HEAD COACH - JoAnne Graf

In three years as head coach of the softball team, JoAnne Graf has pushed Florida State into the national spotlight. A three-year record of 113-32 (a .779 winning percentage) and three state championships is overshadowed only by this season's accomplishments: a 50-7 record-best in the school's history-and first place finishes in the state and regional tournaments. In addition, Florida State is ranked number one in the nation. For her efforts, Graf was recently named Coach of the Year in Florida.

Graf, a 1975 graduate of Florida State, returned to her alma mater as head coach in 1978. Prior to that, Graf was earning her master's degree in physical education at North Carolina-Greensboro while coaching three sports teams. She was the head coach of the men's and women's swimming teams and assistant softball coach.

While an undergraduate at Florida State, Graf was a member of both the tennis and softball teams. She served as a co-captain for the 1974 and 1975 softball squads that finished second in the state tournament.

Graf is the national softball chairperson for the AIAW and is serving a two-year term as Region III softball chairperson.

SEASON SUMMARY

Florida State head coach JoAnne Graf will always remember this season—not because what it should have been but what it turned out to be. It was a season that should have been of the rebuilding nature, but seldom do those types of seasons show a 50-7 record, first place finishes in both state and regional tournaments and a number one national ranking. It wasn't suppose to be, but the Seminoles find themselves at the top of the collegiate slow pitch softball world.

Graf's starting lineup includes two freshmen and four transfer students.

Furthermore, consider that of ten starters, only outfielder Linda Tyrrell had put in more than one year in a Seminole uniform before the season had started. Tyrrell became the veteran of the starting unit with only two years experience under her belt.

"We were able to win while we were still learning," says Graf, giving her best attempt at explaining the good fortunes of her team. "I thought we'd lose more games than we did. We won a few close ones at the beginning of the year and that really upped our confidence. We still show some inexperience now and then since we have a lot of new people out there on the field. But we've learned to support each other and it's paid off."

Seven starters are hitting over .400 and as a team, the Seminoles are hitting .399. "Although our offense has come and gone at times, we've had good hitters to put the pressure on teams' defenses," says Graf. "That has to be an important factor in our success."

Florida State started off the season with first place finishes in the Lady
Gator and Miami Dade North Invitationals. But at the South Florida Invitational,
FSU dropped two of five games—both to the Florida Gators—and then dropped a
single game to Florida, too. "We had just lost (then) starter Karen Kelly to
academic ineligibility," says Graf. "Then our hitting tailed off in the tourna—

ment. We just needed to regroup a bit and we did." What followed were 16 straight wins, including first place honors in the Georgia Tech Invitational.

At the North Carolina State Invitational, Florida State lost twice to East Carolina, but Graf knew at that point that she had herself a great team. "We finished second in that one, but we really did play well," she remembers. "We made a few too many mental mistakes but I could see at that point that we really had something."

Graf was right. Florida State had no problems with either its state or regional tournaments, easily sweeping aside eight straight opponents to earn the number one seed in the national tournament. "We dominated our state and region," says Graf. "But this is a bit different. We have more to lose than any other team. We're going to have to be able not to panic if we get down. If we can keep our composure, our chances are good. The kids want it really bad."

Susan Painter, Freshman, Plantation, Fla...became the Seminole's starting pitcher after 24 games and has been in there ever since...one of two freshmen who are in starting positions for Florida State...record is 27-4...is fourth on the squad in batting average (.471) and is fourth in RBI's with 38...one of FSU's most improved players...named first team all-state...

POSITION #2.....CATCHER

Venus Ross, Senior, Jacksonville, Fla...probably the most honored player in Florida State softball history and has only played two years for the Tribe...named first team all-state and all-region for the second consecutive year...all-tournament at the North Carolina State and South Florida Invitationals...hit .471 in 1980 and is at .476 this season...is second in RBI's with 40...cleanup hitter for Florida State...got the winning RBI in the state tournament vs. South Florida...one of two seniors who start for the Seminoles...

POSITION #3.....FIRST BASE

Charlotte Cates, Sophomore, Moultrie, Ga...has been injured since the North Carolina State Invitational with a slight knee injury...expected to be at 100 percent for the national tournament...named all-tournament at the North Carolina State and Lady Gator Invitationals ...has hit .487, second on the squad...her .973 fielding percentage is tops on the club... played last season for North Florida Junior College...

POSITION #4.....SECOND BASE

Jan Sikes, Junior, Jacksonville, Fla...has been a starter all year after transferring from Lake City Community College...named first team all-state and was on the all-tournament team at the Lady Gator and South Florida Invitationals...leading the squad in hitting (100 minimum at bats) with an even .500 average...has collected 81 hits and 28 runs batted in...

POSITION #5.....THIRD BASE

Carol O'Domski, Junior, Miami Springs, Fla...a starter all of last year...was beaten out early in the season by Karen Kelly, but regained her position when Kelly had grade problems ...is the Seminole's leadoff hitter and has responded by scoring 49 runs, tied for tops on the team...a .365 hitter...first team all-state and all-region selection...South Florida Invitational all-tournament team member...

POSITION #6.....SHORTSTOP

Darby Cottle, Sophomore, Ty Ty, Ga...has been a starter since her freshman year at FSU... hits #3 in the lineup...a consistent hitter with a .413 average...is the Seminole player who has received the most recognition this season...named first team all-state and all-region, in addition to being named to three all-tournament teams—South Florida's, North Carolina State's and Florida's...

POSITION #7.....LEFTFIELD

<u>Linda Tyrrell</u>, <u>Junior</u>, <u>Miami</u>, <u>Fla</u>...wasn't expected to play this season after two hip dislocations last year...in fact, she wasn't even listed in the pre-season media guide... she plays with a pin in her hip after being operated on last year...has not hit as well (.347) as in previous years but has played well defensively...

POSITION #8.....CENTERFIELD

Cathy Gooding, Freshman, Jacksonville, Fla...one of two freshman in the starting lineup... is the only Seminole to play in all 57 games...played infield in high school and has made the switch to the outfield very easily...strongest arm in the outfield...batted .379 through the 57 games...second team all-state selection and all-region selection...

POSITION #9......RIGHTFIELD

Natalie Drouin, Junior, Plantation, Fla...transfer from Miami Dade South Community College ...bats second in the lineup...has been consistent, hitting .416...hit very well in the regional tournament...one of the team's quickest players...led the team in walks with 13...second team all-state...also made all-region...


