FSU -- Davidson strikes out swinging. Gordon is thrown out bunting (5-4). Buttery strikes out swinging.

Sixth Inning -- FSU 0 Cal 3

FSU -- Gordon reaches safely on a bunt. Buttery grounds to third and Gordon is thrown out at second on the fielder's choice (5-4). Mitchem flies out to center field. Barton flies out to center field. There was an error on the Cal 3B for dropping a fly ball in foul territory.

For FSU - 0 runs, 1 hit, 1 errors, 1 LOB

Cal -- Kropke grounds out (6-3). O'Connor reaches safely on the error by FSU's third baseman. Boxx walks, O'Connor advances to second. LaGrace grounds to second base where Boxx is thrown out on the fielder's choice, but O'Connor scores on the second baseman's error in turning the double play. Perez pinch runs for LaGrace. Stiglich flies out to center.

California vs. Florida State

Florida State's Head Coach Dr. JoAnne Graf:

"I thought we were tight in the first. I thought we might have trouble with Granger because she throws so hard. I had hoped we would settle down and handle her alright, but they jumped on us early and we were in trouble."

"I think Tony (Gutierrez) threw a great ballgame after the first inning. I think she might have been a little nervous starting out since this was her first World Series game."

"If we play well against UMass, we can get the momentum back in our favor. Right now all we need is a shot of confidence to get us back on track."

California's Head Coach Diane Ninemire:

"I thought we came out strong in the first inning. I told them to score early and let them chase us, which is what we did. That's (score early) our motto this week and I think it'll help us."
