic honors. He is married to Kelly Sack, the former head women's soccer coach at Rider University.

The Florida State soccer team will take on the Florida Gators in the season opener on Friday, August 27 at 7:00pm in Gainesville. The match will be televised LIVE on the Sunshine Network. The Seminoles will then return home to take on the University of Miami on Sunday, August 29 at 2pm at the Seminole Soccer Complex.

The Seminoles return 13 veterans from the 1998 squad, including leading scorer Maren Vik Edvardsen and top defensive player Rachael Watkin. This will also be the first season for head coach Patrick Baker, assistant coaches Lauren Cyran and Darren

Ambrose and graduate assistant Natalie Rich.

The Florida State squad welcomes 13 newcomers to the team this season, including freshman forward Cindy Schofield, who set the Florida high school record for most goals in a career with 238 and was second in the nation in the category.
