FLORIDA STATE SOFTBALL

CHAPEL HILL, NC--Florida State softball remains undefeated in the Atlantic Coast Conference with a doubleheader sweep of North Carolina Thursday at Finnlay Field. With a 5-1 victory in Game 1 and a 6-2 triumph in the nightcap FSU improves to 4-0 in the ACC and 36-11 overall.

The Seminole offense got on track, pounding out 19 hits in the two games. Lisa Davidson and Laurie Shepard ignited the Game 1 attack with two hits apiece. Davidson put FSU on the board with a solo home run in the second inning to tie the score at one. Her fifth round tripper of the year traveled the 220 feet over the left field fence with distance to spare.

Florida State scored in each of the last three innings to put the game away. Jen Olow broke the tie with a two-out triple in the fifth to score Myssi Calkins. She then made the score 3-1 by scoring when Tar Heel shortstop Amy Sbuttoni misplayed Davidson's grounder.

Seminole centerfielder Shamalene Wilson extended her hitting streak to nine consecutive games with a hit in each contest. With two-outs and a UNC runner on third, the All-American hopeful made a spectacular diving catch to end the fourth and keep the game deadlocked at one.

Rebecca Aase scattered five North Carolina hits and struck out four in upping her record to 12-5.

Olow and Davidson combined for five hits to lead the charge in the second game. Olow, who went 3-for-4 in Game 2, once again delivered the clutch hit that put FSU on top. Trailing 2-1 in the third, Olow's two-out double scored a pair of runs to give the Seminoles a lead they would not relinquish.

Florida State put the game out of reach with three more runs in the sixth. After giving up a pair of runs in the first inning, freshman pitcher Kristy Fuentes settled down to improve her record to 10-1. For the 11th time this season FSU tagged opposing pitchers for double figure hits. Starting pitcher Laura Smith and reliever Lisa Gill were unable to hold Seminole bats in check, combining to give up 10 hits.

Florida State stays in Chapel Hill to compete in the 1994 Tar Heel Invitational. FSU begins pool play in the weekend tournament with games against UNC-Wilmington and UNC-Charlotte on Friday.
